Conservation and Land Management Act 1984

### Conservation and Land Management Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2018

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

#### 1. Citation

These regulations are the *Conservation and Land Management Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 2018*.

#### 2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on 1 September 2018.

#### 3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the *Conservation and Land Management Regulations 2002*.

Supreme Court Act 1935

### Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 3) 2018

Made by the judges of the Supreme Court.

**1. Citation**

These rules are the *Supreme Court Amendment Rules (No. 3) 2018*.

**2. Commencement**

- (b) the rest of the rules — on the day on which the *Corruption, Crime and Misconduct and Criminal Property Confiscation Amendment Act 2018* section 8 comes into operation.
