1. Citation

OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ACT 1984 OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH REGULATIONS 1996 EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE PURSUANT TO REGULATION 2.13

I, Nina Lyhne, WorkSafe Western Australia Commissioner, hereby grant an exemption to The Swan Brewery Company Pty Limited from the requirements of Regulations 4.43(1)(a) of the *Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996* in relation to the need for the steam boilers in that workplace to operate using low water level safety devices in accordance with Clause 3.5.1.2 paragraph (a) of Australian Standard AS2593-2001 *Boilers—Unattended and limited attendance*.

This exemption is conditional upon operating an alternative water management system, using high integrity conductive probes, in accordance with paragraph (b) of Clause 3.5.3.2.1 of Australian Standard AS2593-2004 *Boilers—Safety management and supervision systems*.
