Retail Trading Hours Act 1987

Retail Trading Hours (City of Mandurah) Variation Order (No. 2) 2013

Made by the Minister for Commerce under section 12E of the Act.

1. Citation

This order is the *Retail Trading Hours (City of Mandurah) Variation Order (No. 2) 2013*.

2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows —

- (a) clauses 1 and 2 — on the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order — on the day after that day.

3. Variation of retail trading hours

- (1) General retail shops, other than motor vehicle shops, in the Mandurah local government district are authorised to be open, at times when those shops would otherwise be required to be closed, in accordance with the Table.

Table

Days	Hours
Saturdays (non-public holidays)	from 5.00 p.m. until 6.00 p.m.
Sundays (public holidays and non-public holidays)	from 10.00 a.m. until 5.00 p.m.
Public holidays that fall on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday or Saturday	from 10.00 a.m. until 5.00 p.m.

- (2) Despite subclause (1), general retail shops in the Mandurah local government district are required to be closed on ANZAC Day, Good Friday and Christmas Day.
- (3) The *Retail Trading Hours (City of Mandurah) Variation Order 2012* is revoked.

Fire and Emergency Services Amendment Regulations 2013

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Fire and Emergency Services Amendment Regulations 2013*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the *Fire and Emergency Services Regulations 1998*.

4. Regulation 16 inserted

After regulation 15 insert:

16. Prescribed associations (Act s. 23)

For the purposes of the definition of *prescribed association* in section 23 of the Act —

- (a) the Association of Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades of W.A. Inc. is prescribed as a body

- that represents the bush fire brigades under the *Bush Fires Act 1954*; and
- (b) the Western Australian Volunteer Fire and Rescue Services Association Inc. is prescribed as a body that represents the volunteer brigades under the *Fire Brigades Act 1942*; and
 - (c) the SES Volunteer's Association of Western Australia Inc. is prescribed as a body that represents the SES Units; and
 - (d) the Volunteer Marine Rescue Western Australia Inc. is prescribed as a body that represents the VMRS Groups; and
 - (e) the Emergency Services Volunteers Association Inc. is prescribed as a body that represents the FES Units.
