AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTECTION ACT 1976**PASTORAL LEASE RATES**

Under section 60(3) of the *Agriculture and Related Resources Protection Act 1976* the following rates are imposed on land held under pastoral lease in the areas specified for the financial year commencing on 1 July 2011—

- (d) 2.318 cents in the dollar on the unimproved value of the land held in the area comprising the local government I districts of Yalgoo, Mount Magnet, Cue, Meekatharra;
- (e) 3.152 cents in the dollar on the unimproved value of the land held in the area comprising the local government districts of Ngaanyatjarraku, Wiluna, Sandstone, Leonora, Laverton, Menzies, Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie/Boulder, Dundas; and
- (f) 0.000 cents in the dollar on the unimproved value of land held under pastoral lease in an area not forming part of the local government districts specified above.
