Plant Diseases Act 1914

### Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations 2007

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

#### 1. Citation

These regulations are the *Plant Diseases Amendment Regulations 2007*.

#### 2. The regulations amended

The amendments in these regulations are to the *Plant Diseases Regulations 1989\**.

#### 3. Schedule 1 amended

(1) Schedule 1 Part A is amended as follows:

- (a) by deleting the items for Apricot, Cherry, Nectarine, Peach, Plum and *Prunus salicina*;
- (b) in the item for Stonefruit by inserting after “Stonefruit” —  
“ not specified elsewhere ”;
- (c) by inserting the following items in the appropriate alphabetical positions —

- general diseases and individual pests.

- (d) by deleting subitem (8).

- (a) requirements considered by the Director General to be equivalent to those specified in item 31(4) to (8); and
- (b) any further requirements specified by the Director General.

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

#### TOWN OF VINCENT PARKING FACILITIES LOCAL LAW AMENDMENT NO 1, 2007

It is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with section 87 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* that the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure approved the Town of Claremont local planning scheme amendment on 19 December 2006 for the purpose of—

“1. Deleting subclause 31(4) and substituting the following subclause—

“(4) Where the Council is satisfied that the proposed development includes—

(a) on-site car parking; or

(b) off-site car parking for the sole use of occupiers of or visitors to the development

with suitable arrangements to monitor and control the period during which vehicles are permitted to park in the spaces provided, which arrangements may include, without limitation, the provision of boom gates and ticket issuing machines, then the Council may relax the number of car parking spaces required under Table No.2 or under subclause (2), by—

(i) 5%, or by up to 15% if the proposed development contains Mixed-Use Development in accordance with the Residential Design Codes of Western Australia (R Codes) and satisfies the following—

- Is located within 500 metres of a train station;

- Is considered by Council to—

- (i) Provide a public benefit to the Town Centre;

- (ii) Compliment the character of the locality;

- (iii) Not adversely impact on the amenity of the locality;

- The development can demonstrate that such a concession would enhance its compliance with the intent of the Town of Claremont Town Centre Guidelines;

- The reduction of parking bays is allocated to residential development; and

- The parking bays are screened to reduce the impact on the amenity of the locality; screening includes locating the parking so that it is not visible

- from a public street or footpath or treating the façade with public art to reduce the dominance;
- The allocation of parking bays to residential units is required at a ratio prescribed by the *Residential Design Codes—On-site parking provisions* and shall not exceed the number prescribed per unit; or
- (ii) up to 5% in other cases.”
2. Amend clause 33(1)(a) by inserting, after the words “constructing those spaces” the words “calculated in accordance with Clause 31 (but not Clause 31A)”.

  - (b) The vehicular access to the carport or garage is via a secondary street, right of way or private road; or
  - (c) The whole of the carport or garage is located rearward of the rear building line of—
    - (i) An existing dwelling on the lot; or
    - (ii) A proposed dwelling on a lot where the application for planning approval of the carport or garage forms part of the application for planning approval of the proposed dwelling.”

The Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) intends to amend the Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) for land in the City of Rockingham and is seeking public comment.

The purpose of these amendments is to rezone land adjoining the existing Baldivis urban area from the rural zone to the urban zone in the MRS. The sites to be rezoned are outlined as follows—

Amendment 1127/41—the area bounded by Zig Zag Road, Baldivis Road and the Kwinana Freeway.

Amendment 1128/41—the area bounded by Zig Zag Road, Baldivis Road, Folly Road and the Kwinana Freeway.

Amendment 1129/41—the area bounded by Folly Road, Baldivis Road and the Kwinana Freeway.

Amendment 1130/41—the eastern portion of the area bounded by Pike Road, Eighty Road, Mandurah Road and the southern boundary of the lots on Chandler Ramble.

The planning objective of these amendments is to provide urban land for future communities, designed around networks and centres through detailed structure planning which will be undertaken under the local planning scheme.

**Local planning scheme amendment**

Section 126(3) of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* allows for the ‘parallel’ amendment of a local planning scheme when land is transferred to the urban zone in the region scheme. The City of Rockingham has requested approval to include the land affected by the region scheme amendments in the development zone of the local planning scheme.

If the region scheme amendment is approved, the WAPC may also transfer the land to the development zone in the local planning scheme. This will enable detailed structure planning to commence under the local planning scheme process, which includes the opportunity for further public consultation.

I, Nina Lyhne, WorkSafe Western Australia Commissioner, hereby grant an exemption to Ms Narelle Simpson from the requirements of the following regulations of the Occupational Safety and Health Regulations 1996—

- regulation 4.53(2)(a) through to regulation 4.53(2)(e), inclusive; and
- regulation 4.54(4)(c) insofar as it relates to the requirements of Section 6.18 of AS 2550.1—2002

insofar as the above require a person suspended from a crane to be accommodated in a workbox. This exemption relates to the use of a crane to suspend an aerial performer during a rehearsal and four performances at the Wagin Woolorama, Wagin Showgrounds, Wagin on 9 and 10 March 2007.

I also grant an exemption from the requirements of Regulation 4.54(3) in relation to the use of a crane in the above-mentioned rehearsal and performances.

The following conditions shall apply with respect to use of the crane—

- notwithstanding that Section 6.18.2 of Australian Standard AS 2550.1 refers to use of a workbox, from which requirement Ms Simpson is exempted, the requirements for the crane listed in clauses (a) to (h) of 6.18.2 shall still apply;
- the crane operator shall remain at the controls of the crane at all times during the performance;
- the only crane motion permitted while the performer is suspended from the crane hook is hoist up or down at slow speed;
- a means of lowering the performer in the event of an emergency or failure of the power supply to the crane is provided;
- a certificated dogger or rigger oversees the attachment of the lifting gear to the crane hook; and
- a full site-specific risk assessment must be conducted and, where necessary, control measures implemented.

This exemption is valid on 9 and 10 March 2007 only.
