VARIATION OF BUSH FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice to all owners and occupiers of Rural Land

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required but not compelled to on or before the 1 October 2006 to plough, scarify, cultivate or otherwise clear and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until 15 February 2007, firebreaks of not less than two metres in width in the following positions on the land owned or occupied by you—

RURAL LAND

- (a) Within 20 metres inside all external boundaries of the property, and where such lands are divided by or abut a trafficable road within 20 metres inside the land abutting that road.
- (b) In such positions as is necessary to divide all land under pasture in excess of 200 hectares into areas not exceeding 200 hectares each completely surrounded by a firebreak.
- (c) Within 20 metres of buildings, haystacks, and fuel ramps situated on the land.

The firebreak notice is varied only for the 2006/2007 fire season to make the installation of firebreaks non compulsory due to erosion concerns that may occur from installing such firebreaks. The owner or occupier needs to ensure that protection to crops, pasture and property is maintained and where a firebreak is considered necessary then it should be installed.

All previous conditions for firebreaks not on rural land remain unchanged.
