Teacher Registration Act 2012

Teacher Registration (General) Amendment Regulations 2013

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Teacher Registration (General) Amendment Regulations 2013*.

At the end of Part 6 insert:

34. Provisional and limited registration — period of registration

- (1) This regulation applies in relation to the provisional registration or limited registration of a teacher who, on commencement day, is taken under section 136 of the Act to hold that registration.
- (2) On and from commencement day, if the provisional registration or limited registration would otherwise have expired before 30 June 2013, the expiry date of that registration is to be taken to be 30 June 2013.

- (3) Section 23(2) of the Act applies in relation to the provisional registration or limited registration as if “renewed.” were deleted and the following were inserted:

renewed, unless otherwise approved by the Board in a particular case and specified in writing given to the teacher concerned.

next election day means the day fixed for the holding of the poll for the next election.

4. Abolition of existing wards (s. 2.2(1)(d) of the Act)

All the wards in the district are abolished immediately before next election day.

5. District divided into wards (s. 2.2(1)(a) of the Act)

- (1) On and from next election day the district is divided into the following wards —
 - (a) the Baldivis Ward;
 - (b) the Comet Bay Ward;
 - (c) the Rockingham Ward;
 - (d) the Safety Bay Ward.

- (2) The Baldivis Ward consists of the land described in Schedule 1 Division 1.
- (3) The Comet Bay Ward consists of the land described in Schedule 1 Division 2.
- (4) The Rockingham Ward consists of the land described in Schedule 1 Division 3.
- (5) The Safety Bay Ward consists of the land described in Schedule 1 Division 4.

6. Number of councillors (s. 2.18(3)(b) of the Act)

- (1) On and from next election day the number of offices of councillor for each ward in the district is set out in the Table.

HEALTH AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2013

Under the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1911* and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of Cockburn resolved on 14 March 2013 to make the following local law amendments made by the Council of the City of Cockburn under section 342 of the *Health Act 1911* in accordance with subdivision 2 of Part 3 of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

1. Citation

This local law may be cited as the *City of Cockburn Health Amendment Local Law 2013*.

2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation on the day of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Principal Local Law amended

The *City of Cockburn Health Local Laws 2000* published in the *Government Gazette* on 9 October 2000 is referred to as the principal local law. The principal local law is amended.

4. Corrections

Throughout the principal local laws, wherever the words 'subsection' and 'subsections' occurs, delete and insert 'subclause' and 'subclauses' respectively, except if the reference is made to a subsection or subsections of an Act.

5. Clause 4 amended

- (a) In subclause 4(1) delete 'as published by the Water and Rivers Commission in October 1997' from the definition of 'Highest known water table'.
- (b) In subclause 4(1) delete the definition of 'AS', and insert 'means Australian Standard or New Zealand Standard published by Standards Australia;'

6. Clause 4 amended

- (a) In clause 4, delete the definition of "**water**" and insert ' "**water**" means drinking water as described in the "Australian Drinking Water Guidelines (2004) prepared by the National Health and Medical Research Council and the Australian Water Resources Council;
- (b) In clause 4, delete all references to the word 'Council' and insert 'local government', except within the definition of "**water**".

7. Clause 14 amended

In subclause 14(1)(c)(i) delete the word 'wash' which occurs after 'a', and before 'hand wash basin'.

8. Clause 20 amended

In subclause 20(c) delete the words 'Principal Environmental Health Officer' and insert 'Environmental Health Services Manager'.

9. Clause 65 amended

- (a) In clause 65(d) after 'cororis);' insert the word 'and'.
- (b) In clause 65(e) delete 'capitis); and' and insert 'capitia).'

10. Clause 86 amended

Delete subclause 86(1).
