RACING AND WAGERING WESTERN AUSTRALIA ACT 2003
RACING AND WAGERING WESTERN AUSTRALIA (FOB RULES)
NOTICE (NO. 2) 2016

Made by Racing and Wagering Western Australia under section 61 of the Act.

1. Citation

This notice is the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia (FOB Rules) Notice (No. 2) 2016*.

2. Commencement

These rules came into operation on 12 June 2012.

3. Interpretation

In this notice—

“the Act” means the *Racing and Wagering Western Australia Act 2003*;

“the Rules” means the rules described in clause 4, adopted by Racing and Wagering Western Australia.

4. Rules adopted under section 61 of the Act

(1) In a meeting held on 31 May 2012, Racing and Wagering Western Australia resolved—

(a) to adopt and operate under rules relating to a jointly operated fixed odds wagering system in accordance with section 61(2) and (4) of the Act.

(2) A copy of the rules adopted was published for public information in the Special Gazette of 12 June 2012 at pp. 2413-2441.

(3) Further amendments to the Rules were adopted by resolution of the Board dated 11 October 2012, 25 March 2013, 30 August 2013, 31 October 2013, 20 December 2013, 1 May 2014, 3 September 2014, 28 November 2014, 21 September 2015, 23 November 2015 and 21 January 2016 and published for public information in the Gazettes of 23 October 2012 at pp. 5058-5060, 5 April 2013 at pp. 1490-1491, 17 September 2013 at pp. 4337-4346, 15 November 2013 at pp. 5262-5265, 10 January 2014 at pp. 24-25, 13 May 2014 at pp. 1455-1465, 12 September 2014 at pp. 3290-3291, 5 December 2014 at pp. 4523-4525, 25 September 2015 at pp. 3881-3883, 27 November at pp. 4756-4758 and 29 January 2016 at pp. 276-277.

5. Changes to Rules published for public information section 61(6)(c) of the Act

(1) Further amendments to the Rules were adopted by resolution of the Board dated 29 February 2016.

(2) Those further amendments to the Rules are published in the Schedule to this notice for public information, as required by section 61(6)(c) of the Act.

Schedule 1—Amendments to Adopted Rules

29 As regards wagers placed by Clients—

(a) Clients must be 18 years of age or older before a Client can place a wager with RWWA and RWWA does not accept wagers from any person under the age of 18 and any wager purportedly made by a person under the age of 18 is void;

(b) A wager placed by a Client can only be accepted by RWWA and subject to these Rules, RWWA reserves the right to not accept a wager in its absolute discretion; and

(c) All wagers are accepted by RWWA in Western Australia at the times as set out in these Rules and—

(i) Except in the case of “In the Run” wagering and In-Play Racing Markets, wagers may be accepted in accordance with Rules 31, 32 and 33, up to the advertised start time, actual start time, or such earlier time as dictated by RWWA.

(ii) Except in the case of “In the Run” wagering and In-Play Racing Markets, if a wager is inadvertently accepted in respect of an event after its start time, the wager shall be deemed to have been made invalidly and will be refunded to the Client. For the purpose of this clause, “inadvertently” means that RWWA had no knowledge that the event in question had started and the wager was accepted in good faith.

(iii) “In the Run” means placing a wager on a RWWA-nominated market after an event has commenced and is in progress. In such cases, once

an event has commenced, the event market will close and a new “In the Run” market will commence.

- (iv) RWWA may take “In the Run” bets on RWWA-nominated events. In such circumstances, markets may be displayed on the website as “Live Betting” and RWWA Account holders can call our office to obtain markets or place a bet via Bet-In Play. In compliance with the *Interactive Gambling Act 2001* (Cwlth) “In the Run” wagers will not be accepted over the Internet and may only be accepted over the telephone (including via Bet In-Play).
- (v) In-Play Racing Markets are promotional markets where a Client is able to place a fixed odds win bet on a horse racing event after it has begun.
- (vi) RWWA may take In-Play Racing Market bets on RWWA-nominated events over the Internet, iPhone or Android apps as specified in the In-Play Racing Markets promotional terms and conditions.

107 Starting Price Betting Rules

1. Starting Price (SP) is the official and final bookmakers’ price as transmitted by the Australian Pricing Network up until the advertised start time of the race. Where no SP is provided by the Australian Pricing Network prior to the advertised start time of the race, RWWA will settle all Starting Price wagers at the RWWA closing Fixed Odds Win price. Starting Price—is available for selected Thoroughbred Racing, Australian Harness and Australian Greyhound Racing via telephone betting, Internet, iPhone and Android app.

If a Win or a Win/Place wager is placed as the Starting Price, the Win portion will be paid at a rate equal to the official on-course Bookmakers’ starting price or, where no SP is provided by the Australian Pricing Network prior to the advertised start time of the race, at the RWWA closing Fixed Odds Win price
