Working with Children (Criminal Record Checking) Act 2004

Working with Children (Criminal Record Checking) Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 2006

- (i) carried on a service of that type immediately before the commencement of the *Children and Community Services Act 2004* section 250 but did not hold a licence or permit issued under the *Community Services Act 1972* section 17B relating to the service; and
 - (ii) immediately before 1 January 2007 does not hold a licence issued under the *Children and Community Services Act 2004* Part 8 relating to the service,
- the day that is on or after 1 January 2007 on which a licence relating to the service is issued to the employer under that Part.

”.

City of Wanneroo

ANIMALS AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2006

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and the *Dog Act 1976* and under all other powers enabling it, the City of Wanneroo resolved on 21 November 2006 to make the “*City of Wanneroo Animals Amendment Local Law 2006*”.

In this local law, the City of Wanneroo Animals Local Law 1999 as published in the *Government Gazette* on 27 August 1999 as amended is referred to as the principal local law and is amended as follows—

1. Clause 10 amended

Clause 10 is amended by inserting the words “and Fourth” after the word “Second”.

2. Subclause 45(1) amended

Clause 45(1) is amended by inserting the words “or allow to be kept on any premises” after the word “keep”.

3. Second Schedule amended

The Second Schedule is amended by deleting all of items "1." And "2." And inserting instead "Kingsway Sporting Complex"—

"Kingsway Sporting Complex, Madeley, being Reserve No. 28058, other than those parts of Kingsway Sporting Complex that are places where dogs are prohibited absolutely as specified in the Fourth Schedule of this local law or that have been designated as a Dog Exercise Park adjacent to the north east corner of the main entrance to Kingsway Sporting Complex, Madeley on Hepburn Avenue, 400 metres west of the intersection of Skeit Road and Hepburn Avenue identified as a fenced area signposted as a Dog Exercise Park."

4. Fourth Schedule amended

 - (c) Quinns Rocks Beach, being part of Foreshore Reserve No 20561 proceeding northwards for a distance of 1000 metres from a line being the prolongation westerly of the northern side of Tapping Way Road Reserve in the northern part of the Quinns Rocks locality; and
 - (d) any coastal walkway or pedestrian accessway, being part of the Foreshore Reserve No 20561."

Wildlife Conservation Act 1950

Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2006(2)

Made by the Minister for the Environment under section 23F(2) of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2006(2)*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice—

“**extant**” means known to be living in a wild state;

“**protected flora**” means any flora belonging to the classes of flora declared by the Minister under section 6 of the Act to be protected flora by notice published in the *Gazette* 9 October 1987, at p. 3855;

“**taxon**” includes any taxon that is described by a genus name and any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of “taxon” is “taxa”.

3. Rare flora

Subject to clause 4, protected flora—

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being taxa that are extant and considered likely to become extinct or rare and therefore in need of special protection; and
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being taxa that are presumed to be extinct in the wild and therefore in need of special protection,

are declared to be rare flora for the purposes of section 23F of the Act throughout the State.

4. Application

Clause 3 does not apply to those plants of a taxon of protected flora specified in Schedule 1 or 2 that have been planted for any purpose other than such plants that have been planted for the purpose of conservation of that taxon and in accordance with approval given by the Director General.

5. Revocation

The *Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2006* is revoked.

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2006(2)*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice —

“**taxon**” includes any taxon that is described by a family name or a genus name or any other name or description.

Note: The plural form of “taxon” is “taxa”.

3. Declaration of specially protected fauna

For the purposes of the Act, all taxa of the fauna —

- (a) specified in Schedule 1, being fauna that is rare or likely to become extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (b) specified in Schedule 2, being fauna that is presumed to be extinct, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection;
- (c) specified in Schedule 3, being birds that are subject to an agreement between the governments of Australia and Japan relating to the protection of migratory birds and birds in danger of extinction, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection; and

- (d) specified in Schedule 4, are declared to be fauna that is in need of special protection, otherwise than for the reasons mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c).

4. Revocation

WHOLESALE ELECTRICITY MARKET RULES

Amending Rules No. 1 (December 2006)

I, Francis Logan, Minister for Energy for the State of Western Australia, under regulation 6(2) of the *Electricity Industry (Wholesale Electricity Market) Regulations 2004* hereby make the amending rules contained in this document.

1. Market Rule 6.15.1(a) amended

Deleting the existing clause 6.15.1(a), and replacing it with the following—

- 6.15.1(a) where no Dispatch Instructions were issued in respect of the Registered Facility for the Trading Interval, equal to the energy to be generated and sent out or consumed by the Registered Facility indicated in the applicable Resource Plan (where for the purpose of this calculation a Loss Factor adjustment is to be applied to the quantity of energy so that the result is measured at the Reference Node) for that Trading Interval plus;
1. where the Metered Schedule for the Trading Interval is higher than or equal to the applicable Resource Plan value, the Facility's Facility Dispatch Tolerance as a positive value to the extent that the resulting Dispatch Schedule does not exceed the Metered Schedule or

(2) In this clause—

“**surveillance activities for law enforcement purposes**” means any activities of this type carried out by a law enforcement entity operating in Western Australia.

“**law enforcement entity**” means any Commonwealth or State entity authorised by statute to carry out law enforcement activities in Western Australia.

“**Electrical Safety Management Plan**” means a document prepared by a law enforcement entity for the purpose of setting out the scope of the electrical work associated with its surveillance activities for law enforcement purposes and the procedures and processes (including training and assessment) that will be applied by the entity to ensure the electrical work is performed safely and that electrical installation safety is maintained.

“**approved**” means approved (with conditions if required) by the Director of Energy Safety for a period of 5 years or less as may be specified by the Director, after which a further plan may be approved for use by the law enforcement entity.

The penalty for failure to comply with this requirement is \$50,000 and, in the case of a continuing offence, a further fine of \$5,000 for each day during which the offence continues.

Compensation is payable in respect of land injuriously affected by this declaration, and land so affected may be acquired by the Western Australian Planning Commission in the same circumstances and in the same manner as if the land had been reserved in the Metropolitan Region Scheme for a public purpose.

Proposal to Construct New Bore Headworks and New Water Pipelines

To improve the water supply to the town of Ravensthorpe, the Water Corporation propose to construct the following works—

- Headworks for two new bores, 1/05 and 3/05. The bores were drilled and cased in 2005. The current works comprise of installation of a submersible borehole pump and associated riser column, pipework and valving at the top of the bore, switchboard and radio telemetry equipment at both bore sites. The bore headworks will be contained within a compound,

approximately 7m x 8m, fenced with 1.8m high galvanized chain link fence topped with three strands of barbed wire. The compound area will be cleared and leveled.

- Collector pipelines connecting the two new bores to the existing borefield collector pipeline. The pipeline will be DN50 and DN100 PVC pipe installed at least 600mm below ground level.
- Electrical supply cable. The electrical supply will be at 415 VAC installed at least 500mm below ground parallel to and approximately 500mm from the collector pipeline. A heavy duty PVC cable cover strip will be installed approximately 75mm above the cable.
- Access tracks to the two new bores. The track will be an extension of the existing borefield access track. The track will be cleared, graded and covered with crushed limestone (or similar) to provide a trafficable surface. Drainage culverts may be installed under the track at low points if considered necessary.

The new bores are in the same vicinity as the Water Corporation's existing Ravensthorpe borefield, as shown on the plan.

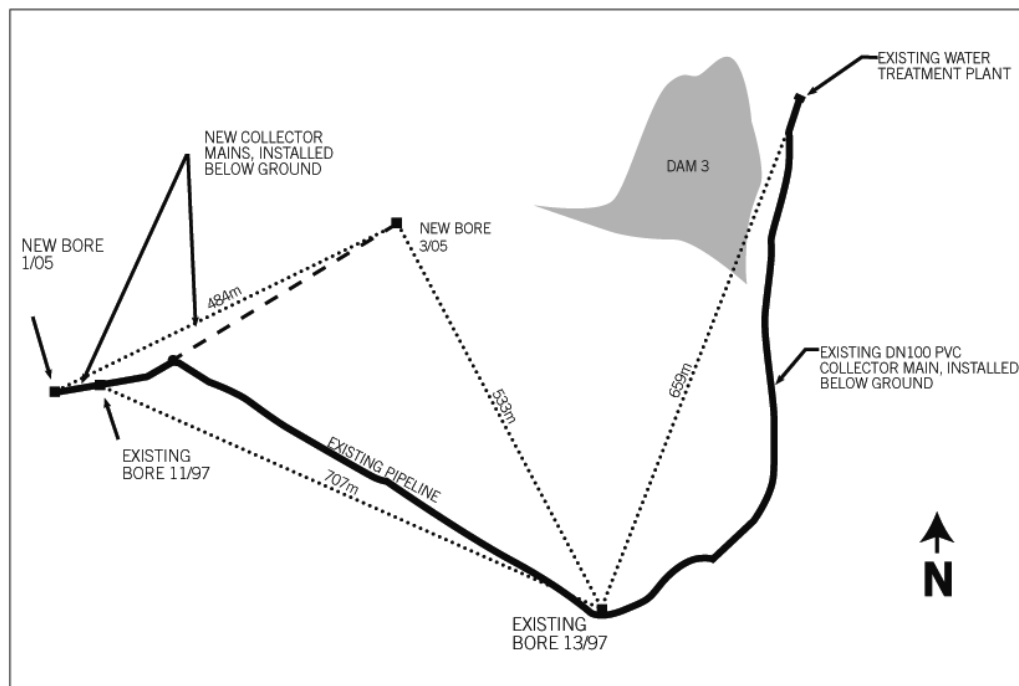
Construction of the pipelines and electrical supply will be by open trench excavation which will be backfilled and restored.

Works are expected to commence in March 2007 and will continue for a duration of approximately three months.
