Fisheries Adjustment Schemes Act 1987

Fisheries Adjustment Schemes Regulations 2009

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Fisheries Adjustment Schemes Regulations 2009*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

3. Terms used

Abrolhos Islands Fishery means the Fishery as defined in the Abrolhos Islands Notice clause 2;

Abrolhos Islands Notice means the *Abrolhos Islands and Mid West Trawl Managed Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Notice 2009*;

Abrolhos Islands Voluntary Scheme means the voluntary fisheries adjustment scheme established by the Abrolhos Islands Notice clause 3;

authorisation means an authorisation that authorises fishing in the Abrolhos Islands Fishery;

gear unit has the meaning given in the *Abrolhos Islands and Mid West Trawl Limited Entry Fishery Notice 1993* clause 2.

4. Fee under section 8 of Act imposed

- (1) For the purposes of the Abrolhos Islands Voluntary Scheme, the fee calculated in accordance with regulation 5 is imposed.
- (2) The fee is payable by the holder of an authorisation.

5. Amount of fee fixed

- (1) If the number of gear units that apply to an authorisation is a whole number, the fee referred to in regulation 4 is the amount equal to \$5 011.34 multiplied by the number of gear units.
- (2) If the number of gear units that apply to an authorisation is not a whole number, the fee referred to in regulation 4 is the amount equal to the sum of —
 - (a) \$5 011.34 multiplied by the number of gear units, disregarding any part of that number that is less than a whole number; and
 - (b) \$2 505.67.

6. Payments to be made on 1 March for 10 years

- (1) The fee referred to in regulation 4 is payable annually on 1 March.
- (2) The first payment is due on 1 March 2010, and the final payment is due on 1 March 2019.
- (3) The fee is payable to the CEO at the head office of the Department.

Fish Resources Management Act 1994

Fish Resources Management Amendment Regulations (No. 18) 2009

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Fish Resources Management Amendment Regulations (No. 18) 2009*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

(2) If a person is fishing from a fishing boat under the authority conferred by a managed fishery licence that applies to the West Coast Demersal Scalefish (Interim) Managed Fishery, the master of the boat must ensure that there is a release weight on the boat.

Penalty: \$2 000.

(3) If a person is fishing for demersal scalefish from a boat, other than a fishing boat, in the West Coast Region by means of a line, the master of the boat must ensure that there is a release weight on the boat.

Penalty: \$2 000.

Health (Aquatic Facilities) Amendment Regulations 2009

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Health (Aquatic Facilities) Amendment Regulations 2009*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.
