**CEMETERIES AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2013**

**4. Clause 7.1(2)(d) is amended**

In Clause 7.1(2)(d) delete “require” and insert “required”.

**5. Clause 2.8 is amended**

Delete Clause 2.8 and replace with the following—

**2.8 Permissible verge treatments**

(2) The permissible verge treatments are—

- (a) the planting and maintenance of a lawn;
- (b) the planting and maintenance of a garden provided that—
  - (i) clear sight visibility is maintained at all times for a person using the abutting thoroughfare in the vicinity of an intersection or bend in the thoroughfare or using a driveway on land adjacent to the thoroughfare for access to or from the thoroughfare; and
  - (ii) where there is no footpath, a pedestrian has safe and clear access of a minimum width of 2m along that part of the verge immediately adjacent to the kerb;
- (c) the installation of an acceptable material; or
- (d) the installation over no more than one third of the area of the verge (excluding any vehicle crossing) of an acceptable material in accordance with paragraph (c), and the planting and maintenance of either a lawn or a garden on the balance of the verge in accordance with paragraph (a) or (b).

**CITY OF KALGOORLIE-BOULDER AMENDMENT DOGS LOCAL LAW 2013**

Under the powers conferred by the *Dog Act 1976*, the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers enabling the local government, the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder resolved on 28 October 2013 to adopt the following local law by an absolute majority resolution.

**1. Citation**

This local law may be cited as the *City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder Dogs Amendment Local Law 2013*.

**2. Commencement**

This local law will come into operation 14 days after the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

**3. Principal local law amended**

In this local law, the *City of Kalgoorlie Boulder Dogs Local law 2012*, as published in the *Government Gazette* on 24 October 2012, is referred to as the principal local law. The principal local law is amended.

**4. Clause 1.6 amended**

Clause 1.6 is deleted and substituted with the following—

**1.6 Interpretation**

- (1) In this local law unless the context otherwise requires—

**Act** means the *Dog Act 1976*;

**authorised person** means a person appointed by the local government to perform all or any of the functions conferred on an authorised person under this local law;

**CEO** means the Chief Executive Officer of the local government;

**dangerous dog** means a dog which is the subject of a declaration under section 33E of the Act declaring it to be a dangerous dog;

**district** means the district of the local government;

**Dog Regulations** means the *Dog Regulations 1976*;

**food premises** means any premises or vehicle in which a food business, as defined in section 10 of the *Food Act 2008*, is being carried on;

**food transport vehicle** has the meaning given to it in the *Food Act 2008*;



**children's playground** means an area set aside for use by children and noted by the presence of dedicated children's playground equipment and the presence of either sand or other form of soft fall substance;

**kennel** means any structure of land used for the boarding or breeding of dogs;

**local government** means the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder;

**local planning scheme means** a local planning scheme made by the local government under the *Planning and Development Act 2005* which applies throughout the whole or a part of the district;

**owner** has the meaning given to it in section 3 of the Act;

**person liable for the control of the dog** has the meaning given to it in section 3 of the Act;

**pound** means a pound established under section 11 of the Act;

**pound keeper** means a person appointed by the local government to perform all or any of the functions conferred on a "pound keeper" under this local law;

**premises** has the meaning given to it in section 3 of the Act;

**public place** has the meaning given to it in section 3 of the Act;

**Schedule** means a schedule in this local law;

**thoroughfare** has the meaning given to it in section 1.4 of the *Local Government Act 1995*;

**townsite** means the townsites within the district which are—

- (a) constituted under Section 26(2) of the *Land Administration Act 1997*; or
- (b) referred to in clause 37 of schedule 9.3 of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

- (2) Reference to any act or local law means that act or local law as amended from time to time and includes all regulations made thereunder.

#### 5. Clause 5.1 amended

Clause 5.1 is deleted and substituted with the following—

##### Clause 5.1 Places where dogs are prohibited absolutely

- (1) Subject to section 8 of the Act and section 66J of the *Equal Opportunity Act 1984* dogs are prohibited absolutely from entering or being in any of the following places—
  - (a) a public building, unless permitted by a sign;
  - (b) all food premises and food transport vehicles;
  - (c) a public swimming pool;
  - (d) a park used for sporting purposes or unless otherwise specified;
  - (e) a public toilet block or changing room;
  - (f) within 5 metres of a children's playground;
  - (g) a theatre or picture gardens; and
  - (h) the places listed in Schedule 4.
- (2) If a dog enters or is in a place specified in subclause (1), every person liable for the control of the dog at that time commits an offence.

**Penalty:** Where the dog is a dangerous dog, a fine of \$2,000; otherwise a fine of \$1,000.

- (3) This clause is subject to the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* (Cth).

#### 6. Clause 5.2 amended

Clause 5.2 is deleted and substituted with the following—

##### 5.2 Places which are dog exercise areas

- (1) For the purposes of section 31 and 32 of the Act, the following public places are designated as dog exercise areas—
  - (a) Arboretum—Reserve—R23840
  - (b) Edwards Park—Reserve—29137
  - (c) Wallace Park—(Between the hours of 5.00am—8.00am daily) Reserve -R11126
  - (d) Shepherdson Park—(Grassed area only)—Reserve—R4557
  - (e) Gribble Creek—Reserve—R42208
  - (f) Gribble Creek—(area between Johnston, Kingsmill and Wittenoom Streets)—Reserve—R32961
  - (g) Rasmussen Park—(excluding the Children's Playground area)—Reserve R49596
  - (h) Dwyer Street Dam—Reserve—R8149

- (i) Norkal Park—Reserve—R40625
- (j) Bushland & Gribble Creek surrounds along Vivian Street—Reserve—R 42303
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply to—
  - (a) area set aside as a children's playground;
  - (b) an area being used for sporting or other activities, unless permitted by the local government during the times for such use; or
  - (c) a car park.

**Penalty:** Where the dog is a dangerous dog, a fine of \$2,000; otherwise a fine of \$1,000.

#### 7. Clause 5.2(2) deleted

Clause 5.2(2) is deleted.

#### 8. Clause 5.3 deleted

Clause 5.3 is deleted.

#### 9. Clause 6.1 amended

Clause 6.1 is deleted and substituted with the following—

##### 6.1 Offence to excrete

- (1) A dog must not excrete on—
  - (a) any thoroughfare or other public place; or
  - (b) any land which is not a public place without the consent of the occupier.
- (2) Subject to subclause (3), if a dog excretes contrary to subclause (1), every person liable for the control of the dog at the time commits an offence.

**Penalty:** a fine of \$500

- (3) The person liable for the control of the dog does not commit an offence against subclause (2) if the excreta are removed immediately by that person.

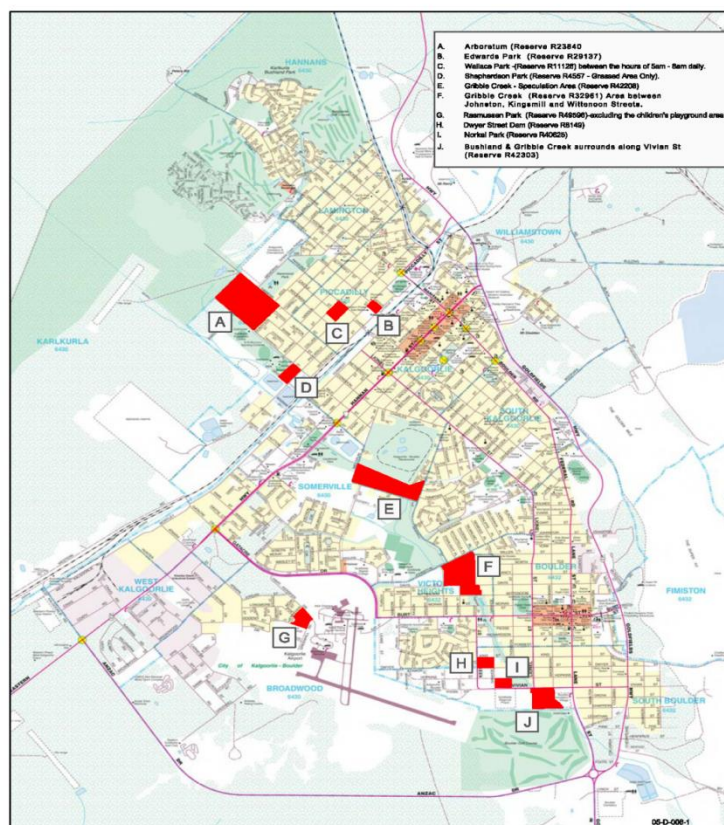

#### RACING AND WAGERING WESTERN AUSTRALIA (FOB RULES) NOTICE 2013

Made by Racing and Wagering Western Australia under section 61 of the Act.

#### 1. Citation

This notice is the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia (FOB Rules Notice 2013)*

#### 2. Commencement

These rules came into operation on 12 June 2012.

#### 3. Interpretation

In this notice—

“the Act” means the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia Act 2003*;

“the Rules” means the rules described in clause 4, adopted by Racing and Wagering Western Australia.

#### 4. Rules adopted under section 61 of the Act

(1) In a meeting held on 31 May 2012, Racing and Wagering Western Australia resolved—

(a) to adopt and operate under rules relating to a jointly operated fixed odds wagering system in accordance with section 61(2) and (4) of the Act.

(2) A copy of the rules adopted was published for public information in the Special Gazette of 12 June 2012 at pp. 2413-2441.

(3) Further amendments to the Rules were adopted by resolution of the Board dated 11 October 2012, 25 March 2013 and 30 August 2013 and published for public information in the Gazettes of 23 October 2012 at pp. 5058-5060, 5 April 2013 at pp. 1490-1491 and 17 September 2013 at pp. 4337-4346.

#### 5. Changes to Rules published for public information (section 61(6)(c) of the Act

(1) Further amendments to the Rules were adopted by resolution of the Board dated 31 October 2013.

(2) Those further amendments to the Rules are published in the Schedule to this notice for public information, as required by section 61(6)(c) of the Act.

#### Schedule 1—Amendments to Adopted Rules

**178. BASEBALL** delete the word “Japanese” and insert the word “Asian” where it appears in that rule.

**195 CRICKET****All Cricket Matches**

Delete the words—

- (b) “Batting Head to Head—Both players must be at the batting crease while a ball is bowled (but not necessarily face a ball) for bets to stand. If either batsman’s innings is curtailed by weather or bad light all bets are void unless a result has already been determined. In the event of a tie the Dead-Heat Rule applies.”

Insert the words—

- (b) “Batting Head to Head—Both players must face a ball for bets to stand. If either batsman’s innings is curtailed by weather or bad light all bets are void unless a result has already been determined. In the event of a tie the Dead-Heat Rule applies.”

Delete the words—

- (d) “Batsman Runs (Over/Under)—If a batsman’s innings is disrupted or ended by weather or bad light, all bets where a result has not been determined will be void. A result is deemed to have been determined if a batsman has passed the run total at which a bet was struck, has been dismissed or an innings is declared. For example, if a batsman’s score stands at 50 not out when a game or innings is terminated due to bad light or rain, all bets under and over 50.5 runs will be void. However, all bets on over 49.5 runs are winners and all bets on under 49.5 runs are losers. If a batsman retires hurt his score at the end of his team’s innings will be the result.”

Insert the words—

- (d) “Batsman Runs—Batsman must face a ball for bets to stand. If a batsman retires hurt his score at the end of his team’s innings will be the result.”

Delete the words—

- (e) “Fall of next wicket—If either batsman retires hurt before a result has been determined all bets will be void. A result is deemed to have been determined if the innings total has past the run total at which a bet was struck. If a team declares or reaches their target the total achieved by the batting team will be the result of the market. If a partnership is disrupted due to weather all bets will stand, unless there is no further play in the match in which case all bets where a result has not been determined will be void. “

Insert the words—

- (e) “Fall of next wicket—Should either batsman retire (hurt or otherwise) the partnership is deemed to continue with the next batsman until the wicket falls. If a team declares or reaches their target the total achieved by the batting team will be the result of the market”

Delete the words—

- (m) “Method of Dismissal—If either player retires hurt before the wicket falls, or there is no wicket, bets are void. ‘Any Other’ includes hit wicket, handled ball, obstructing the field, timed out or hit the ball twice.”

Insert the words—

- (m) “Method of Dismissal—If there is no wicket, bets are void. ‘Any Other’ includes hit wicket, handled ball, obstructing the field, timed out or hit the ball twice.”

**196 Limited Overs (including One-Day Internationals, Twenty20s & Domestic One-Day cricket)**

Delete the words—

- (c) “Hi Bats/Most Wickets—Player must be in starting eleven for bets to stand but they do not have to face or deliver a ball. In the event of a tie dead heat rules apply. 50% of originally scheduled overs for each innings must be completed for bets to stand unless target has been reached or team has been bowled out.”

Insert the words—

- (c) “Most Runs/Most Wickets—Player must be in starting eleven for bets to stand but they do not have to face or deliver a ball. In the event of a tie Dead-Heat Rule applies. A minimum of 20 overs for one-dayers and 10 overs for T20s must be completed unless target has been reached or team has been bowled out.”

Delete the words—

- (d) “Total Team Runs—The full number of overs must be bowled for bets to stand (e.g. Innings Runs—20 overs, 1st 15 overs) unless an innings reaches its natural conclusion (win/lose/bowled out) or a result has already been determined when the number of overs is reduced. Duckworth-Lewis adjustments do not count for betting purposes.”

Insert the words—

- (d) “Total Team Runs—The full number of specified overs must be bowled for bets to stand unless a team is bowled out. Duckworth-Lewis adjustments do not count for betting purposes.”

Delete the words—

- (f) “Most Sixes/Run Outs—Must be a match result for bets to stand. Bets void if 2nd innings is incomplete unless team batting 2nd has exceeded 6s or run outs from the 1st innings or 2nd innings reaches its natural conclusion (bowled out or reach target). The team that hits the most sixes/loses the most wickets to run outs will be the winner.”

Insert the words—

- (f) “Most Sixes/Most Batsmen Dismissed by Run Out—There must be an official match result for bets to stand. If there are reduced overs from those originally scheduled, bets will only stand in the following situations—
  - (i) If both scheduled innings lengths are equal (provided there is no further reduction of overs for the team batting 2nd)
  - (ii) If the team batting 2nd exceeds their target regardless of the number of overs bowled”

Delete the words—

- (g) “Total Sixes/Run Outs/Wides/Ducks—80% of originally scheduled overs must be bowled or bets are void unless a result has already been determined”

Insert the words—

- (g) “Total Sixes/Total Run Outs/Total Wides/Total Ducks—Bets are void if there is any reduction in the original scheduled overs for either team.”

Delete the words—

- (h) “Winning Margin—Bets are void if there is any reduction in the original scheduled overs for either team.”

Insert the words—

- (h) “Winning Margin/Tribet—Bets are void if there is any reduction in the original scheduled overs for either team”.

#### **197 Test Matches/First Class Matches (including domestic cricket e.g. Sheffield Shield)**

Delete the words—

- (f) “Hi Bats/Most Wickets (innings)—50 overs must be completed for bets to stand unless innings has reached its natural conclusion (including innings declared). Player must be in starting eleven for bets to stand but they do not have to face or deliver a ball.”

Insert the words—

- (f) “Most Runs/Most Wickets (innings)—50 overs must be completed for bets to stand unless team is bowled out or declares. Player must be in starting eleven for bets to stand but they do not have to face or deliver a ball”.

Delete the words—

- (g) “Hi Bats/Most wickets (match)—All bets relate to the whole match. Unless the first innings for both teams reaches its natural conclusion all bets will be void if 50 overs are not bowled in each first innings. Player must be in starting eleven for bets to stand but they do not have to face or deliver a ball”.

Insert the words—

- (g) “Most Runs/Most wickets (match)—All bets relate to the whole match (both innings). Player must be in starting eleven for bets to stand but they do not have to face or deliver a ball”.

Delete the words—

- (h) “Innings Runs—Unless an innings has reached its natural conclusion, or an innings is declared, all bets will be void if 50 overs are not bowled. If an innings is declared at any point bets will be settled on the declaration total”.

Insert the words—

- (h) “Innings Runs—Unless a team is bowled out or an innings is declared, all bets will be void if 50 overs are not bowled. If an innings is declared at any point bets will be settled on the declaration total”.

Delete the words—

- (m) “First Innings Century—All bets are void if 50 overs are not bowled unless a result has already been determined or the innings has reached its natural conclusion (including innings declared)”.

Insert the words—

- (m) “First Innings Fifty/Century—All bets are void if 50 overs are not bowled unless a result has already been determined or a team is bowled out/declares”.

These by-laws are the *Country Areas Water Supply Amendment By-laws (No. 2) 2013*.

**2. Commencement**

- (b) the rest of the by-laws — on the day after that day.

**3. By-laws amended**

These by-laws amend the *Country Areas Water Supply By-laws 1957*.

**4. By-law 1 amended**

After by-law 1(1) insert:

- (2) Despite sub-bylaw (1), these by-laws do not apply to the Wellington Dam Catchment Area except for the Mungalup Dam Catchment.
- (3) The boundaries of the Mungalup Dam Catchment are, for the purposes of sub-bylaw (2) —
  - (a) defined by reference to the coordinates annexed to the Department of Water Plan WT 6564 titled “Mungalup Dam Catchment” and dated 3/09/2013; and
  - (b) shown, for information, on the maps in Schedule 4.

Note: The map referred to in sub-bylaw (3)(a) is available for inspection at the Head Office of the Department of Water and on the Department’s website.

(4) In sub-by-law (3) —

***coordinates*** means Map Grid of Australia 1994 grid coordinates in Zone 50 of the Universal Transverse Mercator Grid System based on the Geocentric Datum of Australia.

**5. By-law 2 amended**

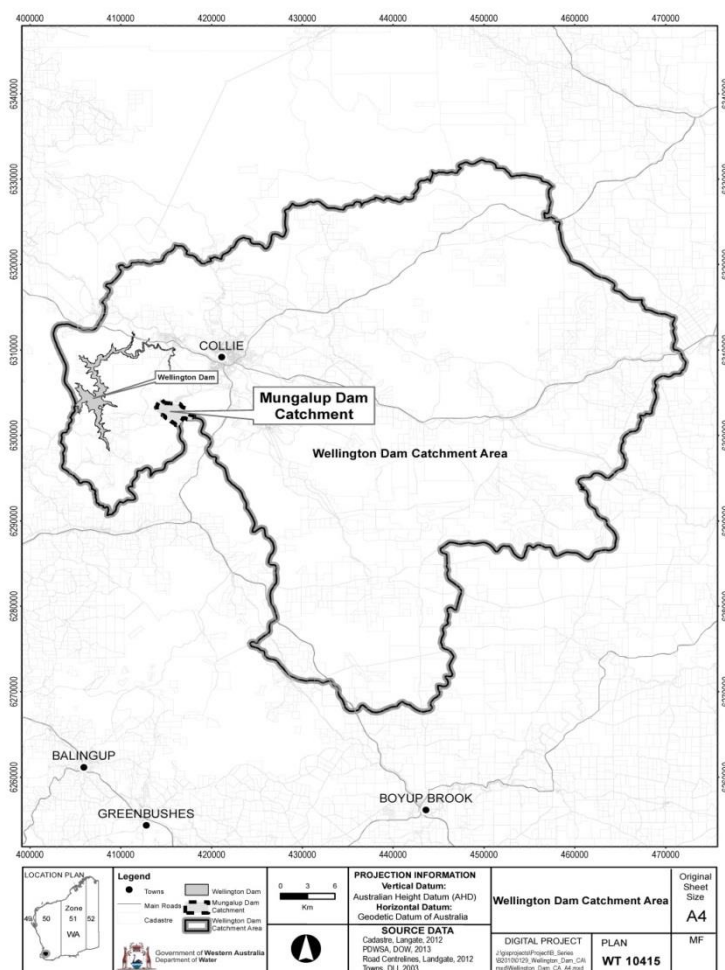
