



Magistrates Court (Civil Proceedings) Act 2004

## Magistrates Court (Civil Proceedings) Amendment Rules (No. 4) 2014

Made by the Magistrates Court.

**1. Citation**

These rules are the *Magistrates Court (Civil Proceedings) Amendment Rules (No. 4) 2014*.

**2. Commencement**

These rules come into operation as follows —

- (a) rules 1 and 2 — on the day on which these rules are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the rules — on the day after that day.

**3. Rules amended**

These rules amend the *Magistrates Court (Civil Proceedings) Rules 2005*.

**4. Rule 126 amended**

In rule 126(1) delete “129C” and insert:

129C, 131AA

**5. Rule 127 amended**

In rule 127(1A) in the Table after the item for the *Criminal Investigation Act 2006* insert:

7. **Rules 131AA, 131AB, 131AC and 131AD inserted**

After rule 130 insert:

**131AA. *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994 s. 94(2), application under***

- (1) An application under the *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994* section 94(2) must be lodged by the Sheriff together with copy of the written notice of claim.
- (2) As soon as practicable after an application made by the Sheriff under the *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994* section 94(2) is lodged, a registrar must —
  - (a) list the application for hearing on the earliest convenient date; and
  - (b) endorse the hearing date on the application; and
  - (c) return one copy of the application to the Sheriff and serve one copy of the application on the claimant by service by ordinary post.
- (3) If the claimant files notice of withdrawal and gives notice in writing of the withdrawal to the court before the time of the hearing, the property seized by the Sheriff or the proceeds of the sale of the property must be dealt with and disposed of as if the claim had not been made.

**131AB. *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994 s. 94, location of interpleader proceedings***

- (1) The proceedings under the *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994* section 94 are to be held at the place where the court has a registry that is nearest to the place where the property the subject of the proceedings is located.
- (2) If the court is satisfied that it would be more convenient or fair to the parties if the whole or a part of the interpleader proceedings were conducted at another place in the State (whether or not a registry of the court is there), the court may order accordingly.
- (3) An order may be made under subrule (2) only on the application of a party of which any other party has had notice.
- (4) If the court makes an order under subrule (2) it may make any necessary ancillary or consequential order.

**131AC. *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994 s. 94, interpleader proceedings***

- (1) The claimant must, at least 10 clear days before the time of the hearing, file with the court 2 copies of the particulars of any property alleged to be the property of the claimant and of the claimant's grounds for the claim.
- (2) The following details and information must be fully set out in, or accompany, those particulars —
  - (a) the name, address and description of the claimant;
  - (b) information as to possession of the property;
  - (c) information as to the claimant's interest in the property;
  - (d) details of, and a copy of, any document that supports the claimant's claim to possession of or interest in the property.
- (3) The court must immediately give the Sheriff a copy of the particulars by service by ordinary post.
- (4) A hearing in relation to a claim is to proceed as if the claimant were the plaintiff, and the Sheriff the defendant.

**131AD. *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994 s. 94, power to delay sale***

- (1) The Sheriff may, in his or her discretion, delay selling any property in respect of which a claim has been made under the *Fines, Penalties and Infringement Notices Enforcement Act 1994* section 93 until a court has adjudicated on the claim.
- (2) The Sheriff is to be allowed such costs out of pocket only as the court may order for the keeping of continued possession of the property under subrule (1).

Pursuant to the provisions of By-law 14(4) of the *Government Railways (Parking Stations) By-law 1997*, the Public Transport Authority of Western Australia (**Transperth**) gives notice that it has approved an alternative method of payment for parking vehicles in all its car parks as described below, other than payment into a ticket vending machine that issues a car parking ticket for display.

For the purposes of this notice, ‘vehicle’ includes a motor vehicle, a motorcycle and a motorised scooter.

With effect on and from 1 July 2014, Transperth has approved a paperless method for the payment of parking charges for vehicles that meet the following criteria—

1. A person parking a vehicle in a Transperth car park must either register their vehicle to their SmartRider card by providing their vehicle registration number and their SmartRider card number or if registering a SmartRider card for the first time and also wishing to register their vehicle to their SmartRider card, provide their name, address, date of birth, vehicle registration number, security password and their email address in one of the following ways—
  - a. online, by visiting [www.transperth.wa.gov.au](http://www.transperth.wa.gov.au), clicking on the “Using Transperth” tab, clicking on the “Car Parking” tab and then following the prompts to register their vehicle; or
  - b. by calling the Transperth Helpline on 13 62 13 and asking the operator to register their vehicle to their SmartRider card.
2. A person who has complied with condition 1—
  - a. must have sufficient credit on their SmartRider card to pay the applicable parking charge; and
  - b. may then use the new SmartParker parking machine with their SmartRider card to pay the applicable parking charge, by pressing the green button on the SmartParker machine and placing their SmartRider card against the SmartRider target on the SmartParker machine.

The parking charge will be deducted from the balance on the SmartRider card.

A person who has complied with condition 1 but has insufficient credit on their SmartRider card must either use the Pay ‘n’ Display machine and cash to pay the parking charge or add credit to their SmartRider to pay the parking charge.

3. A person who has complied with conditions 1 and 2 must then continue their journey by “tagging-on” with the same SmartRider card before boarding a Transperth public passenger transport service.

No parking ticket will be dispensed from the SmartParker machine. Transperth will use licence plate recognition software at each parking station to check that parked vehicles not displaying a valid parking ticket have paid the applicable parking charge.

Persons using their registered SmartRider card to pay for parking and who fail to board a Transperth public passenger transport service on the same day will be prevented from using their SmartRider card to pay for parking the next time they use a PTA parking station.

If this happens, passengers must “tag-on” to a Transperth public passenger service to reactivate the SmartRider for the purposes of paying parking charges. Passengers will then be able to use their SmartRider for parking the following day. The ability to “tag-on” and “tag-off” Transperth public passenger transport services will not be affected during this time.

Passengers who do not wish to register their vehicle with Transperth must use the Pay ‘n’ Display ticket machine to pay for parking and must display the issued parking ticket in their vehicle so that the date and expiry time for permitted parking is clearly visible from outside the vehicle.
