Motor Vehicle Dealers Act 1973

Motor Vehicle Dealers (Licensing) Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 2011

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Motor Vehicle Dealers (Licensing) Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 2011*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the *Motor Vehicle Dealers (Licensing) Regulations 1974*.

4. Regulation 9 inserted

After regulation 8 insert:

9. Exempt sales and exempt exchanges (section 5B(4))

- (1) In this regulation —
related company, in relation to a body corporate, means a body corporate that is a related body corporate (within the meaning of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Commonwealth)) of that body corporate.

- (2) For the purposes of section 5B(4) the following sales and exchanges are prescribed to be exempt sales and exchanges —
- (a) sale of a vehicle to —
 - (i) a licensed dealer; or
 - (ii) a financier or a company related to a financier; or
 - (iii) an employee, or (if the vendor is a company) an employee of a related company;
 - (b) sale of a vehicle, at public auction or by way of public tender, by a financier where the vehicle —
 - (i) has been returned to the financier by a person who is not a dealer, pursuant to a contract between the financier and that person; or
 - (ii) has been repossessed by the financier from a person who is not a dealer, pursuant to a contract between the financier and that person;
 - (c) sale of a vehicle by private treaty by a financier, to a person introduced to the financier by a person from whom the vehicle has been repossessed;
 - (d) sale of a vehicle at a public auction, when the vehicle —
 - (i) was last owned or used by an employee of a government department or a statutory authority, in his or her capacity as an employee; or
 - (ii) was last owned by a company, that was not a dealer, that has been wound up and when the sale —
 - (I) is by a liquidator under a power conferred by the *Corporations Act 2001* (Commonwealth); or
 - (II) is the result of an order of the Supreme Court.
- (3) For the purposes of section 5B(4) the sale or exchange of a vehicle that has been licensed by the Director General (as defined in the *Road Traffic Act 1974* section 5(1)) under the *Road Traffic (Licensing) Regulations 1975* regulation 9(3) —
- (a) subject to conditions of use based on car club membership; or

- (b) despite certain non-compliant features, due to the vehicle being a unique or historic vehicle;
or
- (c) for a concessional charge, due to limited use conditions and club membership requirements imposed by the Director General on the vehicle's owner,

is prescribed to be an exempt sale or exchange.

1 Name of Regulations

These Regulations are the *Competition and Consumer Amendment Regulations 2011 (No. 2)*.

2 Commencement

These Regulations commence on 1 January 2012.

3 Amendment of Competition and Consumer Regulations 2010

Schedule 1 amends the *Competition and Consumer Regulations 2010*.

Schedule 1 Amendment

(regulation 3)

[1] After regulation 94

insert

95 Application of paragraph 86 (1) (a) of Australian Consumer Law

For paragraph 94 (a) of the Australian Consumer Law, paragraph 86 (1) (a) of the Australian Consumer Law does not apply to the supply of goods to a consumer under an unsolicited consumer agreement if the total price payable for the goods under the agreement is \$500 or less.

Note This regulation does not apply in relation to the supply of services under the agreement.

- (c) in the definition for *reasonable notice* after “means notice” insert “containing the purpose or purposes for which entry is required”.

5. Clause 4.12 amended

In clause 4.12—

- (a) delete paragraph (e); and
- (b) renumber the remaining paragraphs accordingly.

Schedule 2

Pursuant to regulation 19H(2)(c) each of the vessels listed in Schedule 1 is permitted to use a lamp displaying intermittent blue flashes *only* in the following circumstances—

- while the vessel is deployed in relation to sea search and rescue or other emergency situations where the potential for serious injury and or loss of life has been reported and or can be reasonably expected; and
- the use of the blue light has been authorised by an officer of the Western Australia Police. Exceptions to this condition are only ever permitted when extraordinary circumstances inhibit the gaining of the authorisation in a timely manner. In these circumstances authorisation must still be gained as soon as is practicable.

Pursuant to regulation 19H(2)(b), the person driving a vessel listed in Schedule 1 **is exempt** from the following provisions of the regulations—

- Regulation 19A, Speed limit in Swan and Canning Rivers
- Regulation 48, Limitation of speed

Pursuant to section 115A of the *Western Australian Marine Act 1982* (“the Act”) the person driving a vessel listed in Schedule 1 **is also exempt** from the provisions of the following sections of the Act—

- Section 66, Closure of navigable waters
- Section 67, Limiting speed of vessels

The above exemptions from provisions of the Act and the Regulations only apply whilst the vessel is deployed in relation to sea search and rescue or other emergency situations where the potential for serious injury and or loss of life has been reported and or can be reasonably expected, and are subject to the following conditions—

1. The driver of the vessel must be suitably experienced with high speed emergency response and hold a minimum Recreational Skippers Ticket or higher commercial marine master’s qualification.
2. The vessel masters and crew must comply with all directions issued by officers of the Western Australia Police and / or the Department of Transport Marine Inspectors appointed pursuant to section 117 of the Act, including providing timely and accurate information and situation reports as requested.

3. The person driving the vessel is only exempt from compliance with the above provisions whilst acting in the course of their duties in an actual emergency situation, only in circumstances that warrant such action for reasons of safety, and where they reasonably believe that it is expedient and safe to do so.
4. Authorisation to exceed speed limits and enter closed waters must be obtained from officers of the Western Australia Police. Exceptions to this condition are only ever permitted when extraordinary circumstances inhibit the gaining of the authorisation in a timely manner. In these circumstances authorisation must still be gained as soon as is practicable.
5. All other applicable legislation including the *WA Prevention of Collisions at Sea Regulations 1983*, must be complied with.

- being used in connection with compliance monitoring and enforcement of legislation administered by the Department of Transport, or in connection with any other bona fide safety or compliance activities

and are subject to the following conditions—

1. The driver of the vessel must be suitably experienced with high speed emergency response and hold a minimum certificate of competency as a Restricted Coxswain or other higher commercial marine master’s qualification.
2. The driver of the vessel must be appointed as an Inspector / Authorised Person under section 117 of the Act.
3. The person driving the vessel is only exempt from compliance with the above legislation whilst acting in the course of their duties and where they reasonably believe that it is expedient and safe to do so and only in circumstances that warrant such action for reasons of safety.
4. The vessel and any person driving the vessel are not exempted from any other legislation and must comply with the WA *Prevention of Collisions at Sea Regulations 1983*.

The Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) intends to amend the Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) for land in the local government of Cockburn and is seeking public comment.

The amendment seeks to transfer approximately 151.75 ha of land from the rural-water protection zone to the urban zone and to reserve 1.13 ha as primary regional roads (and associated water catchment reservation adjustment) associated with Armadale Road.
