### Family Court Amendment Regulations 2018

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

**1. Citation**

These regulations are the *Family Court Amendment Regulations 2018*.

**2. Commencement**

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

**3. Regulations amended**

These regulations amend the *Family Court Regulations 1998*.

**4. Regulation 21I amended**

- (1) In regulation 21I(1) delete the definition of *relevant period* and insert:

*relevant period* means a financial year beginning on or after 1 July 2018.

- (2) In regulation 21I(2) delete “1 July 2016, and on each second” and insert:

1 July 2019, and on each

### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

*City of South Perth*

#### STANDING ORDERS AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2018

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the City of South Perth resolved on 31 July 2018 to make the following local law.

##### 1. Citation

This local law may be cited as the *City of South Perth Standing Orders Amendment Local Law 2018*.

##### 2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

##### 3. Principal local law amended

The *City of South Perth Standing Orders Local Law 2007* as published in the *Government Gazette* on 17 May 2007 and as amended on 9 July 2010, 5 October 2012 and 5 May 2017 is referred to as the principal local law. The principal local law is amended.

##### 4. Clause 1.4 amended

In clause 1.4 insert the following definition in alphabetical order—

“**agenda briefing**” means an agenda briefing that is open to the public and that has been called by the Mayor or the Chief Executive Officer in accordance with a decision of Council’;

##### 5. Clause 6.12A added

After clause 6.12 insert the following—

###### 6.12A Deputations

- (1) Subject to clause 6.12, unless otherwise determined by the Presiding Member, deputations are only permitted to be heard at agenda briefings.
- (2) A person, or a group of people not exceeding five persons, may apply in writing to be received by the Council to present a deputation to Council on an item on the agenda for an ordinary council meeting, by completing and submitting, at least 24 hours before the scheduled agenda briefing, a conforming ‘Request for a Deputation to Address Council’ form.
- (3) The Presiding Member may approve or deny a request to present a deputation.
- (4) Unless otherwise determined by the Presiding Member—
  - (a) if a request to present a deputation by a group of people is accepted by the Presiding Member, only two of the members of the group may deliver the deputation; and
  - (b) a deputation must not exceed 10 minutes.
- (5) The Presiding Member, in his or her absolute discretion, will determine the order in which deputations are to be heard.

##### 6. Clause 6.12(1) replaced

Clause 6.12(1) is deleted and replaced with the following—

- (1) Where an item on the agenda at a Council meeting is contentious and is likely to be the subject of a number of deputations at an agenda briefing, the Council may resolve to meet at another time to provide a greater opportunity to be heard.

##### 7. Clause 6.16 replaced

Clause 6.16 is deleted and replaced with the following—

###### 6.1 Prevention of disturbance

- (1) A reference in this clause to a person is to a person other than a member.
- (2) A person addressing the Council shall extend due courtesy and respect to the Council and the processes under which it operates and shall comply with any direction by the Presiding Member.

- (3) A person present or observing at a meeting shall not create a disturbance or engage in inappropriate or disruptive behaviour at a meeting, including but not limited to the following behaviour—
  - (a) interrupting or interfering with the proceedings, whether by expressing approval or dissent, by conversing or by any other means;
  - (b) booing or making other offensive noises;
  - (c) expressing contemptuous laughter or making derisive comments at decisions or during debate;
  - (d) refusing to give up the floor to allow other members of the public to ask questions, or demanding to ask questions before others in contradiction of an order by the Presiding Member;
  - (e) using abusive, inflammatory and / or derogatory language when addressing Council with a question or making a statement;
  - (f) asking unnecessary repetitive questions; or
  - (g) behaving aggressively or in a threatening manner towards either elected members, council staff or members of the public.
- (4) A person shall ensure that his or her mobile telephone or audible pager is not switched on or used during any meeting of the Council or a committee.
- (5) The Presiding Member may warn a person who fails to comply with this clause.
- (6) If—
  - (a) after being warned, the person again acts contrary to this clause, or to these Standing Orders; or
  - (b) a person refuses or fails to comply with a direction by the Presiding Member,the Presiding Member may expel the person from the meeting by ordering him or her to leave the meeting room.
- (7) A person who is ordered to leave the meeting room and fails to do so may, by order of the Presiding Member, be removed from the meeting room and, if the Presiding Member orders, from the premises.

#### **8. Clause 10.1A inserted**

Clause 10.1A is deleted and replaced with the following—

##### **10.1A Alternative motions**

- (1) Members are to submit any proposed alternative motion to an officer recommendation that is contained in an officer report, to the CEO by 12 noon on the day before each Council meeting, so that the alternative motion can be distributed to other elected members to give them an opportunity to reflect on the proposed alternative motion.
- (2) An alternative motion submitted under subclause (1) must not conflict with the stated purpose of a Council meeting.
- (3) An alternative motion must relate to the subject matter of the officer recommendation, but may suggest a course of action different from the course of action stated in the officer recommendation.

#### **9. Clause 10.10 amended**

In clause 10.10, ‘, rearrange’ is added after ‘delete’.

#### **10. Clause 10.11 replaced**

Clause 10.11 is deleted and replaced with the following—

##### **10.1 Unacceptable amendments**

An amendment to a substantive motion must not—

- (a) be intended to defeat the substantive motion it seeks to amend;
- (b) negate or contradict the substantive motion or the intent of the substantive motion it seeks to amend;
- (c) be intended to prevent the meeting coming to a decision on the matter the subject of the substantive motion;
- (d) raise a point already disposed of by an earlier vote at the meeting; or
- (e) be inconsistent with an amendment already agreed to when voted on.

**LG501****BUSH FIRES ACT 1954***Shire of Gingin***FIREBREAK ORDER 2018-2019**

Notice is hereby given to all landowners/occupiers within the Shire of Gingin that bare earth cleared firebreaks must be installed and maintained from 1 November 2018 until 31 May 2019.

**80,000m<sup>2</sup> (20 acres / 8 hectares) or larger**

Install and maintain a bare earth cleared firebreak, for a width of not less than three metres (3m), within the first five metres (5m) of the external boundaries of the property.

Trees must be trimmed back to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum four metres (4m) to allow fire appliances to drive along the firebreak.

Install and maintain a twenty metre (20m) Asset Protection Zone around all buildings, large hay stacks and fuel storage areas.

**Land larger than 4,000m<sup>2</sup> (1 acre) and less than or equal to 80,000m<sup>2</sup> (20 acres / 8 hectares)**

Install and maintain a bare earth cleared firebreak, for a width of not less than three metres (3m), within the first five metres (5m) of the external boundaries of the property.

Trees must be trimmed back to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum four metres (4m) to allow fire appliances to drive along the firebreak.

On heavily grassed blocks a further five metre (5m) firebreak is required to be slashed to less than fifty millimetres (50mm).

Install and maintain a twenty metre (20m) Asset Protection Zone around all buildings, large hay stacks and fuel storage areas.

**Land less than or equal to 4,000m<sup>2</sup> (1 acre)**

Slash the grass on the entire property to a height of less than fifty millimetres (50mm) and remove all dead flammable material;

Or

Install and maintain a bare earth cleared firebreak, for a width of not less than three metres (3m), as close as possible to the external boundaries of the property.

Trees must be trimmed back to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum four metres (4m) to allow fire appliances to drive along the firebreak.

On heavily grassed blocks a further five metre (5m) firebreak is required to be slashed to less than fifty millimetres (50mm).

**ALTERNATIVE ALIGNMENTS (VARIATION)**

If it is impractical to have a firebreak immediately inside a boundary for environmental or any other reason(s), you are required to notify the Shire of Gingin in writing in order to obtain permission for firebreaks to be installed in an alternative position. Once approval is granted, there is no need to re-apply each year unless circumstances change.

Parcels of land that are *contiguously rated* do not require a variation and a shared firebreak may be installed around the boundary of all these lots.

Land in sub-divisions or developments needs to have a firebreak installed in each individual lot unless a variation has been approved.

**PLANTATIONS****Tree plantations of less than three hectares (3ha)**

Construct a ten metre (10m) wide bare earth cleared firebreak immediately surrounding the plantation (adjacent areas of the same property subject to provisions as for Rural Areas).

**Plantations larger than three hectares (3ha)**

Construct a fifteen metre (15m) wide bare earth cleared firebreak immediately surrounding the plantation (adjacent areas of the same property subject to provisions as for Rural Areas).

Internal firebreaks are required to be six metre (6m) bare earth cleared surrounding compartments of no larger than thirty hectares (30ha).

Trees must be trimmed back to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum four metres (4m) to allow fire appliances to drive along all firebreaks.

A minimum water supply of 25,000 litres for every fifty hectares (50ha) of plantation must be maintained, with a hardstand area provided for fire appliances to park when drawing water. Water sources must be located to allow for a maximum refill turnaround of 20 minutes from any area in the plantation.

**HARVEST/MOVEMENT OF VEHICLE BANS**

A ban on harvesting and the movement of vehicles in paddocks (except for the watering of stock) is likely to be imposed when the predicted weather conditions are classified by the Bureau of Meteorology as very high or extreme.

**ADDITIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND PENALTIES**

Persons who fail to comply with the requirements of this Order may be fined up to \$10,000. In addition, the Shire may arrange for the required work to be carried out at the cost of the owner or occupier.

Gas or electric barbecues **ONLY** are permitted during Prohibited Burning Periods. No solid fuel or wood barbecues are allowed. Camping and cooking fires are prohibited during Restricted Burning Periods unless a valid permit has been issued by a Shire of Gingin Fire Control Officer.

A Permit to Burn must be obtained during Restricted Burning Periods. Permits are generally subject to a number of conditions but are **NOT** valid for burning on Sundays or Public Holidays unless approved by the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer. Permits to Burn must be obtained to burn any garden refuse during Restricted Burning Periods.

Prior to any burning, you are required to notify your neighbours, Fire Control Officer, DFES Communications Centre and the Shire of Gingin.

Besides being responsible for the safety of your own property, if a fire escapes from your property you may be liable to pay compensation for any damage caused outside your property—this could be very costly.

Public infrastructure must not be placed in a manner that results in an above-ground encroachment into the firebreak area. Trees must not be planted in a manner that results in vegetation encroaching into the firebreak area.

## **BURNING PERIODS**

### **Restricted Burning Period**

Permit to burn required from a Fire Control Officer.

- 1 October 2018 to 21 November 2018
- 1 March 2019 to 31 May 2019

### **Prohibited Burning Period**

- 22 November 2018 to 28 February 2019

**NO BURNING WITHOUT EXCEPTION**

Shire of Gingin Fire Control Officers are authorised to issue Permits to Burn on private land during the Restricted Burning Period. Fire Control Officers are also empowered to enter land and issue directives relating to fire suppression and control.
