1. Citation

These regulations are the *Rottnest Island Amendment Regulations 2013*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the *Rottnest Island Regulations 1988*.

4. Regulation 3 amended

In regulation 3 delete the definition of *bicycle* and insert:

bicycle has the meaning given in the *Road Traffic Code 2000* section 3(1);

5. Regulation 31F amended

Delete regulation 31F(1)(b) and insert:

- (b) may be cancelled by the Authority if —
 - (i) the authorised user fails to make a payment required by regulation 31E; or
 - (ii) the authorised user fails to comply with a direction under regulation 34(4); or

- (iii) the Authority is satisfied that the authorised user has committed an offence under the Act or these regulations;

6. Regulation 45 amended

Delete regulation 45(1)(a) and insert:

- (a) a bicycle; or

7. Regulation 46 amended

In regulation 46(2) delete “bicycle or other vehicle that is designed to be propelled solely by human power.” and insert:

bicycle.

8. Regulation 48 amended

In regulation 48(2) in the definition of *other road users* delete “bicycle or wheeled vehicle that is designed to be propelled solely by human power.” and insert:

bicycle.

9. Regulation 51 amended

In regulation 51(1)(b) delete “or a wheeled vehicle that is designed to be propelled solely by human power”.

10. Schedule 4 amended

- (1) In Schedule 4 after item 28 insert:

29AA.	45(1)	Bringing vehicle on to Island without permission	200
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- (2) In Schedule 4 item 30B delete “or other wheeled vehicle”.

CONSERVATION AND LAND MANAGEMENT (REVOCATION OF STATE FOREST)
ORDER (NO. 1) 2013

Made by the deputy of the Governor in Executive Council under section 9(2) of the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984*.

1. Citation

This order may be cited as the *Conservation and Land Management (Revocation of State Forest) Order (No. 1) 2013*.

2. Background to this order

(1) In accordance with section 9(2) of the Act, a proposal dated 9 July 2013 that an area of about 33.1017 hectares be revoked from State Forest No. 7, 14, 20 and 56 was laid before both Houses of Parliament.

(2) Resolutions that the proposal referred to in subclause (1) be carried out were passed by the Legislative Assembly on 26 September 2013 and by the Legislative Council on 21 November 2013.

(3) The land referred to in subclause (1) has been surveyed and are now described in Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4.

3. Portion of State Forest No. 7, 14, 20 and 5 revoked

The areas described in Schedules 1, 2, 3 and 4 are declared to be no longer State forest.

Schedule 1—Land no longer part of State Forest No. 7

Rationalisation of Mundaring Water Treatment Plant

All that portion of land situated about five kilometres south of Mundaring and comprising of Lot 375 on Diagram 6300 (8.5961 hectares) and Lot 376 on Plan 4109 (0.7809 hectares).

Total Area: 9.3770 hectares.

On Landgate plan: Mundaring SW (2134-III-SW).

Schedule 2—Land no longer part of State Forest No. 14

Dedication of Holmes Road

All that portion of land situated about one and a half kilometres south-east of Dwellingup and comprising of Lot 555 on Deposited Plan 6042 (1.8121 hectares).

The following provision applies to students residing within the previously gazetted optional areas for Belridge Secondary College (gazetted in April 2012) that will no longer exist from 2015.

A sibling of a student who is both enrolled at Belridge Secondary College and residing within one of the following two areas in 2014, will be entitled to enrol at this school provided there is at least one member of the family already enrolled at the school in the year in which the sibling is applying to enrol.

1. From the intersection of Burns Beach Road and Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue (east side included) to Shenton Avenue, east along Shenton Avenue (north side included) to Connolly Drive, north along Connolly Drive (west side included) to Burns Beach Road and west along Burns Beach Road (south side included) to Marmion Avenue.
2. From the intersection of Indian Ocean coastline and the locality boundary between Kallaroo and Mullaloo, east along this locality boundary to Northshore Drive, north along Northshore Drive (west side included) to Mullaloo Drive, east along Mullaloo Drive (north side included) to Centaur Street, south along Centaur Street (east side included) to Kallaroo Place, east along Kallaroo Place (north side included) and its extension to the intersection of Marmion Avenue, north along Marmion Avenue (west side included) to Ocean Reef Road, west along Ocean Reef Road (south side included) to the junction with Oceanside Promenade, and due west to the coastline, south along the coastline to the locality boundary between Kallaroo and Mullaloo.

CLARKSON COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL (Jan 14)

The following will define the local-intake area of this school from 2015—

From the intersection of Marmion Avenue and the locality boundary between Kinross and Tamala Park, east along this locality boundary to the proposed extension of the Mitchell Freeway, north along the proposed Mitchell Freeway (west side included) to a point on the extension of the east-west alignment of Kilkee Street, west along this extension and along the east-west section of Kilkee Street (both sides excluded) to Sanctuary Gardens, south along Sanctuary Gardens (both sides excluded) to Ridgewood Boulevard, west along Ridgewood Boulevard (both sides excluded) to Hinchinbrook Avenue, south and south west along Hinchinbrook Avenue (both sides excluded) to Connolly Drive, west to Calder Retreat, west along Calder Retreat (both sides excluded) to Coldsteam Circuit, west and north to the northern end of Helby Close (both sides included),

generally south west between the northern end of Helby Court and the eastern end of Earl Court, south west along Earl Court (both sides excluded) to Allum Green, south along Allum Green (both sides excluded) and west between the southern end of Allum Green and the eastern end of Daintree Court (both sides included) to the junction of Coldstream Circuit and Sandon Elbow, north along Coldstream Circuit (both sides included) to Baltimore Parade, west along Baltimore Parade (south side included) to Tenby Close, west along Tenby Close (both sides included) and north west between the western end of Drammen Elbow and the northern end of Ronez Elbow, south and west along Ronez Elbow (both sides included) to Dunmore Circuit, north along Dunmore Circuit to (both sides included) to Avola Cove, west along Avola Cove (both sides included) and its extension to Marmion Avenue, and south along Marmion Avenue (east side included) to the intersection with the locality boundary between Kinross and Tamala Park.

The following defines an optional area between Clarkson Community High School and Wanneroo Secondary College—

From a point on Old Yanchep Road on the eastern extension of Doogarch Road, west along this extension and west along Doogarch Road (south side included) to Bernard Road South, south south west from this junction to a point on Wanneroo Road on the eastern extension of the locality boundaries of Alkimos, Carabooda, and Eglinton, west along this extension to the junction of the locality boundaries of Alkimos, Carabooda, and Eglinton, south along the locality boundary of Alkimos and Carabooda to the proposed Mitchell Freeway, south east along the proposed Mitchell Freeway to the locality boundary between Clarkson and Tamala Park, east north east from this point to the intersection of Wanneroo Road and Flynn Drive, north, north east and east along Flynn Drive (north side included) to Old Yanchep Road, and north and north west along Old Yanchep Road (west side included) to the intersection with the eastern extension of Doogarch Road.

The following provision applies to students residing within the previously gazetted optional area for Clarkson Community High School (gazetted in April 2012) that will no longer exist from 2015.

A sibling of a student who is both enrolled at Clarkson Community High School and residing within the following area in 2014, will be entitled to enrol at this school provided there is at least one member of the family already enrolled at the school in the year in which the sibling is applying to enrol.

From the intersection of Burns Beach Road and Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue (east side included) to Moore Drive, east along Moore Drive (north side included) to Joondalup Drive, north along Joondalup Drive (west side included) to Burns Beach Road and west along Burns Beach Road (south side included) to Marmion Avenue.

KINROSS COLLEGE (Jan 14)

Kinross College will become a Year 7 to 10 secondary school from 2015.

Year 6 students residing within the previous local-intake area of Kinross College (gazetted in December 2003) will be entitled to attend a local primary school from 2015.

The following defines the local-intake area of Kinross College for Years 7 to 10 students from 2015—

From the intersection of the westerly extension of Ocean Parade and the coast, east along this extension and along Ocean Parade (north side included) to Burns Beach Road, east along Burns Beach Road (north side included) to the Mitchell Freeway, north along the proposed Mitchell Freeway extension (west side included) to the locality boundary between Kinross and Tamala Park, west along the locality boundary between Kinross and Tamala Park to Marmion Avenue, north along Marmion Avenue (west side included) to the junction with Santa Barbara Parade, generally west along Santa Barbara Parade (both sides excluded) to Morialta Avenue, south west along Morialta Avenue (both sides excluded) to Tapping Way, north west along Tapping Way (south east side included) to View Terrace, south west along View Terrace (south side included) to Ashley Avenue, south west along Ashley Avenue (south side included) to Terry Road, west along Terry Road (south side included) and its westward extension to the coastline, and south along the coastline to the westerly extension of Ocean Parade.

The following provision applies to students residing within the previously gazetted optional areas for Kinross College that will no longer exist from 2015.

A sibling of a student who is both enrolled at Kinross College and residing within the following area in 2014, will be entitled to enrol at this school provided there is at least one member of the family already enrolled at the school in the year in which the sibling is applying to enrol.

From the intersection of Burns Beach Road and Marmion Avenue, south along Marmion Avenue (east side included) to Moore Drive, east along Moore Drive (north side included) to Joondalup Drive, north along Joondalup Drive (west side included) to Burns Beach Road and west along Burns Beach Road (south side included) to Marmion Avenue.

MINDARIE SENIOR COLLEGE (Jan 14)

The following areas define the local-intake area for this school, for students in Years 11 and 12, from 2015—

From the intersection of the westerly extension of Ocean Parade and the coast, east along Ocean Parade (north side included) to Burns Beach Road, east along Burns Beach Road (north side included) to the Mitchell Freeway, north along the proposed Mitchell Freeway extension (west side included) to the locality boundary between Kinross and Tamala Park, west along the locality boundary between Kinross and Tamala Park to Marmion Avenue, north along Marmion Avenue (west side included) to the junction with Santa Barbara Parade, generally west along Santa Barbara Parade (both sides excluded) to Morialta Avenue, south west along Morialta Avenue

(both sides excluded) to Tapping Way, north west along Tapping Way (south east side included) to View Terrace, south west along View Terrace (south side included) to Ashley Avenue, south west along Ashley Avenue (south side included) to Terry Road, west along Terry Road (south side included) and its westward extension to the coastline, and south along the coastline to the westerly extension of Ocean Parade.
