BIOSECURITY AND AGRICULTURE MANAGEMENT ACT 2007

BIOSECURITY AND AGRICULTURE MANAGEMENT (PROHIBITED ORGANISMS) DECLARATION (NO. 2) 2013

Made by the Minister under section 12 of the Act and the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Regulations 2013 regulation 8.

1. Citation

This declaration is the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Prohibited Organisms) Declaration (No. 2) 2013.

2. Prohibited organisms

(1) An organism listed in the Table is declared under section 12(1) of the Act to be a prohibited organism.

(2) Under section 22(1) of the Act a prohibited organism is a declared pest for the whole of the State.

(3) An organism listed in the Table is assigned under the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Regulations 2013 regulation 8 for the area specified opposite it in the Table—

- (a) to the control category specified opposite it in the Table; and
- (b) to the keeping category specified opposite it in the Table.
