**Local Government (Cockburn - Ward
Boundaries) Order 2009**

Made by the Governor in Executive Council on the recommendation of the Minister for Local Government.

1. Citation

This order is the *Local Government (Cockburn - Ward Boundaries) Order 2009*.

2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows —

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centreline of North Lake Road with the prolongation northeasterly of the northernmost northwestern side of Tamara Drive, a point on a present northeastern boundary of the Central Ward of the City of Cockburn and extending southwesterly to and along that side to the northernmost northeastern corner of Lot 8001 (Reserve 49078) as shown on Deposited Plan 52692; thence

southwesterly, generally southeasterly, generally southwesterly and southerly along boundaries of that lot to its southern corner; thence southerly along the western side of Tamara Drive and onwards to the centreline of Yangebup Road; thence easterly along that centreline to the prolongation northerly of the western boundary of Lot 803 as shown on Deposited Plan 44876; thence southerly to and along that boundary and southerly along the western boundary of the northwestern severance of Lot 55 as shown on Plan 21688 and onwards to the centreline of Beeliar Drive; thence southeasterly along that centreline to the prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of Lot 801 as shown on Deposited Plan 44876; thence southerly to and southerly and generally southeasterly along boundaries of that lot to the westernmost northwestern corner of Lot 502 as shown on Diagram 97689; thence southerly and easterly along the western and southern boundaries of that lot and easterly along the northern boundary of the northern severance of Lot 2256 (Reserve 15556) as shown on Deposited Plan 202611 and onwards to the prolongation northerly of the centreline of Wonnil Close, a point on a present southern boundary of the Central Ward of the City of Cockburn and thence easterly, generally northerly, northwesterly, northerly, northeasterly and generally northwesterly along boundaries of that ward to the starting point.

Area: *approx. 57 hectares*

Portion 2

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the southwestern corner of Lot 80 as shown on Plan 8190 (sheet 2), a point on a present southern boundary of the City of Cockburn and extending northerly along the western boundary of that lot and onwards to a northern side of Wattleup Road; thence westerly along that side and northerly along the western boundary of Lot 71 to a southern boundary of Lot 300 (Class 'A' Reserve 29241) as shown on Deposited Plan 52083; thence generally easterly along the southern boundaries of that lot to a western side of Frankland Avenue, a point on a present northern boundary of the Central Ward of the City of Cockburn; thence easterly, southeasterly and southerly along boundaries of that ward to the southeastern corner of Lot 2022 (Reserve 27057) as shown on Diagram 27846, a point on a present southern boundary of the City of Cockburn and thence generally westerly along boundaries of that city to the starting point.
