transcript has the meaning given in rule 40B(a).

40B. Media organisation may apply for transcript or exhibit

For the purposes of section 33(9)(b) of the Act, a media organisation may apply to the court for leave to inspect or obtain a copy of —

- (a) the record, or the certified transcript of the record, of any proceedings in the case (a *transcript*); or
- (b) any other document (including in an electronic form) tendered in evidence in the case (an *exhibit*).

40C. Making applications

- (1) An application must be made by lodging a Form 1.
- (2) The relevant media organisation need not give notice of the application to any party to the case unless an order is made under rule 40E(2)(a).

40D. Who may deal with applications

- (1) When the application is lodged, a registrar must refer it to a magistrate unless subrule (2) applies.
- (2) A registrar may, without hearing the relevant media organisation, grant an application if —
 - (a) the relevant record was the subject of a previous application in the case; and
 - (b) the application was granted by a magistrate.

- (3) A magistrate to whom an application is referred under subrule (1) may, in chambers —
 - (a) without hearing the relevant media organisation, grant the application; or
 - (b) order a registrar to list the application for hearing by a magistrate.

40E. Dealing with applications

- (1) A magistrate or registrar dealing with an application may deal with the application even though no party to the case has been served with it.
- (2) A magistrate dealing with an application may —
 - (a) order the relevant media organisation to serve any other person, specified in the order, with the application and a notice in an approved form entitling the person to be heard on the application; and
 - (b) deal with the application accordingly.
- (3) A magistrate dealing with an application may grant or refuse it.
- (4) A magistrate dealing with an application, if satisfied the relevant media organisation has sufficient cause to be granted leave, may grant the application subject to —
 - (a) any order made under the CPA section 171; and
 - (b) any information contained in a pre-sentence report ordered under the *Sentencing Act 1995* section 20 indicating that it would be inappropriate to grant the application; and
 - (c) any other order or written law that prohibits or restricts the publication or possession of the relevant record.

40F. Court's power to publish unaffected

This Division does not prevent the court from publishing, on its own initiative, all or any part of the proceedings in a case to any person, and in any manner, it thinks fit.

FISHERIES ADJUSTMENT SCHEME NOTICE 2014

Made by the Minister under section 10B of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice may be cited as the *South West Trawl and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Notice 2014*.

2. Interpretation

In this notice—

“**authorisation**” means a commercial fishing licence, a fishing boat licence, or a managed fishery licence;

“**committee**” means the South West Trawl Managed Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme Committee of Management established by written instrument dated 15 November 2013 and made under section 11 of the Act;

“**Fishery**” means the South West Trawl Fishery as declared in the *South West Trawl Management Plan 1989*;

“**managed fishery licence**” means a managed fishery licence that authorises a person to fish in Zone D of the Fishery;

“**Related Fisheries**” means any other fishery in which a person authorised or entitled to fish in the Fishery is also authorised or entitled to engage in fishing in accordance with an authorisation (including by reference to any exception made under a provision of the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994*);

“**scheme**” means the *South West Trawl and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2014* established by clause 3.

3. Establishment of fisheries adjustment scheme

A fisheries adjustment scheme is established, to be known as the *South West Trawl and Related Fisheries Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2014*.

4. Objective

The objective of the scheme is to reduce the size of the Fishery and Related Fisheries by reducing—

- (a) the number of persons authorised to fish in Zone D of the Fishery and Related Fisheries; and
- (b) the number of boats that may be used for fishing in Zone D of the Fishery and Related Fisheries.

5. The fishery to which the scheme applies

The fishery to which the scheme applies is the Fishery and Related Fisheries.

6. Who may offer to surrender an authorisation

Any person who is the holder of a managed fishery licence or an authority to fish in the Fishery and Related Fisheries is entitled to offer the surrender of an authorisation.

7. Manner of operation

The manner of operation of the scheme shall be that—

- (a) invitations for offers to surrender authorisations shall be made in accordance with section 10C(4) of the Act and not later than 24 April 2014;
- (b) any offer shall be submitted to the committee in the form approved by the committee;
- (c) the committee shall forward any offers to the Minister and advise the Minister whether to accept or decline any offer or to make a counter offer; and
- (d) the Minister shall respond to any offer in accordance with section 10C(5) of the Act after considering any advice of the committee.

8. Duration of the scheme
