Wickham-Point Samson-Cossack Ward means the ward —

- (a) described as the Wickham-Point Samson-Cossack Ward of the Shire of Roebourne in the *Gazette* on 17 January 1975 at p. 107-8; and
- (b) described as being within the City of Karratha in the *Gazette* on 3 June 2014 at p. 1746.

4. Wards abolished

6. Number of councillors for wards specified

- (b) for the Karratha Ward is 8; and
- (c) for the Wickham-Point Samson-Roebourne-Cossack-Pastoral Ward is 2.

7. Continuing councillors allocated to new ward

continuing councillor means a councillor whose term of office as councillor continues beyond next election day.

(2) On and from next election day, a continuing councillor who was a councillor for the Wickham-Point Samson-Cossack Ward immediately before its abolition under clause 4, is to be taken to have been elected as a councillor for the Wickham-Point Samson-Roebourne-Cossack-Pastoral Ward established under clause 5.

8. Consequential directions

In order to give effect to clauses 4 to 6 —

- (a) Part 4 of the Act applies to preparing for and conducting the next election as if the changes effected by this order take effect on commencement day; and
- (b) the operation of Part 4 of the Act is modified to the extent necessary for the purposes of paragraph (a).



1. Citation

This instrument is the West Coast Rock Lobster Managed Fishery Management Plan Amendment 2015.

2. Management plan amended

The amendments in this instrument are to the West Coast Rock Lobster Managed Fishery Management Plan 2012.

3. Clause 3 amended

In clause 3, insert in the correct alphabetical position—

bridle means the rope which attaches a pot line to a pot;

first surface float means the surface float that is connected to the pot line and the beginning of the float rig;

float rig means the rope on the surface of the water that is connected to the first surface float and the last surface float, including any rope beyond the last surface float;

last surface float means the surface float that is connected to the float rig and is the farthest away from the pot line;

pot line means the length of rope between the first surface float and the bridle;

4. Clause 26A replaced

Delete clause 26A and insert—

26A. Use of pot lines and float rigs

- (1) This clause applies to the use of pot lines and float rigs used to fish for rock lobster during the period commencing on 1 May and ending on 14 November in any year.
- (2) The master of an authorised boat must ensure that—
 - (a) the maximum length of the pot line is equal to two times the depth of the water being fished;
 - (b) the top third of the length of the pot line is held vertically in the water column;
 - (c) the float rig attached to the pot line is the only rope on the surface of the water;
 - (d) the float rig is no more than 9.1 metres long; and
 - (e) the float rig is attached to—
 - (i) no more than two surface floats when used in waters less than or equal to 54.9 metres in depth; or
 - (ii) no more than three surface floats when used in waters greater than 54.9 metres in depth.
- (3) The master of an authorised boat must ensure that a pot line is pulled a minimum of once every seven days.
- (4) Subclauses (2) and (3) do not apply to the use of a pot line that is less than or equal to 32.9 metres long to fish for rock lobster in a gear mitigation area described in Schedule 14, in accordance with subclause (5).
- (5) When a pot line used to fish for rock lobster in a gear mitigation area described in Schedule 14 is less than or equal to 32.9 metres long, the master of an authorised boat must ensure that—
 - (a) the combined pot line and float rig used to fish for rock lobster is less than or equal to 32.9 metres in length; and
 - (b) no more than two surface floats are attached to the float rig.

CEO means the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Health;

specified place means the premises occupied by the WA Police Drug Squad, Western Australia Police Service, 2 Swanbank Road, Maylands.

4. Possession of substances authorised

(1) The persons listed in Schedule 1 are authorised to possess at the places specified in Schedule 2, and while travelling directly between any of those places, the following substances included in Schedule 9 to the *Poisons Act 1964*, for the purpose of training dogs for the detection of those substances—

COMMISSIONER'S INSTRUCTION No. 11 REDEPLOYMENT STANDARD

Commencement date: 1 May 2015 Enquiries: Workforce Performance Division (08) 6552 8888

Statement of intent

This Commissioner's instruction (CI) establishes the minimum standards of merit, equity and probity to be complied with by the employing authority of each public sector body in matters involving redeployment of employees.

Scope and application

This CI applies to employing authorities and employees under the *Public Sector Management Act* 1994 (PSMA) to the extent that matters of redeployment are not dealt with by the operation of Part 6 (Redeployment and redundancy of employees) of the PSMA and the associated *Public Sector Management (Redeployment and Redundancy) Regulations* 2014.

Effectively it applies only to the movement of an employee, together with the movement of his or her office, post or position within departments and organisations. It deals therefore with scenarios of narrow application, where an existing employee is subject to further deployment (or redeployment) and the office, post or position of that employee has not been abolished nor is that employee surplus to requirements. It is to be noted that 'redeployment' in this context is distinct from the action of employee 'transfer', where an employee is moved from one function to another discrete function either within or between departments and organisations.

This CI repeals under section 21(2) of the PSMA (and replaces)—

• Public Sector Standard in Human Resource Management 2001—Redeployment Standard

When making employment decisions and exercising employment powers and functions the employing authority of each public sector body and its employees must comply with the minimum standards of merit, equity and probity established by the Public Sector Commissioner under this Standard, in addition to compliance generally with the PSMA (particularly sections 8 and 9), CI No. 7—Code of Ethics and other relevant legislation.

THE REDEPLOYMENT STANDARD

The minimum Standard of merit, equity and probity is met for redeployment, if:

- decisions are based on a proper assessment of the work-related requirements of the public sector bodies involved and identified employee interests;
- employees are informed about their future options and how the process is to be managed;
 and
- decisions are impartial, transparent and capable of review.
