The amendment to the management plan was prepared in accordance with section 61 of the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984*. Modifications were made to the amendment under section 60(2) of the Act. Modifications were to only approve the amendments that provide for an upgraded walk trail from Point Ann to Fitzgerald Inlet and Hamersley Inlet to Quoin Head. Amendments that allowed for the walk trail and facilities to be upgraded within the wilderness management zone of the park were not approved.
