Citation

1. This notice may be cited as the *South West Coast Salmon and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Notice 2004*.

Interpretation

2. In this notice—

“authorisation” means a commercial fishing licence, a fishing boat licence or a managed fishery licence that authorises a person to fish for a commercial purpose in the Fishery;

“committee” means the South West Coast Salmon and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Committee of Management established by written instrument dated 28 February 2004 and made under section 11 of the Act;

“Fishery” means—

(a) the South West Coast Salmon Fishery as declared in the *South West Coast Salmon Management Plan 1982**; and

(b) fishing for salmon between Busselton Jetty and the northern limit of Tim’s Thicket under the exception provided for in Schedule 1 of the *South West Beach Seine Fishery Notice 1990*** and as specified in Condition 68;

“Related Fisheries” means any other fishery in which a person authorised or entitled to fish in the Fishery is also authorised or entitled to engage in fishing in accordance with a commercial fishing licence or a fishing boat licence (including by reference to any exception to an order made under section 43 of the Fish Resources Management Act 1994);

“scheme” means the South West Coast Salmon and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2004 established by clause 3.

Establishment of fisheries adjustment scheme

3. There is established a fisheries adjustment scheme in respect of the Fishery and the Related Fisheries to be known as the *South West Coast Salmon and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2004*.

Objective

4. The objective of the scheme is to reduce the size of the Fishery and the Related Fisheries by reducing—

(a) the number of persons authorised to fish in the Fishery and the Related Fisheries; and

(b) the number of boats that may be used for fishing in the Fishery and the Related Fisheries.

The fishery to which the scheme applies

5. The fishery to which the scheme applies is the Fishery and the Related Fisheries.

Who may offer to surrender an authorisation

6. Any person who is the holder of an authorisation is entitled to offer the surrender of the authorisation.

Manner of operation

7. The manner of operation of the scheme shall be that—

(a) invitations for offers to surrender authorisations shall be made in accordance with section 10C(4) of the Act and not later than 6 May 2005;

- (b) any offer shall be submitted to the committee in the form approved by the committee;
- (c) the committee shall forward any offers to the Minister and advise the Minister whether to accept or decline any offer or to make a counter offer; and
- (d) the Minister shall respond to any offer in accordance with section 10C(5) of the Act after considering any advice of the committee.

Duration of the scheme

8. The scheme shall commence operation on the date it is published in the *Gazette* and cease operation on 29 July 2005.

Terms of the scheme

9. The terms of the scheme are that, provided that the objective specified in clause 4 will be attained, compensation in an amount agreed between the Minister and the holder of an authorisation shall be paid for the surrender of the authorisation.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954**NOTICE TO ALL OWNERS /OR OCCUPIERS OF LAND IN THE CITY OF KALGOORLIE-BOULDER
(ZONE 9)**

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33(1)(a) & (b) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, you are hereby required on or before the 1st day of October, 2004 or within fourteen days of your becoming owner or occupier of land should this be after the 1st day of October, 2004 to clear firebreaks and remove flammable material from the land owned or occupied by you as specified hereunder and to have the specified land and firebreaks clear of all flammable material from the 1st day of October, 2004 up to and including the 14th day of April, 2005.

(1) Land Outside Townsites

- (a) All buildings on land which are outside townsite shall be surrounded by two firebreaks not less than two metres wide cleared of all flammable material, the inner firebreak to be not more than twenty metres from the perimeter of the building or group of buildings and the outer firebreak not less than 200 metres from the inner firebreak.

To remove flammable material from the whole of the land between the firebreaks required in paragraph (a) above.

Land in Townsites

- (b) Where the area of land is 2,000 square metres or less, all flammable material shall be removed from the whole of the land.

Where the area of land exceeds 2,000 square metres, firebreaks at least 3 metres in width shall be cleared of all flammable material immediately inside and along the boundaries of the land. Where there are buildings on the land, additional firebreaks shall be cleared immediately surrounding each building.

If it is considered for any reason to be impractical to clear firebreaks or remove flammable material required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or its duly appointed Officer not later than the 15th October, 2004 for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or take alternative action to remove or abate fire hazards. If permission is not granted by Council or its duly authorised Officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

“Flammable material” does not include green growing trees or green growing plants in gardens.

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning shall comply with the relevant provisions of the *Bush Fire Act 1954*.

In accordance with Section 33 (3) of the *Bush Fire Act 1954*, failing to comply with this notice may result in a maximum penalty of \$5,000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay cost of performing the work directed in this notice, if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

The prohibited burning periods will be—

1. Within the gazetted Kalgoorlie-Boulder Fire District from 15th December 2004 to 14th April 2005 inclusive;
2. Outside the Kalgoorlie-Boulder Fire District from 1st November 2004 to 30th April 2005.
