### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

*Shire of Northam*

#### ACTIVITIES IN THOROUGHFARES AND PUBLIC PLACES AND TRADING AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2018

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Northam resolved by Absolute Majority on 19 September 2018 to make the following local law.

#### 1. Citation

This local law may be cited as *the Shire of Northam Activities In Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading 2nd Amendment Local Law 2018*.

#### 2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation 14 days after the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

#### 3. Principal local law

(1) In this local law the *Shire of Northam Activities On Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Local Law 2008* as published in the *Government Gazette* on 16 September 2008, is referred to as the Principal Local Law and as previously amended and published in the *Government Gazette* 27 February 2018.

(2) This local law further amends the Principal local law.

### HEALTH (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT 1911 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

*Shire of Narembeen*

#### ANIMALS, ENVIRONMENT AND NUISANCE AMENDMENT LOCAL LAW 2018

Under the powers conferred by section 342 of the *Health (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1911* and Subdivisions 1 and 2 of Division 2 of Part 3 of the *Local Government Act 1995* and under all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Shire of Narembeen resolved on the 15th day of August 2018 to make the following local law.

#### 1. Citation

This local law may be cited as the *Shire of Narembeen Animals, Environment and Nuisance Amendment Local Law 2018*.

#### 2. Commencement

This local law comes into operation on the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

#### 3. Principal local law

This local law amends the *Shire of Narembeen Animals, Environment and Nuisance Local Law 2016* as published in the *Government Gazette* on 25 January 2017.

#### 4. Title amended

The title is amended as follows—

- (a) in the title of the local law, after “**HEALTH**” insert “**(MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS)**”; and
- (b) in the enacting clause, after “Health” insert “*(Miscellaneous Provisions)*”.

#### 5. Clause 1.4 amended

Clause 1.4(1) is amended as follows—

- (a) insert the following definition in alphabetical order—  
**Association** has the meaning given to it in the *Associations Incorporation Act 2015*;  
**qualified person** is a person who holds either the Item 1 License or an Item 4 License as prescribed in “Table 131—Licensees and entitlements” of the *Ozone Protection and Synthetic Greenhouse Gas Management Regulations 1995* (Cth);
- (b) in the definition for **affiliated person** delete “club” and insert “association”;
- (c) in the definition for **authorised person** after “this local law” insert “, and an EHO”;
- (d) delete the definition for **EHO** and replace with the following—  
“**EHO** means a person designated by the local government as an authorised officer under section 24 of the *Public Health Act 2016*”; and
- (e) in the definition for “**premises**” after “*Health*” insert “*(Miscellaneous Provisions)*”.

**6. Clause 2.12 amended**

(1) In clause 2.12(3)(b)(ii)—

- (a) delete “but” after “thoroughfare” and replace with “where”; and
- (b) after “the” and before “vegetation”, insert “provision of”.

(2) In clause 2.12(5), delete “(3)” after “in clause” and replace with “(4)”.

**7. Clause 2.15 amended**

Clause 2.15(1)(b) is amended as follows—

- (a) delete clause reference “(iii)” and replace with “(c)”;
- (b) delete clause reference “(iv)” and replace with “(d)”;
- (c) align paragraph “(c)” and “(d)” with paragraphs “(a)” and “(b)”.

**8. Clause 2.26 amended**

In clause 2.26(2) after “*Health*” insert “(*Miscellaneous Provisions*)”.

**9. Clause 2.28 amended**

In clause 2.28(1) after “*Health*” insert “(*Miscellaneous Provisions*)”.

**10. Clause 3.5 amended**

In clause 3.5(a) delete “Department of Environment Regulation” and replace with “Department of Water and Environmental Regulation”.

**11. Clause 3.9 amended**

Delete clause 3.9 and replace with—

**3.9 Disposing of disused refrigerators or similar containers**

A person shall not place, leave or dispose of a disused refrigerator, ice chest, ice box, trunk, chest or other similar article having a compartment which has a capacity of 0.04 cubic metres or more on any land without first arranging for the removal of any refrigerants by a qualified person, and—

- (a) removing every door and lid and every lock, catch and hinge attached to a door or lid; or
- (b) rendering every door and lid incapable of being fastened.

**12. Clause 4.12 amended**

Clause 4.12 is amended as follows—

- (a) delete 4.12(1); and
- (b) in clause 4.12(2) delete clause reference “(2)” and realign that clause text under the clause 4.12 title.

**13. Schedule 1—Prescribed offences**

Schedule 1 is amended as follows—

## **Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Amendment Regulations 2018**

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

### **1. Citation**

These regulations are the *Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Amendment Regulations 2018*.

### **2. Commencement**

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on 1 October 2018.

### **3. Regulations amended**

These regulations amend the *Building and Construction Industry Training Fund and Levy Collection Regulations 1991*.

### **4. Regulation 3 amended**

- (1) In regulation 3(1):
  - (a) after each of paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) delete “or”;
  - (b) in paragraph (d) delete “work.” and insert:

  - (c) after paragraph (d) insert:  
  
(e) resources operational work.
- (2) In regulation 3(2) insert in alphabetical order:  
  
*geosequestration process* means a process that is —
  - (a) for the injection of carbon dioxide into a natural underground reservoir; and
  - (b) associated with a resources operation;



**residential or commercial facility** means a structure, fixture, works, plant or equipment used or intended to be used predominantly for or in connection with any of the following —

- (a) residential accommodation;
- (b) office accommodation;
- (c) a kitchen or dining facility;
- (d) a recreational facility;
- (e) a toilet or ablution facility;
- (f) a medical facility;
- (g) a laboratory;
- (h) a workshop;
- (i) a fuel depot;
- (j) a warehouse;

**resources** means any of the following —

- (a) minerals as defined in the *Mining Act 1978* section 8(1);
- (b) petroleum as defined in the *Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources Act 1967* section 5(1);
- (c) geothermal energy resources as defined in the *Petroleum and Geothermal Energy Resources Act 1967* section 5(1);

**resources facility** means any of the following or a part of any of the following —

- (a) a structure, fixture or works for or in connection with a resources operation;
- (b) plant or equipment in, on or associated with a structure, fixture or works referred to in paragraph (a);

**resources operation** means —

- (a) an operation to explore or drill for, extract, recover, process, treat or refine resources; or
- (b) an operation to handle, store or transport —
  - (i) resources; or
  - (ii) products of an operation referred to in paragraph (a);

**resources operational work** means any of the following work (unless the work is on, results in, or otherwise relates to, a residential or commercial facility) —

- (a) work associated with exploration or drilling for resources;
- (b) work associated with exploration or drilling for the purposes of a geosequestration process;

- (c) work on or resulting in an unsealed haul road or track that is associated with a resources operation;
  - (d) work on or resulting in a structure that is —
    - (i) for the storage, treatment, supply or disposal of non-potable water; and
    - (ii) associated with a resources operation;
  - (e) work on or resulting in a structure that is —
    - (i) for the storage of tailings, overburden or waste; and
    - (ii) associated with a resources operation;
  - (f) work for the excavation or back-filling of soil or overburden that is associated with a resources operation;
  - (g) work for the environmental remediation, restoration or rehabilitation of ground disturbed by a resources operation;
  - (h) work for the closure or decommissioning of 1 or more resources facilities (including work associated with environmental remediation, restoration or rehabilitation);
  - (i) work for the repair or maintenance of 1 or more resources facilities;
  - (j) work for any of the following if the value in aggregate of the work, estimated in accordance with subregulation (3), is \$10 million or less —
    - (i) the alteration or renovation of 1 or more resources facilities;
    - (ii) the replacement of 1 or more resources facilities that have been, are being or are to be closed or decommissioned;
    - (iii) the relocation of 1 or more resources facilities;
    - (iv) any combination of the activities referred to in subparagraphs (i) to (iii).
- (3) In regulation 3(2) in the definition of **government work** paragraph (b)(ii) delete “authority.” and insert:
- authority;
- (4) After regulation 3(2) insert:
- (3) Schedule 2 of the Act applies for the purposes of estimating the value of work referred to in

paragraph (j) of the definition of *resources operational work* in subregulation (2) as if references to construction work were references to that work.

To assist in the control of bushfires, and/or prevent the spread, or extension of a bushfire which may occur, all owners and/or occupiers of land within the City of Joondalup's district are required before the 31st day of October in each year, or within 14 days of becoming the owner or occupier of land if after that date, to remove from the land all flammable material and/or clear firebreaks in accordance with the following land areas and thereafter to maintain that land and firebreaks up to or including 31 May in the following year.

**Terms and Definitions**

- **Flammable Material**—means any plant, tree, grass, substance, object, thing or material that may or is likely to catch fire and burn or any other thing deemed by an authorised officer to be capable of combustion.
- **Firebreak**—means an area constructed to a trafficable surface that is kept and maintained totally clear of all flammable material.
- **Trafficable**—means to be able to travel from one point to another in a four-wheel drive fire appliance on a clear surface, unhindered without any obstruction that may endanger such fire appliances.

Pursuant to the provisions contained in section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, the City of Joondalup sets out the following specifications—

**Vacant land with an area of less than 2,000m<sup>2</sup>/0.2ha**

- A firebreak, not less than 2m wide, must be cleared immediately inside and around all external boundaries of the land.
- All tree branches and shrubs that over-hang a firebreak must be trimmed back to a minimum height of 3m above ground level.
- After mowing or slashing is carried out, the height of the vegetation must not exceed 50mm over the entire area of the firebreak.

**All land with an area of 2,000m<sup>2</sup>/0.2ha or more**

- A firebreak, not less than 3m wide, must be cleared immediately inside and around all external boundaries of the land.
- All tree branches and shrubs that over-hang a firebreak must be trimmed back to a minimum height of 4m above ground level.
- After mowing or slashing is carried out, the height of the vegetation must not exceed 50mm over the entire area of the firebreak.

**Land with buildings and with an area of 2000m<sup>2</sup>/0.2ha or more**

- A firebreak, not less than 3m wide, must be cleared around all structures and immediately inside and around all external boundaries of the land.
- All tree branches and shrubs that over-hang a firebreak must be trimmed back to a minimum height of 4m above ground level.
- After mowing or slashing is carried out, the height of the vegetation must not exceed 50mm over the entire area of the firebreak.
- All buildings, including roofs, gutters and walls on the land must be free of flammable material.

**Alternative Firebreaks**

If a firebreak is impractical along your boundary for environmental or other reasons, property owners should notify the City in writing by 15 October to obtain permission for firebreaks in alternative positions or of a different nature. The above firebreak requirements will continue to apply to your property until and unless the City approves alternative firebreaks in writing.

**Additional Works to Reduce Hazards**

Regardless of land size and location, the City of Joondalup may require a property owner to undertake additional works on their property to improve access and/or undertake further works where in the opinion of the City, these works would be conducive to preventing the outbreak and/or spread or extension of a bushfire.

**Prohibited and Restricted Burning Times**

The prohibited burning period for the City of Joondalup, pursuant to section 17 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* shall be between 15 December to 31 March inclusive each year.

The restricted burning period for the City of Joondalup, pursuant to section 18 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* shall be all year round from 1 January to 31 December.

**Permit to Burn**

Burning is not permitted during the City of Joondalup's Prohibited Burning Times.

A permit to burn is required during the City of Joondalup's Restricted Burning Times.

Permit to burn applications must be made in writing and will be assessed on an individual basis. The City is under no obligation to issue a permit to burn.

**Total Fire Ban and Fire Danger Rating**

No fire of any kind may be lit on a day when the Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) has declared a Total Fire Ban (TFB) and/or on a day when the forecast Fire Danger Rating (FDR) for the City of Joondalup is Very High or above.

**Penalties**

Failure to comply with this Firebreak Notice can result in fines up to \$250 and in the case of major offences may result in Court action with fines up to \$5,000.
