Public Firewood Areas Order 2009

Made by the CEO under the *Forest Management Regulations 1993* regulation 98.

1. Citation

This order is the *Public Firewood Areas Order 2009*.

2. Commencement

This order come into operation as follows —

- (a) clauses 1 and 2 — on the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order — on the day after that day.

3. Public firewood area

- (1) The area of State forest described in Schedule 1 is —
 - (a) set aside for the purposes of the collection of firewood by members of the public; and
 - (b) designated as an area to which the *Forest Management Regulations 1993* regulation 100 applies.
- (2) The area set aside under subclause (1) is delineated on the relevant DECMAPs referred to in Schedule 1.

4. DECMAPs

- (1) A reference in Schedule 1 to a DECMAP is a reference to a map produced by the Department of Environment and Conservation.

FISH RESOURCES MANAGEMENT ACT 1994
WEST COAST DEMERSAL GILLNET AND DEMERSAL LONGLINE
INTERIM MANAGED FISHERY MANAGEMENT PLAN AMENDMENT (NO. 2) 2009

FD 435/02 [919]

Made by the Minister under section 54.

1. Citation

This instrument is the *West Coast Demersal Gillnet and Demersal Longline Interim Managed Fishery Management Plan Amendment (No. 2) 2009*.

2. Plan amended

The amendments in this instrument are to the *West Coast Demersal Gillnet and Demersal Longline Interim Managed Fishery Management Plan 1997*. *

3. Clause 26 replaced

Clause 26 is repealed and the following clause is inserted instead—

“ Areas permanently closed to fishing

26. A person must not fish by means of a demersal gillnet or a demersal longline in the waters described in Schedule 4. “.

4. Clause 26A inserted

After Clause 26 the following clause is inserted—

“ Closure of an area within the Fishery

26A. (1) The CEO may, by notice published in the Gazette, prohibit any fishing activity in any specified waters of the Fishery for the period specified in the notice if the CEO is satisfied that the prohibition is required to protect breeding stocks of whiskery shark.

(2) In determining the need to protect breeding stocks of whiskery shark the CEO must take into account advice received from the Department’s Director of Fisheries Research, and any other relevant advice, in relation to the long-term sustainability of the species.

(3) A notice made in accordance with subclause (1)—

- (a) may only be made after consultation with the permit holders; and
- (b) may apply at all times or for a specified period; and
- (c) revokes any previous notice made under that subclause.

(4) A person must not fish in any waters of the Fishery at a time when fishing in those waters has been prohibited by a notice made under subclause (1). “.

5. Clause 27 amended

Paragraph (a) is amended by deleting “ or 26 “ and inserting instead—

“ 26, or 26A; “.

6. Schedule 4 amended

Schedule 4 is amended by repealing Item (2) and re-designating Item (3) as ‘Item (2)’.

EXMOUTH GULF PRAWN MANAGED FISHERY VOLUNTARY FISHERIES ADJUSTMENT SCHEME
NOTICE 2009

FD 11/07 [920]

Made by the Minister under section 10B of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice is the *Exmouth Gulf Prawn Managed Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Notice 2009*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice—

“**authorisation**” means a commercial fishing licence, a fishing boat licence, or a managed fishery licence;

“**committee**” means the West Australian Trawl and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Committee of Management established by written instrument dated 8 April 2009 and made under section 11 of the Act;

“**Fishery**” means the Exmouth Gulf Prawn Managed Fishery as declared in the *Exmouth Gulf Prawn Management Plan 1989*;

“**managed fishery licence**” means a licence that authorises a person to fish in the Fishery or the Related Fisheries;

“**Related Fisheries**” means any other fishery in which a person authorised or entitled to fish in the Fishery is also authorised or entitled to engage in fishing in accordance with an authorisation;

“**scheme**” means the *Exmouth Gulf Prawn Managed Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2009* established by clause 3.

3. Establishment of fisheries adjustment scheme

A fisheries adjustment scheme is established in respect of the Fishery and the Related Fisheries to be known as the *Exmouth Gulf Prawn Managed Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2009*.

4. Objective

The objective of the scheme is to reduce the size of the Fishery and the Related Fisheries by reducing—

- (a) the number of persons authorised to fish in the Fishery and the Related Fisheries; and
- (b) the number of boats that may be used for fishing in the Fishery and the Related Fisheries.

5. The fishery to which the scheme applies

The fishery to which the scheme applies is the Fishery and the Related Fisheries.

6. Who may offer to surrender an authorisation

Any person who is the holder of an authorisation that authorises the person to fish in the Fishery is entitled to offer the surrender of an authorisation.

7. Manner of operation

The manner of operation of the scheme shall be that—

- (a) invitations for offers to surrender authorisations shall be made in accordance with section 10C(4) of the Act and not later than 21 August 2009; and
- (b) any offer shall be submitted to the committee in the form approved by the committee; and
- (c) the committee shall forward any offers to the Minister and advise the Minister whether to accept or decline any offer or to make a counter offer; and
- (d) the Minister shall respond to any offer in accordance with section 10C(5) of the Act after considering any advice of the committee.

8. Duration of the scheme

The scheme shall commence operation on the date it is published in the *Gazette* and cease operation on 28 February 2020.

9. Terms of the scheme

The terms of the scheme are that, provided that the objective specified in clause 4 is attained, compensation in an amount agreed between the Minister and the holder of an authorisation shall be paid for the surrender of the authorisation.
