1. Citation

This notice is the *West Coast Estuarine Interim Managed Fishery Compulsory Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Notice 2010*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice—

“**Fishery**” means the fishery established under the *West Coast Estuarine Fishery (Interim) Management Plan 2003*;

“**scheme**” means the scheme established by clause 3.

3. Establishment of compulsory fisheries adjustment scheme

A compulsory fisheries adjustment scheme is established in respect of the Fishery and is to be known as the *West Coast Estuarine Interim Managed Fishery Compulsory Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2010*.

4. Objective of the scheme

The objective of the scheme is to reduce the size of the Fishery by cancelling the sole remaining authorisation relating to Area 1 of the Fishery, thereby reducing the number of persons fishing in the Fishery and reducing the area within which fishing is engaged in within the Fishery.

5. The fishery to which the scheme applies

The fishery to which the scheme applies is the Fishery.

6. Why the reduction in the size of the Fishery is required

The reduction in the size of the Fishery is required because it is Government policy to phase-out commercial fishing in the Swan River and Canning River (together being Area 1 of the Fishery) for the reasons that—

- (a) the rivers are an increasing focal point for recreational fishing in the Perth metropolitan area; and
- (b) the fish resources of the Swan River and Canning River are to be managed for the benefit of recreational fishing.

7. Why the scheme is necessary

The scheme is necessary in order to achieve the reduction because not all authorisations relating to Area 1 of the Fishery were surrendered under the *West Coast Estuarine and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2005* and the *West Coast Estuarine and Related Fisheries Voluntary Adjustment Scheme 2008*.

8. Authorisation to be cancelled

The authorisation to be cancelled under the scheme is Interim Managed Fishery Permit No. 2676.

9. How the authorisation was selected

The authorisation to be cancelled under the scheme was selected by reason of it being the sole remaining authorisation that authorises fishing in Area 1 of the Fishery.

10. Applications for compensation

(1) In accordance with section 14H, affected persons may apply to the Minister for compensation by application in writing to—

(2) An application for compensation is to include information relating to—

- (a) the circumstances as to when and how the affected person came to be the holder of the authorisation; and

- (c) any submissions by the affected person as to the considerations relevant to the amount of compensation to be paid for the cancellation of the authorisation.

(3) Applications for compensation must be received by the Minister in the manner and form specified in this clause no later than 4.30pm, 16 April 2010.

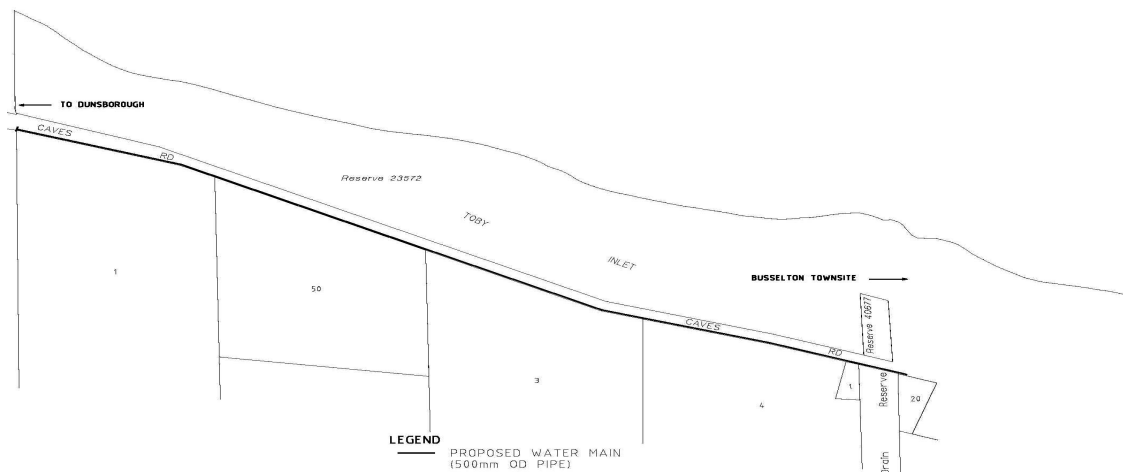
