Electricity Act 1945

Electricity (Licensing) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2003

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations may be cited as the *Electricity (Licensing) Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2003*.

2. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Electricity (Licensing) Regulations 1991**.

[* Reprint 2 as at 14 March 2003.]

3. Regulation 5 amended and savings

(1) Regulation 5(1) is amended as follows:

- (a) by deleting “7 members” and inserting instead —
“ 8 members ”;
- (b) by deleting paragraphs (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) and “and”
after paragraph (f) and inserting instead —

“

- (b) one shall be a person selected by the Minister
from a panel consisting of 3 names submitted to
the Minister by each approved body that
represents the interests of employees who are
licensed electrical workers;
- (c) one shall be a person selected by the Minister
from a panel consisting of 3 names submitted to
the Minister by each approved body that
represents the interests of electrical workers
who carry out electrical work authorised by a
restricted licence;

- (d) one shall be a person selected by the Minister from a panel consisting of 3 names submitted to the Minister by each approved body that represents the interests of electrical contractors;
- (e) one shall be a person selected by the Minister from a panel consisting of 3 names submitted to the Minister by each approved body that represents the interests of consumers that are large businesses;
- (f) one shall be a person selected by the Minister from a panel consisting of 3 names submitted to the Minister by each approved body that represents the interests of consumers that are small businesses;
- (fa) one shall be a person selected by the Minister from persons who —
 - (i) are residential consumers; and
 - (ii) have applied to be appointed to the Board;
 and

”.

- (2) After regulation 5(1) the following subregulation is inserted —

“

- (1a) In subregulation (1) —
“approved” means approved by the Minister.

”.

- (3) Regulation 5(2) is amended as follows:

- (a) by deleting paragraph (a) and inserting the following paragraph instead —

“

- (a) a person shall not be appointed under subregulation (1)(a) unless he or she has, in the opinion of the Minister —
- (i) knowledge at a managerial level of the electrical industry; and
 - (ii) substantial technical experience in that industry;

”.

- (b) in paragraph (b)(i) by deleting “for electrical fitting work and an “A” grade licence”;
- (c) in paragraph (d)(i) by deleting “for electrical fitting work and an “A” grade licence”;

- (d) by deleting paragraph (e) and inserting the following paragraph instead —

“

- (e) a person shall not be appointed under subregulation (1)(e) or (f) unless he or she has, in the opinion of the Minister —
- (i) experience in using the services of electrical contractors; or
 - (ii) experience, otherwise than as an electrical contractor, in employing licensed electrical workers.

”.

- (4) Despite the amendments made to regulation 5 of the *Electricity (Licensing) Regulations 1991* (the “**licensing regulations**”) by this regulation, a person holding office under those regulations as a member of the Electrical Licensing Board immediately before the day on which these regulations come into operation continues, subject to the licensing regulations, to hold that office on and after that day for the remainder of the period for which the person was appointed.

4. **Regulation 6 replaced**

Regulation 6 is repealed and the following regulation is inserted instead —

“

6. **Appointments from submissions by approved bodies and from applicants**

- (1) The Minister may make an appointment under paragraph (b), (c), (d), (e) or (f) of regulation 5(1) only if —
- (a) the Minister has in writing requested each body approved by the Minister for the purposes of that paragraph to submit to the Minister, within the period specified in the request, the names of 3 persons eligible and willing to be appointed under that paragraph; and
 - (b) either —
 - (i) each body has submitted those names; or
 - (ii) the period within which the submission may be made has expired.
- (2) The Minister may make an appointment under regulation 5(1)(fa) only if, at least 28 days before the appointment is made, an invitation to residential consumers to apply to be appointed to the Board has been published in a manner approved by the Minister.

- (3) If, in response to a request under subregulation (1), a body submits to the Minister the name of only one person, or the names of only 2 persons, eligible and willing to be appointed, that name or those names may be included in the panel from which the Minister may select the person to be appointed.
- (4) If, in response to a request under subregulation (1) —
- (a) each body approved by the Minister for the purposes of a paragraph of regulation 5(1) fails to submit to the Minister any names before the expiry of the period within which the submission may be made; or
 - (b) the Minister considers that none of the persons whose names have been submitted for the purposes of that paragraph is a suitable person to be appointed to the Board,

the Minister shall appoint a person who is eligible to be appointed under the relevant paragraph of regulation 5(2), and the person so appointed is taken to have been selected by the Minister from a panel of names submitted under the relevant paragraph of regulation 5(1).

- (5) If, in response to an invitation published under subregulation (2) —
- (a) no person applies; or
 - (b) the Minister considers that none of the persons who apply is a suitable person to be appointed to the Board,

the Minister shall appoint a person who is a residential consumer, and the person so appointed is taken to have been selected by the Minister in accordance with regulation 5(1)(fa).

”

5. Regulation 10 amended

- (1) Regulation 10(2) is amended as follows:
- (a) in paragraph (a) by deleting “4 members” and inserting instead —
“ 5 members ”;
 - (b) by deleting paragraphs (c) and (d) and inserting the following paragraph instead —
“
(c) each member present, other than the person presiding at the meeting, is entitled to a deliberative vote and, where the votes cast on a question are equally divided, the person

presiding at the meeting shall exercise a casting vote.

”.

- (2) After regulation 10(2) the following subregulations are inserted —

“

- (3) The Board shall cause accurate minutes to be kept of the proceedings at each meeting.
- (4) The presence of a person at a meeting of the Board need not be by attendance in person but may be by that person and each other person at the meeting being simultaneously in contact by telephone or other means of instantaneous communication.

Shire of Kojonup

FIREBREAK ORDER (SECTION 33)

Notice to Owners and Occupiers of land within the Shire of Kojonup

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required to have firebreaks clear of all inflammable material, in the position, of the width, and for the period as specified hereunder.

1. Urban Land (Land within a townsite)

During the period from the 1st December to 31st May inclusive, you shall have firebreaks in the following positions—

1.1 All flammable material to be reduced to a height of less than 50mm on land that is 4,000 square metres or less, regardless of how the land is zoned.

1.2 Subject to clauses 1.3 and 1.4 below, land of an area greater than 4,000 square metres shall comply with item 2.1.

1.3 Owners of property with an area greater than 4,000 square metres adjacent to developed residential property must install a 2.4 metre wide boundary firebreak on their land abutting residential land, and ensure that all flammable vegetation be reduced to a height of less than 150mm.

1.4 Owners of industrial land with an area greater than 4,000 square metres shall install a 2.4 metre wide boundary firebreak and ensure that all flammable vegetation on the remainder of the block be reduced to a height of less than 150mm.

1.5 Where chemical spraying is the method chosen as the means by which 2.4 metre wide firebreaks are constructed, this is to be completed to the Shire's satisfaction by 15th September. If not, the Shire will do the work at the landowner's expense.

2. Rural Land—Homesteads, Buildings, Haystacks, Bulk Fuel, Drums and Liquid Petroleum.

During the period from 15th December, to the 31st May inclusive you shall have fire breaks at least 20 metres wide, if provided by burning, cultivating or spraying or 60 metres wide, if provided by being closely grazed or mowed to the satisfaction of a Bush Fire Control Officer in such positions as are necessary to completely surround the perimeter of any homestead building (excluding isolated non flammable buildings), fuel installation (including drums), hay stack (but only haystacks within 100 metres of any building) or group of such structures or installations. In each case, the outer 2.4 metres of an area must be totally free of any inflammable material and where mowing is the method used all residue of the mowing process must be removed from the area.

3. Plantation/ Tree Farm Firebreaks

3.1 Firebreaks shall be constructed fifteen metres wide on the boundaries of all plantations, tree farms, or such other locations as may be agreed to by the Council, in accordance with the requirements of Definitions—Specifications.

3.2 Firebreaks shall be constructed around plantation compartments of approximately 50 hectares, in accordance with the requirements of Definitions—Specifications

3.3 A fifty metre total firebreak around all buildings and fuel storage areas, cleared of all flammable material is required.

Definitions—Specifications

Plantations—Tree farms are defined as an area exceeding three hectares planted for commercial purposes.

Boundary firebreaks—fifteen metre requirements—a boundary firebreak is defined as an area fifteen metres wide cleared of all flammable materials and having no overhanging tree branches, to provide a vertical clearance of at least five metres.

Planting compartment—is defined as an individual area of approximately 50 hectares surrounded by firebreaks cleared of all flammable material ten metres wide and five metres vertically. Internal firebreaks must be maintained in a trafficable condition and if needed trees on both sides of the firebreak are to be progressively pruned to allow unrestricted access to maintenance and fire fighting equipment to maintain an effective width of firebreak.

Please note that Western Power has a minimum requirement of ten metres clearance either side of the outside power pole. Generally, the clearance distance from the pole should be no less than the expected mature height of the trees planted in the outside row. However, in all instances where power lines are crossing land where plantations are proposed to be planted, the owner should consult with Western Power Bunbury 131351 for advice.

Note

Boundary firebreaks are not compulsory within the Shire of Kojonup Rural Area. Landholders can provide boundary fire breaks if they wish.

Your Bushfire Advisory Committee recommends the prior installation of a preliminary chemical firebreak around your house and sheds and around the twenty-metre boundary mark to burn your fire from or to. This practice will help reduce the number of protective burns that escape. The chemical break should be installed in June or thereabouts depending on prevailing seasonal conditions.

General Information

If it is considered impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks on the land as required by this notice you may apply to Council or its duly authorised officer for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land. If Council or its duly authorised officer does not grant permission, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Note: Following the method adopted by Council to inspect the firebreaks required in this notice, it is not necessary for Council to notify you or give you any prior warning that legal action may proceed for failing to comply with the requirements of this notice. The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than \$250 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the required date.

Harvesting: As per the Bush Fires Act it is now compulsory that an engine powered pumping unit and not less than 600 litres of water must be in attendance during grain harvesting operations. Trailed units must have the towing vehicle attached at all times. The fire-fighting unit must be adjacent to paddock being harvested at all times.

Swathers, Balers and Track Chainers: are subject to the same conditions as Harvesting, i.e.; an engine powered pumping unit and not less than 600 litres of water be in attendance during operations from 1st December onwards.

Oxyacetylene, Arc welders, friction cutting equipment, etc (whilst used in the open) are subject to the same conditions as swathers and balers, and in addition, the work site, must be adequately cleared of flammable material before the use of the above described equipment.

Remember be cautious with fire

The following is to be read in conjunction with the Shire of Kojonup's Fire Break Order (on back page).

No fire may be lit during the Prohibited Burning Period from 1st November to 28th February.

No fire may be lit during the restricted Burning Periods 1st October—31st October and 1st March—30th April without first obtaining permission from a Fire Control Officer.

Dates to Remember

15th September—chemical spraying of 2.4 metre wide firebreaks on urban land to be completed to the Shire's satisfaction

1st October—commencement of the Restricted Burning Period. Permits are required for all fires lit during these times and must be obtained from your local Fire Control Officer who will explain the conditions under which fires may be lit.

1st November—commencement of the Prohibited Burning Period. Permits will be used from 1st November to 15th December for protective burning only. From 16th December to 28th February no fires may be lit without the express permission of the Chief Fire Control Officer. The Shire Council has authority to extend this date and you should consult with your local Fire Control Officer or ring the hotline on 98 310145.

1st December—all townsite firebreak precautions to be completed.

15th December—all protective burning and firebreak precautions to be completed around homesteads, buildings, haystacks, bulk fuel installations.

16th December (Approx). Aerial inspection of Fire Breaks could take place.

1st March—Prohibited Season ends and Restricted burning period commences—clearing fires may be lit subject to permits from Fire Control Officer.

30th April—Restricted Burning Period may have been extended. Please contact your Fire Control Officer to ascertain whether a burning permit is required.

Kojonup Bush Fire Advisory Committee Burning Rules

1. All clearing fires to have 40 metres minimum break on all sides OR
2. All bush adjacent to clearing fires to be burnt to a minimum of 100 metres width in the previous Autumn or Spring.
3. Where rules 1 or 2 are not complied with, bulldozing must be burnt to a depth of at least 2 chains prior to the beginning of the restricted burning season.
4. Surveyed roads are not to be included in meeting these requirements unless burnt out.
5. All firebreaks around clearing fires to be checked by a Bush Fire Control Officer and passed prior to the issue of a written permit to burn.
6. Patrolling of all fires to be the responsibility of land owner or occupier. These include clearing fires as well as protective burning.
7. All adjoining land owners must be notified on the morning of the intended burn whether clearing grass or protective burning is carried out.
8. All holders of clover burning permits to notify the Shire Office and the Base Station that they are burning on the day of the burn.
9. No fire to be lit before 1300 hours (1pm) if extension of Restricted Burning Period continues after 30th April, a fire may be lit after 1000 hours or at the discretion of the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.
10. If a main power line failure occurs when a Movement of Vehicle Ban is in operation, report to the Fire Control Officer (To be aware of where Western Power technicians or other electricians are working).
11. For all grass and stubble fires all trees and heaps of logs within 40 metres of the outside of the perimeter break of the paddock to be cleared around.
12. All stubble/grass burns conducted within the restricted burning period must have a 2.4 metre wide perimeter break cleared of all flammable material. Non-compliance may lead to prosecution.

Note: the above rules are to be observed in all cases unless your Fire Control Officer gives special approval to any alternative provisions.

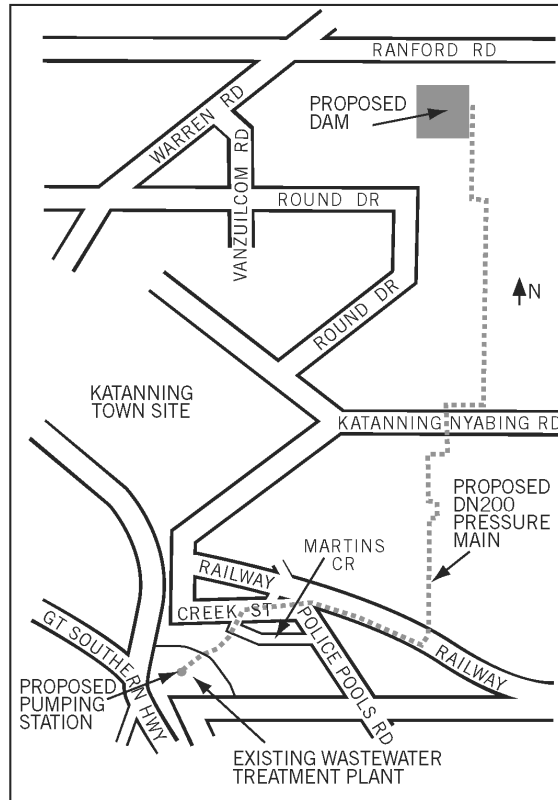

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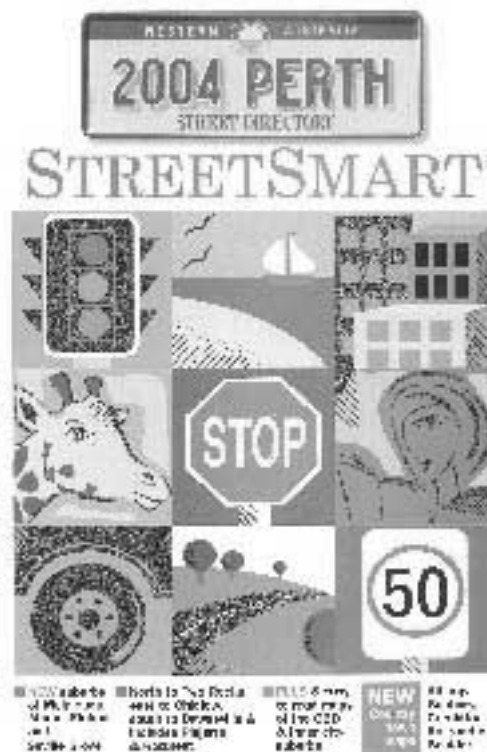
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
