Heritage of Western Australia Act 1990

Heritage of Western Australia Amendment Regulations 2012

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Heritage of Western Australia Amendment Regulations 2012*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the *Heritage of Western Australia Regulations 1991*.

4. Regulation 3A inserted

After regulation 2 insert:

**3A. Works, acts or things excluded from definition of
*development***

- (1) For the purpose of the definition of *development* in section 3(1) of the Act, the following works, acts or things are excluded from the operation of that definition —
 - (a) building maintenance that does not involve the removal of, or damage to, the existing fabric of the building or the use of new materials;

- (b) cleaning that is low pressure, non-abrasive and non-chemical;
- (c) gardening or landscape maintenance that does not involve a major alteration of the layout, contours, structures, significant plant species or other significant features on the land;
- (d) repairs, including replacing missing or deteriorated fabric with like for like fabric, that does not involve the removal of, or damage to, the significant fabric of the building;
- (e) replacement of utility services using existing routes or voids that does not involve the removal of, or damage to, the fabric of the building;
- (f) repainting of the surface of a building —
 - (i) in the same colour scheme and paint type if they are appropriate to the substrate and do not endanger the survival of earlier paint layers; and
 - (ii) without disturbing or removing an earlier paint layer unless it is chalking, flaking or peeling;
- (g) an excavation, that does not affect archaeological remains, for the purpose of exposing, inspecting, maintaining or replacing utility services;
- (h) the erection or installation of a temporary security fence, scaffold, hoarding or surveillance system that does not affect the fabric of a building, the landscape or archaeological features of the land;
- (i) signage that —
 - (i) does not obscure signage that has an integral relationship to the land; or
 - (ii) is temporary and does not have a deleterious effect on the fabric of a building; or
 - (iii) is temporarily located behind a shop window but is not internally illuminated or flashing; or
 - (iv) advertises that a place is for sale or lease but does not remain on the place for more than 10 days after the place is sold or leased;
- (j) digging a new grave or the erection of a monument or grave marker of materials, size and form that are consistent with the character of the place.

- (2) The exclusion of works, acts or things from the operation of the definition of ***development*** in section 3(1) of the Act does not derogate from any obligation a person has under the *Metropolitan Redevelopment Authority Act 2011* or the *Planning and Development Act 2005* in relation to a development as defined in those Acts.

This order is the *Local Government (South Perth - Change of Boundaries and Councillor Numbers) Order 2012*.

2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows —

- (a) clauses 1 and 2 — on the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order — on the day after that day.

3. Terms used

In this order —

commencement day means the day on which the rest of the order comes into operation under clause 2(b);

district means the district of South Perth;

next election means the first ordinary election for the City of South Perth held after commencement day;

next election day means the day fixed for the holding of the poll for the next election.

4. Wards abolished (s. 2.2(1)(d) of the Act)

All the wards in the district are abolished immediately before next election day.

5. District divided into wards (s. 2.2(1)(a) and 2.3(2) of the Act)

On and from next election day, the district is divided into the wards described in Schedule 1.

6. Number of councillors (s. 2.18(3) of the Act)

- (1) On and from next election day, the number of offices of councillor on the council of the City of South Perth is 8.
- (2) On and from next election day, the number of offices of councillor for the wards named in Schedule 1 is set out in the Table.

Division 2 — Manning Ward

The Manning Ward is all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centreline of Kent Street with the prolongation northeasterly of the centreline of Jackson Road, a point on a present eastern boundary of the City of South Perth and extending southwesterly to and generally southwesterly and generally northwesterly along that centreline and onwards to the centreline of Murray Street; thence generally southwesterly along that centreline and onwards to the centreline of Henley Street; thence generally westerly along that centreline to the centreline of Ley Street; thence southerly along that centreline and onwards to the centreline of Cloister Avenue; thence westerly along that centreline and onwards to the centreline of Mount Henry Road; thence southerly along that centreline to the northeastern corner of Lot 4 as shown on Plan 3383; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that lot and westerly along the southern boundary of Lot 3944 (Reserve 49156), as shown on Deposited Plan 219097 to its southwestern corner; thence southwesterly to the northeastern corner of Lot 3946 (Reserve 45066), as shown on Deposited Plan 219097; thence southwesterly along the northwestern boundary of that lot to its northernmost northwestern corner, a point on a present southwestern boundary of the City of South Perth and thence generally southeasterly, generally northeasterly, again generally southeasterly, again generally northeasterly, generally northwesterly, generally westerly and generally northerly along boundaries of that city to the starting point.

Division 3 — Mill Point Ward

The Mill Point Ward is all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the left bank of the Swan River with the prolongation westerly of the centreline of South Terrace, a point on a present western boundary of the City of South Perth and extending easterly to and easterly along that centreline to the centreline of Coode Street; thence northeasterly along that centreline to the centreline of Hensman Street; thence generally southeasterly and easterly along that centreline to the centreline of Canning Highway; thence generally northeasterly along that centreline to the prolongation southeasterly of the centreline of Ellam Street, a point on a present northeastern boundary of the City of South Perth and thence northwesterly, generally westerly, generally southwesterly, generally northwesterly and again generally southeasterly along boundaries of that city to the starting point.

Division 4 — Moresby Ward

The Moresby Ward is all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centreline of Kent Street with the prolongation northeasterly of the centreline of Jackson Road, a point on a present eastern boundary of the City of South Perth and extending southwesterly to and generally southwesterly and generally northwesterly along that centreline and onwards to the centreline of Murray Street; thence generally southwesterly along that centreline and onwards to the centreline of Henley Street; thence generally westerly along that centreline to the centreline of Canning Highway; thence generally northeasterly along that centreline to the prolongation southeasterly of the centreline of Ellam Street, a point on a present northeastern boundary of the City of South Perth and thence southeasterly, southwesterly, northwesterly, again southwesterly, again southeasterly and generally southerly along boundaries of that city to the starting point.

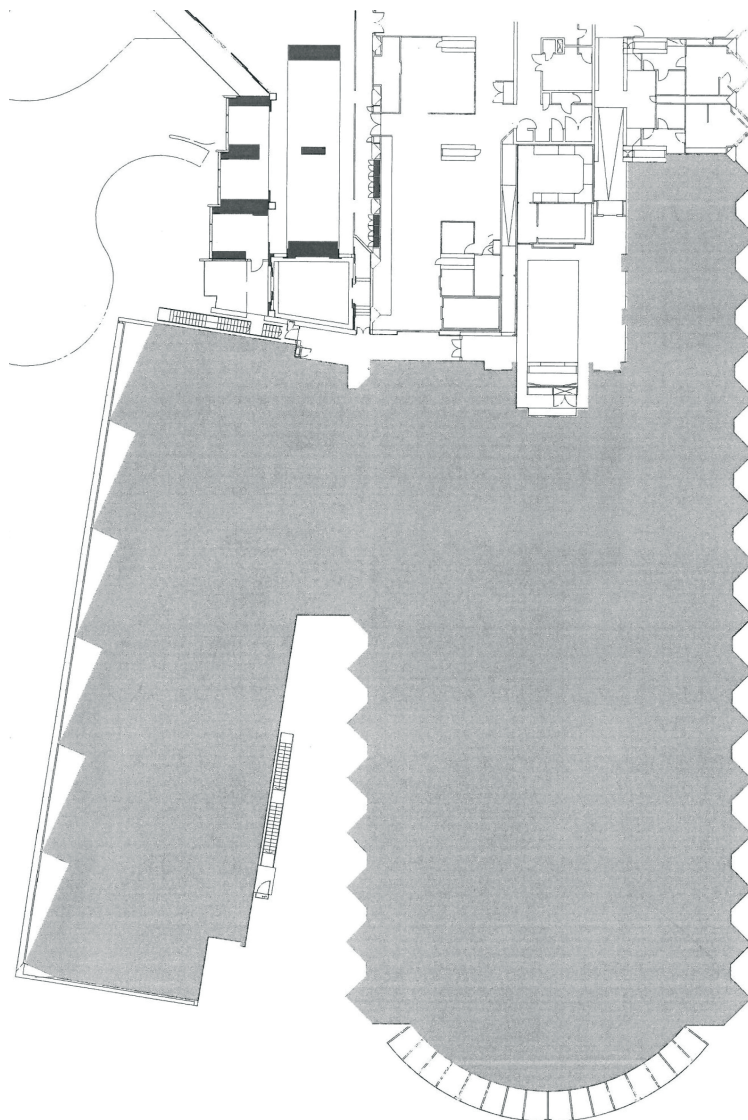

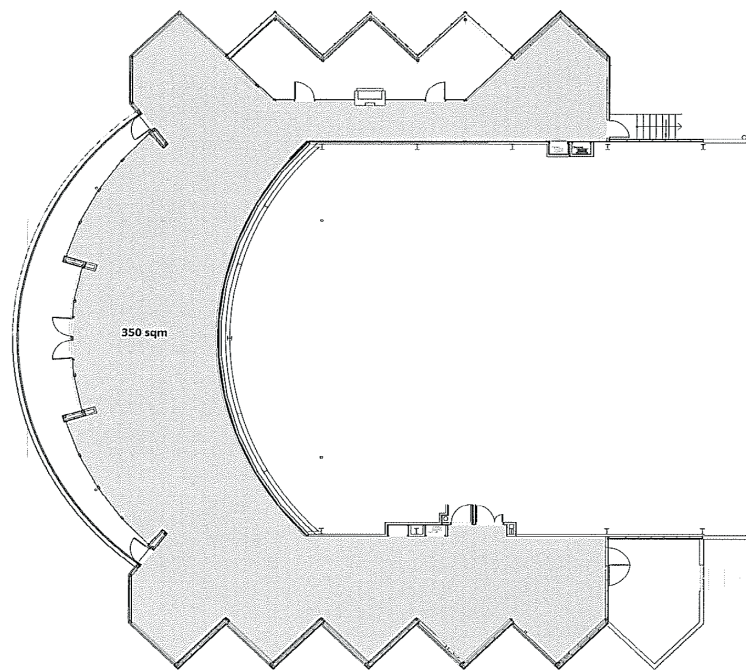

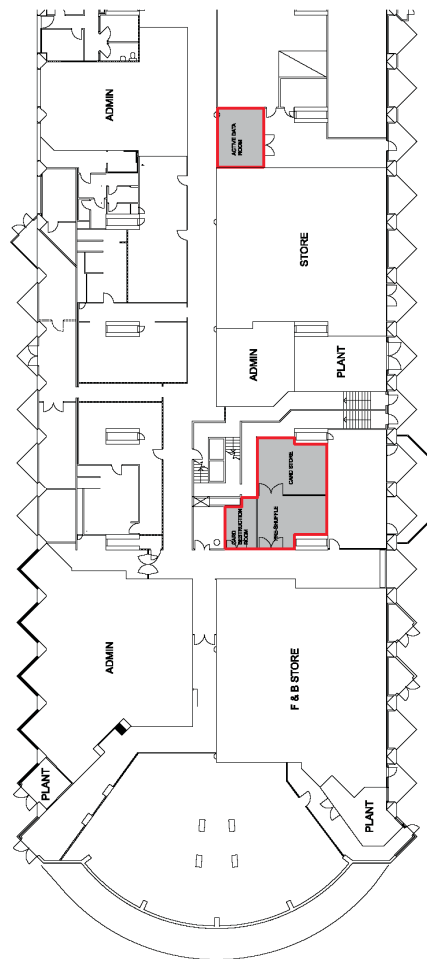

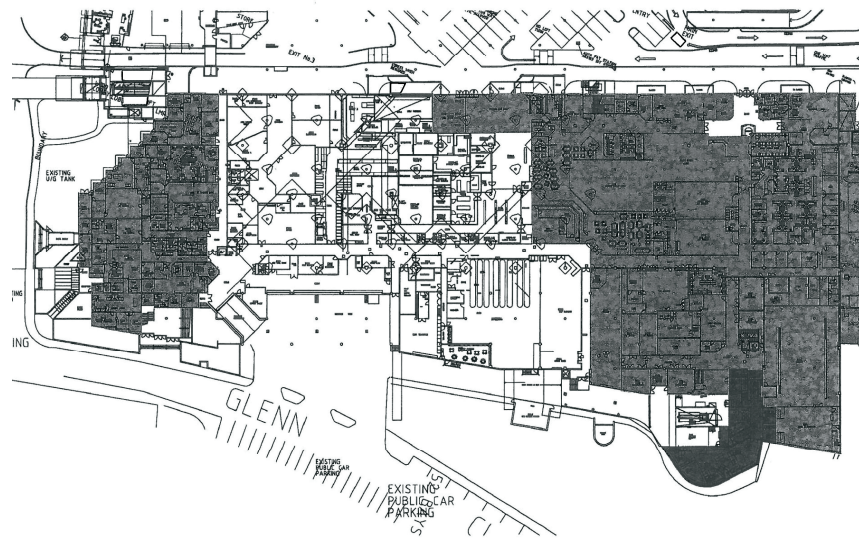
Plan of the International Gaming Facility



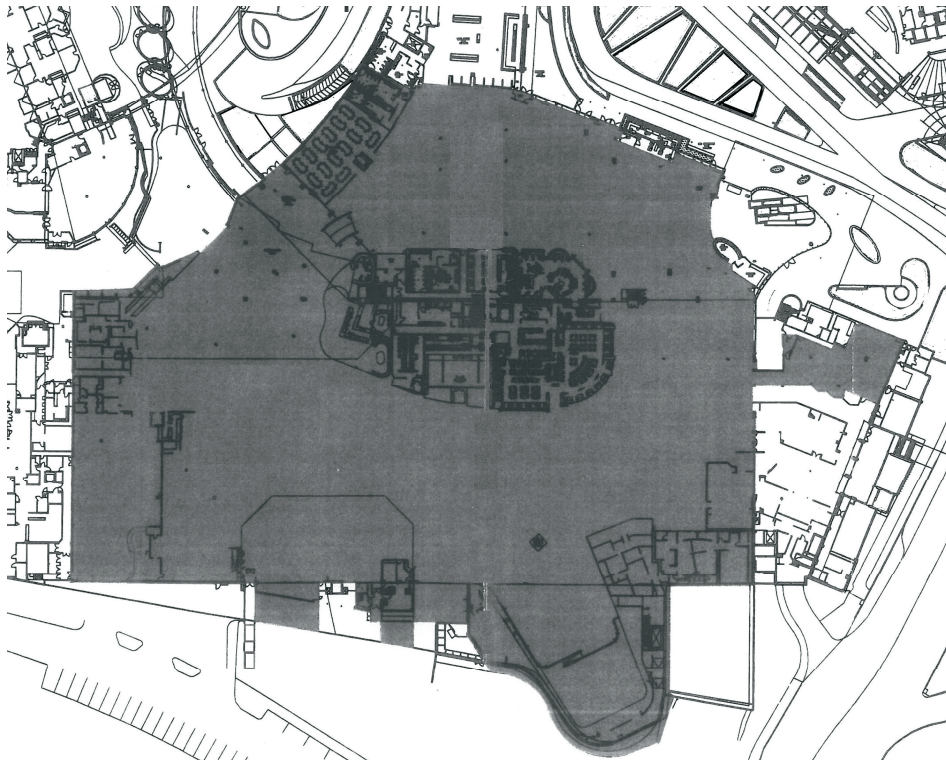
Plan of the International Gaming Facility - the “South Burswood SkySalon”



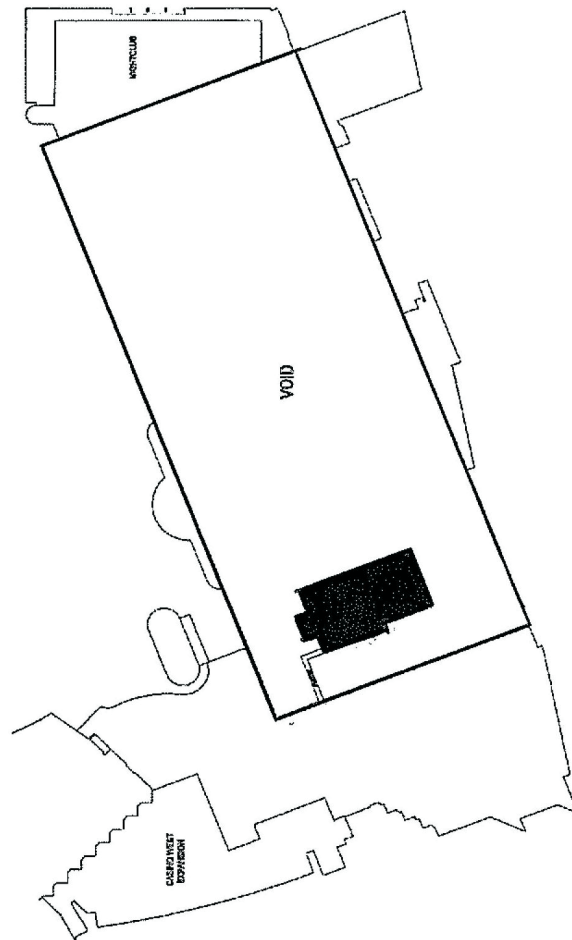
Plan of the lower plaza level showing the Card Destruction Room, Pre-Shuffle Room, Card Store Room and Active Data Room



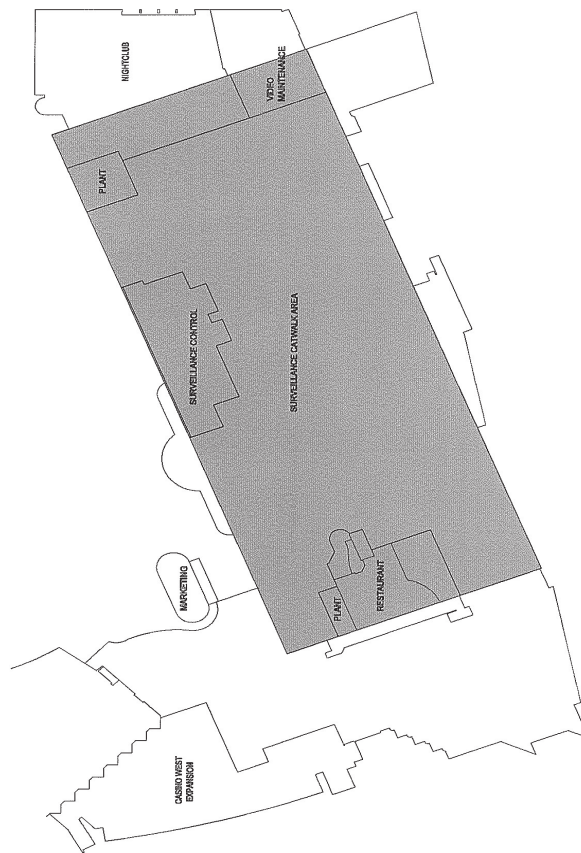
Plan of the Basement showing the Administration Area, Count Facilities and Secure Storage Areas

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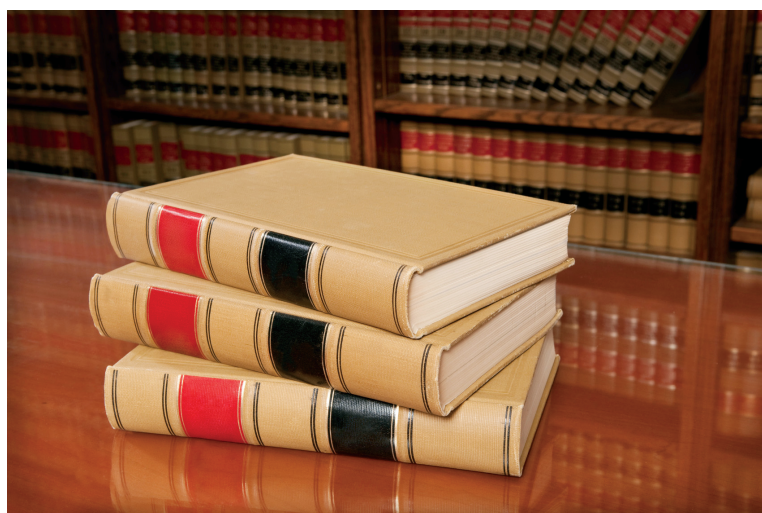
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
