BUSH FIRES ACT 1954

City of South Perth

2013/2014 FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the City of South Perth

Pursuant to the powers conferred in Section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, you are required on or before the 1st December 2013 to clear inflammable matter, on land owned and/or occupied by you in accordance with the following requirements. This must be maintained until the 30th April 2014.

1. All land which is 2000 m² or less in area;

Remove inflammable matter from the whole of the land, except living trees and shrubs; plants under cultivation and lawn, by means of ploughing, cultivating or slashing to a height of no more than 50mm.

2. All other land within the City of South Perth—

- (i) Firebreaks of a minimum width of 3 metres and height of 4 metres are to be cleared immediately inside all external boundaries of the land;
- (ii) firebreaks to a minimum width of 3 metres and height of 4 metres are to be cleared immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land; and any place where inflammable liquids and gas products are kept;
- (iii) In addition to the requirements in this clause Council may, by notice in writing require an owner and/or occupier to act as and when specified in the notice with respect to anything which is upon land and which in the opinion of Council is or is likely to be conducive to the outbreak of a bush fire or the spread or extension of a bush fire.

The term Inflammable Matter for the purpose of this notice includes bush (as defined in the *Bush Fires Act 1954*), timber, boxes, cartons, paper, rubbish and any other combustible or inflammable matter, but does not include buildings, green standing trees and bushes or growing bushes or plants in gardens or lawns.

PENALTY FOR NON COMPLIANCE

A person who fails to comply with the requisitions in this notice is guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of \$5,000. In addition, where the owner or occupier of the land fails to comply with a notice given pursuant to section 33 (1) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, the City may enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with and the City may recover the amount of any costs and expenses incurred in carrying out those requisitions as a debt due from the owner or occupier of the land maintained clear of inflammable matter up to and including 30 April in the following year.

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954*Shire of Toodyay***FIREBREAK ORDER 2013-2014**

Pursuant to Section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, all residents and ratepayers within the Shire of Toodyay are required to clear a fire break of all inflammable material on their land as set out below.

Due Date: 1 November 2013.

Maintained Until: 30 April 2014.

NB: If you purchase land during this period you have 14 days from purchase to comply with the requirements of this order.

Remember: you are responsible to ensure that you comply with the fire break order and that your property is up to standard by the due date of 1 November each year.

Failure to comply may result in a \$5000

Firebreak Order 2013-2014

1. Rural Residential and Rural Land

Is all land outside the Gazetted Toodyay Townsite—

- 1.1 Land up to and including 200 hectares in size requires a minimum of a 3 metre wide and high fire break within 10 metres of the external boundary.
- 1.2 Land exceeding 200 hectares in size requires a minimum of a 3 metre wide and high fire break to divide the property into 200 hectare parcels of land.
- 1.3 A fire break a minimum of 3 metres wide shall be cleared and maintained within 7 metres around all buildings, haystacks and fuel storage areas. In addition to this, a 15 metre wide low fuel area with a maximum vegetation height of 75 mm is to be maintained. NB: It is not a requirement to remove live trees or shrubs except for Dryandra.
- 1.4 A fire break a minimum of a 3 metre wide shall be cleared and maintained around a stationary motor.
- 1.5 A firebreak a minimum of a 20 metre wide shall be cleared and maintained inside the boundary of all land that has been cleared by whatever means and has piles of vegetation (whether for burning or removal) NB: If clearing is completed after 1 November, the fire break is to be installed within 28 days.
- 1.6 On all land situated within the Majestic Heights, Majestic Waters and Vernon Hills subdivisions a Building Protection Zone 25 metres wide shall be established and maintained around all buildings with a further 25 metres of a Hazard Separation Zone.
- 1.7 All lots within the Donegan Views, Gidgegannup Springs and Regal Hills, Subdivisions shall comply with clause 1.1 of this order except for that portion of the lots adjacent to the external boundary of the subdivision. The fire break on the external boundary of the subdivision is to be 6 metres wide, clear of inflammable material with 4 metres trafficable.

Within;

Moondyne Park, (Lots 601, 112, 114, 117, 125, 126, 128, 132, 133 and 134) Majestic Waters, (Lots 5—10 & 13—17) and Park Views (Lots 650, 671—680, 685 & 686) Subdivisions shall comply with clause 1.1 of this order except for that portion of the lots adjacent to the external boundary of the subdivision. The fire break on the external boundary of the subdivision is to be 6 metres wide, clear of inflammable material with 4 metres trafficable. Firebreak Order 2013-2014

Strategic Firebreaks

All “strategic fire breaks” within the shire of Toodyay have now been deemed as fire access roads and will be maintained and upgraded by the shire of Toodyay at the shire’s expense

All landowners who previously contributed to the strategic firebreaks within the shire of Toodyay are no longer required to do so but are required to comply with this order.

2. Townsite Land

Is all land within the Gazetted Toodyay Townsite—

- 2.1 All Townsite Lots with an area less than 1 hectare (2.47 acres) are required to be fire hazard reduced by—
 - Removal of all inflammable material or
 - Reduction of the vegetation fire hazard to a maximum height of 75 mm.
 - Removal of all slashed material.
- 2.2 All Townsite Lots with an area greater than or equal to 1 hectare (2.47 acres) shall comply with either clause 2.1 above or clauses 1.1 and 1.3 of this Order.

Fire Break Variation

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to clear fire breaks on any land as required by this Order a Fire Break Variation can be applied for.

All requests for variations must be received at the Shire Office by 1 October in any year. The request must be in writing and provide a sketch of the property with existing fire breaks and the proposed alternative. If permission is granted, it will be in writing and shall remain valid until revoked.

Burning Garden Refuse, Campfires and Cooking Fires During the Restricted Burning Period.

The burning of garden refuse and the lighting of camping or cooking fires is prohibited during the Restricted Burning Period unless a valid permit to burn has been obtained from a Fire Control Officer.

2013/2014 FIREBREAK NOTICE

Notice to all owners and/or occupiers of land in the City of Belmont.

As a measure for preventing the outbreak of a bush fire, or for preventing the spread or extension of a bush fire which may occur, all owners and occupiers of land within the City of Belmont are required before the 1st day of December in each year, or within 14 days of becoming the owner or occupier of land, if after that date, to clear firebreaks or to take measures in accordance with this Notice and maintain those firebreaks and measures in accordance with this Notice up to and including the 31st day of March in the following year.

1. Land with a building on it with an area of 3,000 square metres or less—

- Slash all grass and clear all inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5 cm.
- Prune all trees and shrubs around all buildings to provide a safety zone.
- Ensure the roofs, gutters and walls of all buildings on the land are free of inflammable matter.

2. Vacant land with an area of 3,000 square metres or less—

- Slash all grass and clear all inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5 cm.
- Prune all trees and shrubs around all buildings to provide a safety zone.

3. Land with a building on it with an area greater than 3,000 square metres—

- Slash all grass and clear all inflammable matter to a height no greater than 5 cm.
- Install a 3 metre wide firebreak around all buildings and immediately inside all external boundaries of each lot on the land by removing all inflammable matter within that 3 metre wide firebreak to a height of 4 metres.
- Prune all trees and shrubs around all buildings to provide a safety zone.
- Ensure the roofs, gutters and walls of all buildings on the land are free of inflammable matter.

4. Vacant land with an area greater than 3,000 square metres—

- Slash all grass to a height no greater than 5cm.
- Install a 3 metre wide firebreak immediately inside all external boundaries of each lot and around all structures on the land by removing all inflammable matter within that 3 metre firebreak to a height of 4 metres.
- Remove all inflammable matter within 20 metres of any haystacks or stockpiled inflammable matter.
- Maintain fuel loadings of inflammable matter at less than 8 tonnes per hectare across the land.

5. Fuel dumps and depots

Remove all inflammable matter within 10 metres of where fuel drums, fuel ramps or fuel dumps are located, and where fuel drums, whether containing fuel or not, are stored.

6. Garden refuse

Pursuant to Section 24G (2) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and Section 48 (1) of the City of Belmont Health Local Law 2002, the burning of any material including garden refuse is prohibited throughout the whole year. This prohibition pertains to all properties within the City of Belmont.

Failure to comply with this prohibition is an offence (maximum penalty of \$5,000 applies).

7. Welding and cutting apparatus

Pursuant to Regulation 39C (1) of the *Bush Fire Regulations 1954*, a person shall not operate—

- (a) welding apparatus of any kind; or
- (b) power operated abrasive discs of any kind, in the open air, unless—
- (c) at least one fire extinguisher is provided at the place where the welding or cutting is carried out and
- (d) the place referred to in paragraph (c) is surrounded by a firebreak which is at least 5 metres wide.

Failure to comply with Regulation 39C (1) is an offence (maximum penalty of \$1,000 applies).

8. General

Firebreak Inspection Officers will commence inspection of firebreaks and fire hazards from the beginning of the bush fire season. In some circumstances, an owner or occupier of land may be required to undertake fire prevention measures in addition to the measures specified in this Notice.

Where the owner or occupier of the land fails or neglects to comply with the requisitions of this notice or any other notice given pursuant to Section 33 (1) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* within the time specified in the notice, the City of Belmont may direct its officers together with such servants, workmen or contractors, and with such vehicles, machinery and appliances as the officers deem fit, to enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with and the City of Belmont may recover the amount of any costs and expenses incurred in carrying out those requisitions in any court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due from the owner or occupier of the land.

9. Application to vary the above requirements

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or to take measures in accordance with this Notice, you may apply to the City of Belmont in writing before 15th day of November of each year for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative locations or take alternative measures to prevent the outbreak or spread of a bush fire. If permission is not granted in writing by the City of Belmont, you shall comply with the requirements of this Notice.

10. Alternative methods of fuel reduction

The requirements of this Notice should be carried out by means other than burning, i.e. mowing, rotary hoeing, ploughing, scarifying or cultivating.
