LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995*City of Cockburn***PARKING AND PARKING FACILITIES AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2012**

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and by all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Cockburn resolved on 10 May 2012 to make the following local law.

1. Citation

This local law may be referred to as the *City of Cockburn Parking and Parking Facilities Amendment Local Law 2012*.

2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Principal Local Law

In this local law the *City of Cockburn Parking and Parking Facilities Local Law 2007* as published in the *Government Gazette* on 11 January 2008 is referred to as the Principal Local Law. The Principal Local Law is amended.

4. Clause 4 amended

In clause 4, insert the following definitions in the appropriate alphabetical order—

emergency vehicle has the meaning given to it by the Code;

heavy vehicle has the meaning given to it by the Code;

special purpose vehicle has the meaning given to it by the Code;

tractor means—

- (a) a prime mover type motor vehicle that is a tractive unit designed for hauling a semitrailer; or
- (b) a motor vehicle designed for use primarily in public and private sector industry, including but not limited to agricultural, earthmoving and forestry pursuits;

5. Clause 5 amended

Delete subclause (4) and insert—

“(4) Subject to subclause (2), this local law applies to any parking facility or parking station identified in Schedule 1.”

6. Clause 9 amended

Delete clause 9 and insert—

Establishment of parking stations

9. (1) The local government may constitute any land or structure as a parking station by inclusion of a description of the land or structure in Schedule 1.

(2) A parking station constituted under subclause (1) may be varied as to the land or structures which it comprises by an amendment to the description in Schedule 1.

(3) The local government shall indicate the constitution or variation of a parking station by signs.

(4) In relation to a parking station, the local government may determine—

- (a) the location of parking spaces within a parking station;
- (b) the permitted times and conditions of parking or stopping a vehicle;
- (c) the classes of vehicles permitted to park or stop;
- (d) the classes of person permitted to park or stop a vehicle; and
- (e) the manner of parking or stopping a vehicle.

7. Clause 11 amended

In subclause (2) after “that resolution” insert “, provided the effect of such resolution is indicated by signs”.

8. Clause 17 amended

In subclause (3)—

(a) delete “local government” and insert “Council”; and

(b) after “driving vehicles” insert “, and which has been the subject of local public notice no less than twenty-eight days prior to the first day of the event or occurrence”.

9. Clause 35 amended

In subclause (2)—

(a) after “not being” insert “the owner or”; and

(b) after “of that” insert “owner or”.

10. Clause 72 amended

Delete clause 72 and insert—

Special purpose and emergency vehicles

72. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this local law, the driver of—

- (a) a special purpose vehicle; or
- (b) a emergency vehicle,

may, in the course of their duties and when it is expedient and safe to do so, stop or park the vehicle in any place at any time.

11. Schedule 1 amended

In Schedule 1 delete “No.1” and insert—

“1. Parking Station No.1, Cockburn Gateway Shopping Centre, Lot 203 Wentworth Parade, Success.”

Lake Kununurra—

1. Lake Kununurra Water Ski Area: All the waters of Lake Kununurra upstream of a line across the Lake Kununurra between 15°47.565'S, 128°42.177'E (on the southern shore approximately 1 kilometre upstream of the diversion dam) and 15°47.897'S, 128°42.172'E (on the northern shore approximately 400 metres upstream of the boat ramp); and downstream of a line through boundary markers approximately 7.5 kilometres upstream.
All water skiing within this area shall be in a clockwise direction and no person shall engage in water skiing except between the hours of Sunrise and Sunset.
2. Packsaddle Pumping Station Water Ski Area: All the waters of Lake Kununurra downstream of a line through 15°51.577'S, 128°45.007'E (on the northern shore approximately 470 metres downstream of the entrance to Maxwell Creek) and 15°51.723'S, 128°44.914'E (on the southern shore, directly opposite); and upstream of a line through boundary markers approximately 2.5 kilometres downstream; and excluding any areas as indicated by additional boundary markers.
All water skiing within this area shall be in an anti-clockwise direction and no person shall engage in water skiing except between the hours of Sunrise and Sunset.

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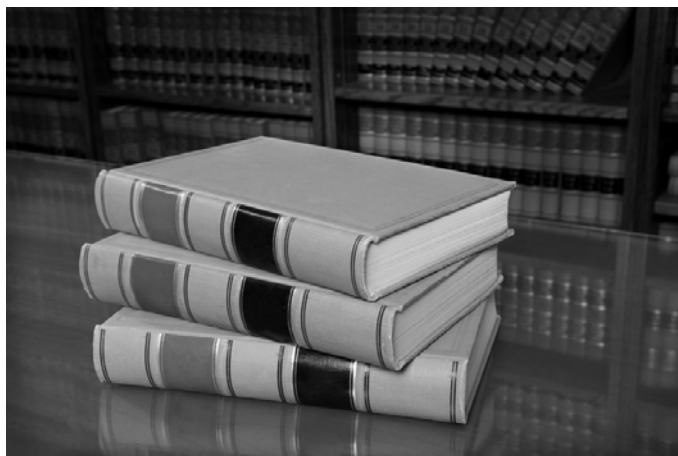
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
