LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995**CITY OF PERTH PARKING AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2011**

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Perth resolved on 6 December 2011 to make the following local law.

1. Citation

This local law may be cited as the *City of Perth Parking Amendment Local Law 2011*.

2. Commencement

This local law will come into operation fourteen days after the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Local Law Amended

This local law amends the *City of Perth Parking Local Law 2010*.

- (a) a ticket purchased from the City with respect to the event is displayed inside the vehicle and is clearly visible to and able to be read by an authorised person from outside the vehicle at all times; or
 - (b) such alternative method of payment for parking as may be authorised by the City is made.”

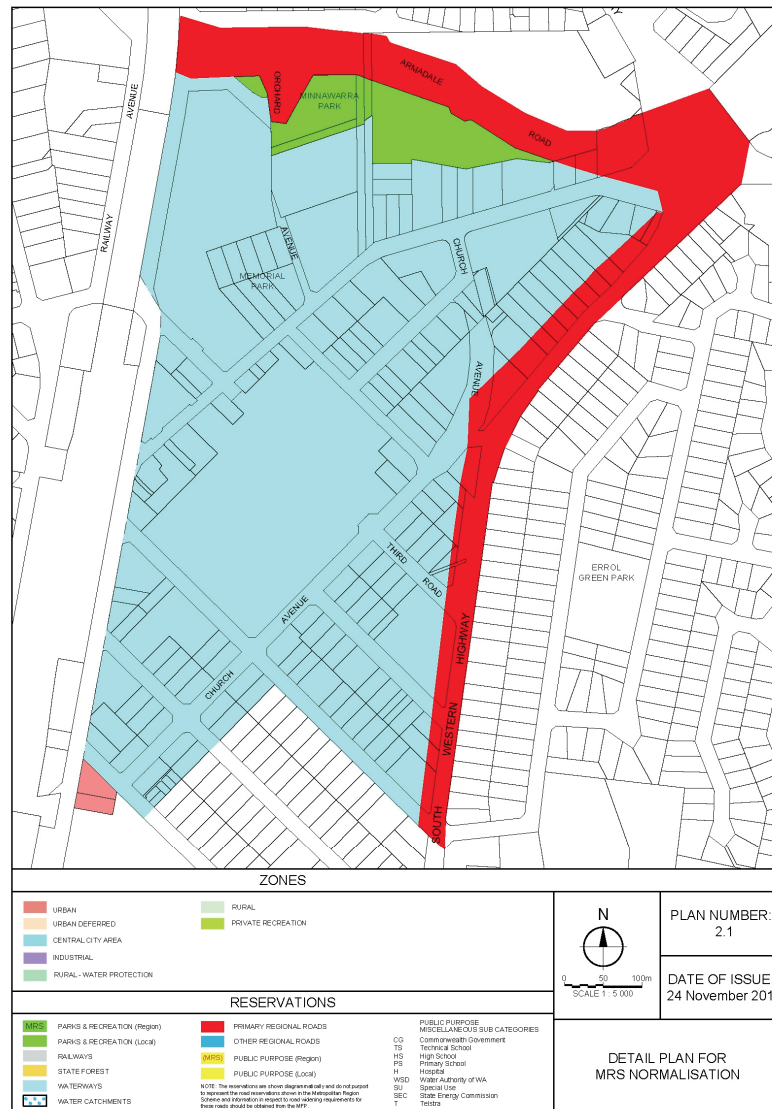
