#### PROPOSAL TO RESERVE WESTERN AUSTRALIAN WATERS

##### Proposed Yawuru Nagulagun / Roebuck Bay Marine Park

Notice is hereby given under section 14 of the *Conservation and Land Management Act 1984* (CALM Act) of a proposal to reserve Western Australian waters under CALM Act section 13(1) as a marine park in the Roebuck Bay area. Notice is also given that it is proposed that the marine park will be classified as Class A under CALM Act section 13(4).

Any person may make a written submission on this proposal and all persons with an interest in the proposal are encouraged to do so. Written submissions will be considered as part of the finalisation of this proposal.

A marine park is created to protect natural features and aesthetic, scientific and educational values while at the same time enabling compatible recreational and commercial uses (the statutory purpose of marine parks is provided in CALM Act section 13B(1). Section 57(2) of the CALM Act requires the preparation of management plans under the CALM Act to have the objectives of protecting and conserving the value of the land to the culture and heritage of Aboriginal persons.

Situated in the Indian Ocean, the proposed Yawuru Nagulagun / Roebuck Bay Marine Park comprises Western Australian waters, the airspace above those waters, the seabed below those waters, and the subsoil to a depth of 200 metres below that seabed that are—

(a) contained within and bounded by a line—

- (i) commencing south-west of Gantheaume Point at the intersection of the seaward limit of the coastal waters of the State and latitude 17°59'30" south; and
- (ii) extending east along that latitude to the westernmost boundary of the Port of Broome;
- (iii) thence south along that boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Port of Broome;
- (iv) thence east along that boundary to longitude 122°17'00" east;
- (v) thence north along that longitude to latitude 17°59'48" south;
- (vi) thence east along that latitude to longitude 122°18'42" east;
- (vii) thence north along that longitude to latitude 17°58'54" south;
- (viii) thence west along that latitude to longitude 122°15'00" east;
- (ix) thence north along that longitude to latitude 17°56'54" south, in Dampier Creek;
- (x) thence north-westerly along the geodesic to the point located at latitude 17°56'49.2" south longitude 122°14'54" east;
- (xi) thence north-westerly along the geodesic to the point located at latitude 17°56'46.2" south longitude 122°14'46.8" east;
- (xii) thence north-westerly along the geodesic to the point located at latitude 17°56'45" south longitude 122°14'45" east;
- (xiii) thence north-westerly along the geodesic to the point located at latitude 17°56'42" south longitude 122°14'43.8" east;
- (xiv) thence west along that latitude to the high water mark of Dampier Creek that is nearest longitude 122°14'18" east;
- (xv) thence generally northerly, generally north-easterly, generally south-easterly, generally southerly, generally north-westerly and again generally southerly along that water mark around that creek, to Roebuck Bay;
- (xvi) thence generally south-easterly, generally north-easterly, again generally south-easterly, again generally north-easterly and generally north-westerly along that water mark, past Fall Point and the entrance to Crab Creek, to a south-eastern boundary of Lot 350 (Reserve 51583) as shown on Landgate Deposited Plan 72974;

- (xvii) thence north-easterly, westerly and south-easterly along the boundary of that lot to the high water mark that is the boundary of Lot 501 (part Reserve 51932) as shown on Landgate Deposited Plan 70322;
  - (xviii) thence generally southerly and generally south-westerly along that water mark, around Roebuck Bay, past Yardoogarra Creek and Cape Villaret, to latitude 18°20'00" south;
  - (xix) thence west along that latitude to the seaward limit of the coastal waters of the State;
  - (xx) thence generally north-easterly and generally northerly along that limit to the point of commencement; and
- (b) within that line;
    - (i) seaward of the high water mark of the mainland and all islands.

## NOTES—

- (1) All geographic coordinates are expressed in terms of the Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994 ('GDA94').
- (2) Boundary positions as described are approximate only and are subject to survey.
- (3) 'Western Australian waters' means all waters—
  - (a) that are within the limits of the State, or
  - (b) that are 'coastal waters of the State'.
- (4) 'coastal waters of the State' has the meaning given to that term in the *Coastal Waters (State Powers) Act 1980* (Commonwealth) section 3(1).
- (5) 'High water mark' means the ordinary (mean of) high water mark at spring tides as defined in the *Land Administration Act 1997* section 3(1).

The proposed marine park will be reserved subject to compliance with the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth). An indicative joint management plan has been prepared outlining how the proposed Yawuru Nagulagun / Roebuck Bay Marine Park would be managed. This plan includes a map and details of the proposed boundaries, management zoning and management strategies for the proposed marine park.

Under CALM Act section 62(1a), the proposed Yawuru Nagulagun / Roebuck Bay Marine Park is intended to be zoned for management purposes by classifying the following areas—two special purpose areas for cultural heritage and two special purpose areas for recreation and conservation.

The primary purpose of the special purpose areas (cultural heritage) is to provide enhanced protection and recognition for areas of high cultural significance to Yawuru people, while ensuring the conservation of key ecological values and allowing for compatible recreational and commercial activities. The following activities are considered to be incompatible with the purpose of these areas: commercial gillnet fishing; ground-disturbing mineral and petroleum exploration and development; laying of pipelines; dredging and dredge spoil dumping; vessel sewage discharge; and recreational collecting of coral, live rock and live sand.

The primary purpose of the special purpose areas (recreation and conservation) is to provide enhanced protection and conservation for the ecological values of Roebuck Bay whilst acknowledging the high recreational and cultural value of the area and allowing for compatible commercial activities. The following activities are considered to be incompatible with the purpose of these areas: commercial gillnet fishing; ground-disturbing mineral and petroleum exploration and development; laying of pipelines; vessel sewage discharge; and recreational collecting of coral, live rock and live sand.
