### **Travel Agents Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2003**

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and deputy of the Governor in  
Executive Council.

**1. Citation**

These regulations may be cited as the *Travel Agents Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2003*.

**2. The regulations amended**

The amendment in these regulations is to the *Travel Agents Regulations 1986*\*.

**3. Regulation 4B inserted**

After regulation 4A the following regulation is inserted —

“

**4B. Prescribed activities and circumstances under section 4(3)(c)**

For the purposes of section 4(3)(c), a person who carries on an activity that falls within the Schedule 14 definition of “travel related arrangements” does not carry on business as a travel agent if that activity is carried on in circumstances that are unrelated to other activities described in section 4(1)(a), (b), (c) and (e).

”
