GAS STANDARDS ACT 1972

PROHIBITION ORDER

Flexible Liquid Fuel Hoses for LPG Powered Mobile Engines

Made by the Director of Energy Safety under section 13H of the Act.

The Director of Energy Safety hereby gives notice that pursuant to section 13H of the *Gas Standards Act 1972* he has formed the opinion that liquefied petroleum gas fuelled engine type gas installations (such as are commonly installed in motor vehicles) are likely to become unsafe in use if the fuel supply lines of the gas installations contain an unacceptable type and length of flexible hose for any of the following purposes—

- to connect the mobile engine's gas filling connection and gas storage tank; and
- to connect the mobile engine's gas fuel storage tank and vaporiser-regulator.

The types of hoses referred to above are those that leach 25 milligram or more of harmful plasticiser (such as phthalates and adipates) in total per installation and as a result are likely to cause unsafe operation of the engine's vaporiser and/or hose. These types of hoses can be identified by reference to Appendix N in the *EnergySafety* report titled "*Investigation of the cause and consequences of contaminants in autogas systems-November 2007*" available at www.energyvsafety.wa.gov.au

The total amount of leaching is a function of the type and length of hose installed. A type of hose which under test conditions leached 4 milligram/metre of harmful plasticiser may be used for up to 6.25 metres per installation. Alternatively a hose that leached 50 milligram/metre of harmful plasticiser in the test may be used at the rate of 500 millimetres per installation.

The Director therefore orders pursuant to section 13H of the Act that it is prohibited from this day for any person to sell, hire or use (install) flexible liquid fuel hoses for or in mobile vehicle gas installations if the hose installation of that vehicle gas installation is expected to leach, in total, in excess of 25 milligram of harmful plasticisers, based on the *EnergySafety* report cited above.

1.0 PLAN OF SUBDIVISION

1.1 Subdivision of Special Rural Zone Area No. 27 shall be generally in accordance with the Subdivision Guide Plan endorsed by the Chief Executive Officer.

1.2 The Council will not recommend lot sizes less than 1ha. Council may recommend that the Western Australian Planning Commission approve minor variations to the Subdivision Guide Plan.

2.0 OBJECTIVES OF THE ZONE

Within Special Rural Zone Area No. 27 the objective is to—

- Create a composite farmlet and rural residential retreat with emphasis on the protection of rural landscape, visual enhancement and safe environmental management.

3.0 LAND USE

3.1 Within Special Rural Zone Area No. 27 the following uses are permitted—

- Single house

3.2 The following uses may be permitted subject to the approval of Council—

- Home Occupation- Public Utility
- Cottage Industry- Ancillary Accommodation
- Other incidental or non defined activities considered appropriate by Council which are consistent with the objective of the zone.

4.0 KEEPING OF LIVESTOCK/ANIMALS

4.1 Intensive agricultural pursuits such as piggeries are not permitted. The keeping of livestock shall require the approval of Council and as a condition of that approval shall be restricted to fenced pastured areas of the lot. The owner/tenant shall be responsible for the construction and maintenance of stock proof fencing to protect remnant vegetation and tree/shrub areas. Animal numbers shall not exceed the stocking rates recommended by Agriculture W.A. The keeping of animals shall not result in the removal or damage of remnant vegetation or result in soil degradation and dust nuisance.

4.2 Where in the opinion of Council the continued presence of animals on any portion of land is likely to contribute, or is contributing to dust nuisance or soil degradation, notice may be served on the owner of the land, requiring immediate removal of those animals specified in the notice.

4.3 Where notice has been served on a landowner in accordance with this Clause the Council may also require the land to be rehabilitated to its satisfaction within three (3) months of serving the notice.

4.4 In the event that such action is not undertaken, Council may carry out such works as are deemed necessary, with all costs being borne by the landowner.

5.0 LOCATION OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

5.1 All buildings shall be setback—

- (i) 20m from the frontage with public roads; and
- (ii) 10m from the outer lot boundaries; and
- (iii) Outside the "Acoustic Setback" shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan, and
- (iv) Outside the 40m setback from the boundary of Lot 401 as shown on the Subdivision Guide plan, and
- (v) Outside the Western Power Easement as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan.

5.2 Notwithstanding 5.1 (i) and (ii) above, Council may approve a lesser setback distance when Council is of the opinion that the topography or shape of the lot or vegetation on the lot makes it desirable to vary this provision.

5.3 Buildings shall be sited to allow a "low fuel area" not less than 20 metres wide.

6.0 BUILDING DESIGN, MATERIALS & COLOUR

6.1 No dwelling or other noise-sensitive development shall be approved by Council until such time as Council is satisfied that indoor noise levels accord with AS2107-2000 Acoustics—Recommended design sound levels and reverberation times for building interiors.

6.2 Dwellings and outbuildings shall be designed and constructed of materials which allow them to blend into the landscape of the site. Council shall refuse to approve walls and roofs constructed of reflective materials such as unpainted zincalume and off-white colours. Council will be supportive of walls and roofs with green, dark blue/grey, brown or red tonings in keeping with the amenity of the area.

6.3 Dwellings shall not exceed 7.5 metres in height measured vertically from the natural ground level. The maximum height of outbuildings will be at the discretion of Council in order to minimise the visual impacts of such buildings when viewed from Link Road and/or Albany Highway and from within the subdivision.

6.4 No boundary fencing shall be constructed of fibre cement, metal sheeting or wooden picket. If boundary fencing is utilised, it shall be of rural construction such as post and strand to the satisfaction of Council.

6.5 Any water tanks shall be coloured an appropriate shade of brown or green and/or suitably screened with vegetation in keeping with the amenity of the area to the satisfaction of Council.

7.0 VEGETATION PROTECTION AND TREE/SHRUB PLANTING

7.1 No clearing of remnant vegetation shall occur except for—

- (a) clearing to comply with the requirements of the Bush Fires Act 1954 (as amended);
- (b) clearing may reasonably be required to construct an approved building and curtilage;
- (c) trees that are diseased or dangerous;
- (d) clearing to gain vehicular access to an approved dwelling or any other clearing which may be approved by the Council;
- (e) clearing required to establish a low fuel area.

7.2 Council may recommend that the Western Australia Planning Commission impose a condition after time of subdivision requesting shrub/tree planting (using local native species) in the areas shown as "Tree Planting Area" on the Subdivision Guide Plan to the satisfaction of Council.

7.3 Additional tree, shrub and understorey planting may be requested at the time of subdivision, in association with a 3 year management plan, to ensure that successful revegetation of the land shall take place with native indigenous species. Council may request that the developer enter into private agreements with landowners on the sale of the land to ensure the maintenance of this revegetation.

7.4 Any proposals for the planting of trees within the Western Power Transmission Line easement shall require the approval of Council in consultation with Western Power.

8.0 WATER SUPPLY

Council may request the Commission to apply a condition at the time of subdivision requiring the provision of a reticulated water supply to the lots created.

9.0 EFFLUENT DISPOSAL

9.1 On-site effluent disposal shall be the responsibility of the individual landowner.

9.2 The disposal of liquid and/or solid wastes shall be carried out with an effluent disposal system approved by Council and the Health Department of WA which shall be designed and located to minimise nutrient export and/or release into any waterway or ground water.

9.3 Council shall require the use of alternative technology effluent disposal systems, such as amended soils or aerobic systems in the following situations—

- where a 100 metre setback from a creek line or water course cannot be achieved;
- where soil conditions are not conducive to the retention of nutrients; and/or
- in low lying areas.

9.5 No more than one effluent disposal system will be permitted per lot.

10.0 FIRE MANAGEMENT PLAN

10.1 Council may request the Commission to impose a condition at the time of subdivision for the construction of strategic firebreaks as shown on the Subdivision Guide Plan.

10.2 Strategic firebreaks shall be constructed to a standard suitable for all year access by heavy duty fire appliances and two wheel drive vehicles.

10.3 Buildings shall be sited to allow a “low fuel area” not less than 20 metres wide.

10.4 In cases where only part of the zone is developed, an interim firebreak system or strategic fire break system shall be prepared and put in place, to the satisfaction of Council and the Bush Fires Service of WA.

10.5 The subdivider shall make arrangements to the satisfaction of Council to ensure prospective purchasers are aware of the fire management guidelines of the Homeowners Bushfire Survival Manual and the Australian Standard 3959 “Construction of Buildings in Bushfire Prone Areas.”

11.0 ROAD ACCESS

Council may request that the Western Australian Planning Commission imposed a condition at the time of subdivision to prohibit vehicular access between any of the proposed lots and Link Road/Albany Ring Road.
