BIOSECURITY AND AGRICULTURE MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS 2013

QUARANTINE AREA NOTICE—*BACTERICERA COCKERELLI* (TOMATO POTATO PSYLLID OR TPP)

Perth Metropolitan Area and Specified Adjacent Districts

1. Under regulation 60 of the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Regulations 2013* (Regulations) the Perth metropolitan area, being the Perth Statistical Division according to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, together with the local government districts of Augusta-Margaret River (S), Beverley (S), Boddington (S), Boyup Brook (S), Bridgetown-Greenbushes (S), Brookton (S), Bunbury (C), Busselton (C), Capel (S), Carnamah (S), Chittering (S), Collie (S), Coorow (S), Cranbrook (S), Cuballing (S), Dandaragan (S), Dardanup (S), Denmark (S), Donnybrook-Balingup (S), Gingin (S), Harvey (S), Kojonup (S), Mandurah (C), Manjimup (S), Moora (S), Murray (S), Nannup (S), Narrogin (S), Northam (S), Pingelly (S), Plantagenet (S), Toodyay (S), Victoria Plains (S), Wagin (S), Wandering (S), Waroona (S), West Arthur (S), Wickepin (S), Williams (S) Woodanilling (S) and York (S) is declared to constitute a quarantine area until 30 June 2019.

2. This quarantine area is declared because the declared pest Tomato Potato Psyllid (TPP) (*Bactericera cockerelli*) is present or reasonably suspected to be present in or in the vicinity of the area.

3. Persons other than inspectors must not move, or cause or allow to be moved, any host plants produced within the quarantine area to a place within the local government districts of Ravensthorpe (S), Gnowangerup (S), Jerramungup (S), Irwin (S), Northampton (S), Carnarvon (S), Greater Geraldton (C), Chapman Valley (S), Wyndham-East Kimberley (S), Albany (C), Broomhill-Tambellup (S), Morawa (S), Shark Bay (S), Three Springs (S), Broome (S), Esperance (S) or Mingenew (S) except in accordance with—

- (a) this notice; or
- (b) an approval under regulation 67 of the Regulations; or
- (c) a general exemption under regulation 71 of the Regulations.

4. Host plants produced within the quarantine area are moved in accordance with this notice if the host plants are—

- prepared as required by (a) or (b) below with the treatment being completed no more than 36 hours prior to movement; and
- records of the treatment, together with details of transporters and consignees are kept.

(a) For tomato, capsicum, chilli and eggplant plants—

- Sprayed with 300mL/ha of the 18g/L active of abamectin (Permit # 14722) or 20mL/100L of the 250g/L active of bifenthrin (Permit # 9795); or
- Sprayed with 40mL/100L of the 240g/L active of spirotetramat (Movento 240 SC label) and
- 24 hours later, sprayed with 200mL/100L of the 225g/L active of methomyl. Note: DO NOT use methomyl in protected cropping situations, such as glasshouses, greenhouses, plastic houses, plastic tunnels or shadehouses.

(b) For host plant ornamentals and host plant nursery stock—

- Sprayed with 25 mL product per 100 L of the 80g/L active of bifenthrin (APMVA Permit # 10043) or 50mL/100L to a maximum of 1.5L for 18g/L abamectin (the registered rate for two spotted mite on ornamentals); or
- Sprayed with 40mL/100L of the 240g/L active of spirotetramat (APVMA permit #81707); and
- 24 hours later, sprayed with 200mL/100L of the 225g/L active of methomyl (Permit # 82428). Note: DO NOT use methomyl in protected cropping situations, such as glasshouses, greenhouses, plastic houses, plastic tunnels or shade-houses.

5. If not prepared in accordance with clause 4 host plants may be moved from the quarantine area if—

- prepared in an approved manner published on the department's website; or
- certified by an inspector as having been prepared in accordance with the directions of an inspector.

6. Each person who is the owner or occupier of land in the quarantine area is taken to have been given a quarantine notice that applies to that land in the terms of this quarantine area notice.

7. Failure to comply with this quarantine area notice could result in a fine, the Director General taking remedial action under section 133 of the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007*, or both.

All plants in the Solanaceae and Convolvulaceae families, including but not limited to—

BUSH FIRES ACT 1954*City of Greater Geraldton*

2018-2019 FIREBREAK NOTICE

Definitions**Building Protection Zone** is an area—

- with a minimum clearance distance in all directions from the walls of structures of at least 20 metres on flat land, and increases in all directions by 10 metres for every 10 degrees increase in slope
- in which all flammable material is removed within the clearance distance
- which accommodates a turning area for a fire vehicle (which is capable of carrying at least 400L of water and is fitted with a pump and at least 15 metres of hose with a minimum diameter of 19mm, capable of delivering water through an adjustable nozzle)
- which complies with the provisions of a Local Government adopted Town Planning Scheme (TPS) clause with respect to that property and the effect is such that the requirement under the TPS stipulates a greater area clear of flammable material or low fuel zone than the minimum clearance distance above

Bush—Bush includes trees, bushes, plants, stubble, scrub, and undergrowth of all kinds whatsoever whether alive or dead and whether standing or not standing and also a part of a tree, bush, plant or undergrowth.

Flammable Material—All combustible material, dead or alive, in isolation, clusters or aggregation with other combustible materials that, in the opinion of a Fire Control Officer, is likely to fuel a fire.

It includes, but is not limited to—

Dead leaves, either on the ground or in gutters, fallen branches, long dry grass and weeds;

Dry vegetative matter on mineral earth firebreaks; and

Any tree within the Building Protection Zone or branch of a tree that may fall onto a building or, in the opinion of a City Fire Control Officer, constitute a fire risk.

It does not include—

Vegetable patches, tended firewood stacks and timber, landscaped gardens, isolated planted shrubs

Slashed, mowed or mulched dry vegetative material that is less than 7.5cm in height

Established natural or planted trees or patches of vegetation that in the opinion of a Fire Control Officer is not an unacceptable risk

A distinct cluster of vegetation remote from boundaries and assets that in the opinion of

Haystacks—The definition of a haystack is any quantity of fodder in excess of five (5) tonnes.

Mineral Earth—A mineral earth firebreak refers to the area being completely clear of everything but soil (bare earth)—can generally be achieved by ploughing or grading or early spraying that allows sufficient time for decomposition of dead grass/vegetation.

City of Greater Geraldton Firebreak and Fire Prevention Order

As a measure to assist in the control of bush fire, or to prevent the spread or escalation of a bush fire which may occur, all owners and occupiers of land within the City of Greater Geraldton local government area are required by 5 October 2018 to clear firebreaks or take measures in accordance with this notice and maintain those firebreaks and measures in accordance with this notice up to and including 1 May 2019.

Pursuant to the powers contained in Section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, you are hereby required to undertake fire prevention measures as prescribed in Firebreak Standards (Firebreak Minimum Standards) of this publication.

In addition to the requirements of this Notice, the City may issue separate special orders to owners or occupiers if additional hazard reduction is considered necessary.

Firebreak Minimum Standards

Small lots (under 0.4ha)—regardless of whether the land is vacant or has a building

5 October 2018 to 1 May 2019—

- All blocks must have flammable material mowed or slashed to a maximum height of 7.5cm
Ploughing or rotary hoeing is not permitted
- All vacant land must have wattle bush removed, unless written application is made prior to 15 September and approved (see 'Variation to Firebreaks')
- All developed land must have wattle bush maintained
- All structures and buildings must have a minimum of 3 metres clearance of all flammable material

Residential and Special Rural/Rural Residential/Rural Smallholding lots between 0.4 and 5ha

5 October 2018 to 1 May 2019—

- All structures and buildings must have a minimum of 3 metre clearance of all flammable material. Structures include private power poles
- Firebreaks must be mineral earth (bare earth); and
- Be a minimum of 3 metres wide and 4 metres high

or

- All structures and buildings must have a minimum of 3 metre clearance of all flammable material. Structures include private power poles
- Have all flammable material graded, mowed or slashed to a maximum height of 7.5cm over the entire property (excluding managed vegetation such as ornamental trees, distinct islands of vegetation remote from boundaries and assets).

Broadacre farming or lots over 5ha

5 October 2018 to 1 May 2019—

- All structures and buildings must have a minimum of 3 metres clearance of all flammable material. Structures include power poles (private).
- Firebreaks must be a minimum of 3 metres in width and have a minimum overhead clearance of 4 metres.
- Mineral earth firebreaks installed within 20 metres inside and along the whole external boundary of land held in contiguous ownership up to a maximum of 200ha.

Fuel and/or Gas Depots

Owners or occupiers of land on which any storage container is used to contain liquid fuel or gas, including land on which any ramp or supports are constructed shall have a 5 metre flammable material-free area surrounding the container.

Homesteads, building, haystacks, stacks of fodder, bulk fuel, drums and liquid petroleum

During the period of 1 October 2018 to 1 May 2019 (inclusive), owners and occupiers of land must have a minimum of 3 metre wide firebreaks completely surrounding the perimeter of any homestead, building, fuel installation (incl. drums) or group of such structures. This includes haystacks if situated within 200 metres of any homestead, building or fuel installation.

Sunday harvesting (Mullewa only)

Sunday harvesting is permitted up to the last Sunday prior to Christmas Day.

Traditional non-harvest days (Greater Geraldton)

The operation of harvesting machines and the movement of grain equipment on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day is prohibited.

Barbecues and Camp Fires

- Gas and electric barbecues are permitted at your home or you can utilise City-provided electric barbecues where installed (see www.cgg.wa.gov.au/play/sports-recreation/parks.aspx)
- Solid fuel barbecues are prohibited if the Bureau of Meteorology forecasts a Fire Danger Rating of Very High or higher on the day of the proposed barbecue
- Camping and cooking fires are prohibited in all recreation, reserves and parklands within the City of Greater Geraldton, except on City-provided facilities in designated areas

Key Dates

- **15 September 2018**—Deadline for applying (in writing) for variation on fire breaks.
- **5 October 2018**—All fire prevention measures must be completed and then maintained until 1 May 2019 (or within 14 days of becoming the owner or occupier, should this be after that date).
- **6 October 2018**—Fire prevention work inspections carried out by City officers—Infringements for non-compliance may be issued.
- **1 May 2019**—End of firebreaks and fire prevention maintenance period.

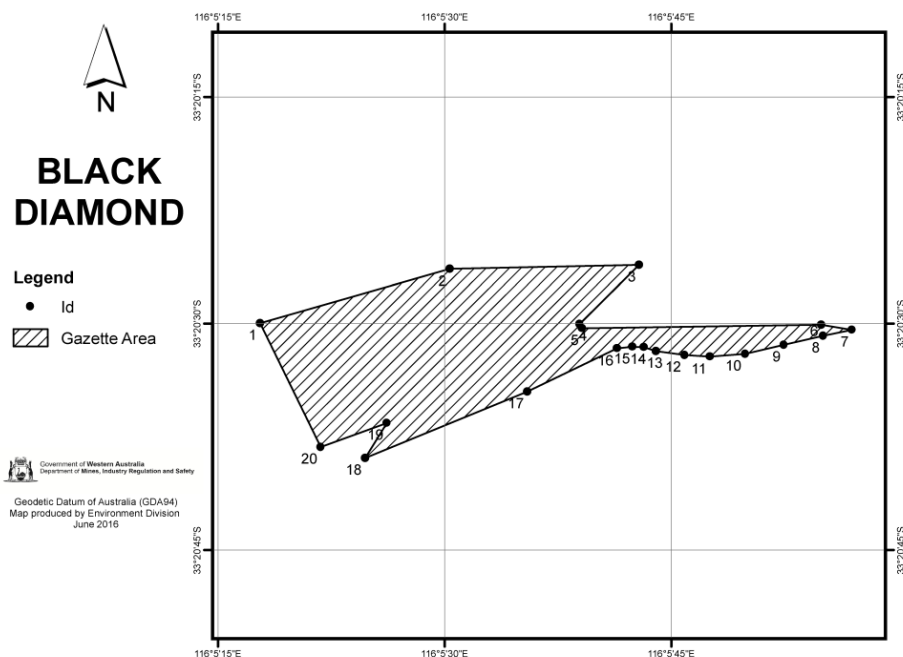
