LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995 BIOSECURITY AND AGRICULTURE MANAGEMENT ACT 2007

Shire of Gingin

PEST PLANTS LOCAL LAW 2015

Under the powers conferred by the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007*, the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Gingin resolved on 15 September 2015 to make the following local law.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1.1 Title

This local law may be cited as the Shire of Gingin Pest Plants Local Law 2015.

1.2 Commencement

This local law commences on the 14th day after the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

1.3 Repeal

The Shire of Gingin By-laws Relating to Pest Plants (No. 2) published in the Government Gazette on 24 January 1992 and amended on 5 January 2001 are hereby repealed.

1.4 Application

This local law applies throughout the entire district.

1.5 Definitions

In this local law, unless the contrary intention appears—

district means the district of the local government;

local government means the Shire of Gingin; and

pest plant means a plant described as a pest plant by clause 2.1.

PART 2—PEST PLANTS

2.1 Pest plants

Every plant described in Schedule 1 is a pest plant.

PART 3—NOTICES

3.1 Serving of a notice

- (1) The local government may serve on the owner or occupier of private land within the district a duly completed notice in the form as decided by the local government from time to time requiring that person to destroy, eradicate or otherwise control any pest plant on that land.
- (2) A person served with a notice under subclause (1) of this clause shall comply with that notice within the time and in the manner specified therein.

3.2 Failure to comply with a notice

Where a person fails to comply with a notice under clause 3.1 served upon them, the local government may—

- (a) without payment of any compensation in respect thereof, destroy, eradicate or control, as the case may be, any pest plant the destruction, eradication or control of which was required by the notice; and
- (b) recover in a court of competent jurisdiction, as a debt due to the local government, from the person to whom the notice is directed, the amount of the expense of such destruction, eradication or control.

BIOSECURITY AND AGRICULTURE MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS 2013

QUARANTINE AREA NOTICE

Queensland Fruit Fly in Alfred Cove, Ardross, Booragoon, Winthrop, Willagee, Myaree, Melville, and Attadale

- 1. Under regulation 60 of the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Regulations 2013* (Regulations) the area of Alfred Cove, Booragoon, Myaree, Melville and Attadale, bordered by and including the Swan River, both sides of Roberts Road, Moreing Road, Preston Point Road, Stock Road, McLean Street, Redwood Crescent, Leach Highway, Worley Street, Jackman Street, Wheyland Street, Woodhams Street, Hillary Street, Harrison Street, North Lake Road, Hackett Pass, Aitken Drive, Winthrop Drive, Leach Highway, Riseley Street, Canning Highway and Conon Road (see www.agric.wa.gov.au/qflymetro for map) is declared to constitute a quarantine area until 15 February 2016.
- 2. This quarantine area is declared because the declared pest *Bactrocera tryoni* (Froggatt, 1897) (Qfly or Queensland fruit fly) has been found within the area.
- 3. Each person who is the occupier of land within the quarantine area must ensure that any ripening fruit on plants or any fruit that has fallen to the ground from a plant on that land is removed and disposed of every three days. "Fruit" in this notice means the fruit of any of the potential carriers (hosts) of Queensland fruit fly listed in the table below.
- 4. Fruit is to be disposed of by eating it, cooking (boiling or microwaving), freezing it or securing it in a sealed plastic bag which is placed in direct sunlight for a period of three days.
- 5. Persons, other than inspectors, must not move any non-commercially produced fruit from the quarantine area except in accordance with—
 - (a) this notice; or
 - (b) an approval under regulation 67 of the Regulations; or
 - (c) a general exemption under regulation 71 of the Regulations.
- 6. Non-commercially produced fruit is moved in accordance with this notice if it is moved after being either cooked (boiled or microwaved), frozen or placed in a sealed plastic bag and exposed to the sun for a period of three days.
- 7. Each person who is the owner or occupier of land in the quarantine area is taken to have been given a quarantine notice that applies to that land in the terms of this quarantine area notice.
- 8. Failure to comply with this quarantine area notice could result in a fine, the Director General taking remedial action under section 133 of the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007*, or both

CEMETERIES ACT 1986

ALBANY CEMETERY BOARD BY-LAWS AMENDMENT

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by section 53 of the *Cemeteries Act 1986*, the Albany Cemetery Board hereby records having resolved on the 25th day of November 2015 to amend section 46 and 47 of the Albany Cemetery Board By-Laws of 31st day of July, 1997.

Specification of Monuments

- 46 (1) All monuments in the lawn section of a Cemetery shall—
 - (a) Be made of bronze, granite, slate or marble;
 - (b) Be placed on a concrete foundation, unless a concrete beam is already provided by the Cemetery Board;

- (c) Comply with the following specifications
 - i. The overall height of the monument above the original surface of the grave shall not exceed 1 065m
 - ii. The height of the base of the monument above the original surface of the grave shall not be less than $150 \mathrm{mm}$ nor more than $305 \mathrm{mm}$
 - iii. The length of the base of the monument shall not exceed 915mm;
 - iv. The length of the monument shall not exceed 915mm and 300mm width;
 - v. The depth of the base of the monument shall not exceed 305mm provided that—
 - A. In the case of a grant of two adjoining plots the base length shall not exceed 2135mm;
 - B. The headstone shall not exceed 2135mm and 300mm width;
 - C. In the case of Desk type monuments constructed of granite the height of the front face above lawn level should be a minimum of 150mm and a maximum of 300mm and the height of the rear face above the lawn level should be a minimum of 300mm and a maximum of 600mm with a sloping face to form a panel with an inscription thereon or to have a marble, granite or bronze tablet affixed thereto with an inscription as set out in By-Law 45.
- (d) Have concrete column foundations extending to the bottom of the grave 2134mm deep with a 75mm lintel, where there is no concrete beam.
- (2) An admiralty bronze memorial plaque may be attached to a monument erected or being erected in the lawn section of the Cemetery.
- (3) A person shall not display any trade names or marks upon any monument within the Cemetery.

AMENDMENTS TO THE NGARI CAPES MARINE PARK MANAGEMENT PLAN 2013-2023 Management Plan No. 74

The Marine Parks and Reserves Authority and the Department of Parks and Wildlife advise that proposed amendments to the *Ngari Capes Marine Park Management Plan 2013-2023, Management Plan No. 74*, are available for public comment.

The proposed amendments comprise changes to Table 8 and the associated key, to address an inconsistency between marine park zoning and the *Prohibition on Fishing (Cowaramup Bay) Order 1998*, created under Section 43 of the *Fish Resources Management Act 1994*.

The proposed amendments reflect the existing fishing arrangements at Cowaramup Bay and will result in a single set of permitted activities for the recreation zones at both Cowaramup Bay and Hamelin Bay.

The key effects of the proposed amendments will be-

- Blue swimmer (blue manna) crabs will be the only crab species permitted to be taken in the recreation zones at Hamelin Bay and Cowaramup Bay.
- Recreational specimen shell collecting (dead shells) will not be permitted in the recreation zones at Hamelin Bay and Cowaramup Bay.
- Recreational octopus fishing by any means will not be permitted in the recreation zones at Hamelin Bay and Cowaramup Bay.
