EXOTIC DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT 1993
CONTROL ORDER NO. 1/2020

This Control Order is in relation to the Controlled Area described in Controlled Area Order No. 1/2020 dated 29 May 2020.

Under this Control Order, no person shall move canines out of the Controlled Area unless in accordance with the following conditions or as approved by an officer under the *Exotic Diseases of Animals Act 1993*—

- Prior to moving a canine out of the Controlled Area, the person responsible for that canine must provide the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) with notification of that proposed movement.

- A canine being moved out of the Controlled Area must be clinically healthy.
- A tick treatment must be applied no more than 7 days prior to moving a canine out of the Controlled Area. The tick treatment must be registered for *Rhipicephalus sanguineus* (brown dog tick).
- A record of the treatment for *Rhipicephalus sanguineus* (brown dog tick) must be maintained, for a period of 6 months, by the person responsible for moving the canine out of the Controlled Area.
- The person responsible for a canine must notify DPIRD, if the canine becomes unwell following movement out of the Controlled Area.

This order continues to have effect until Controlled Area Order No. 1/2020 is revoked.

APPROVED TOWN PLANNING SCHEME AMENDMENT

City of Armadale

Town Planning Scheme No. 4—Amendment No. 100

Ref: TPS/2417

It is hereby notified for public information, in accordance with section 87 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* that the Minister for Planning approved the City of Armadale Town Planning Scheme amendment on 7 May 2020 for the purpose of—

- A. Amending the upper Residential Density Coding of various lots from R40 to R60, as shown on the Scheme Amendment Map;
 - B. Modifying the TPS No. 4 Text, Part 4—General Development Requirements, as follows—
 - (i) In clause 4.2.4(b), replacing ‘ R25/40 or R15/60 ’ with ‘ or R25/40 ’;
 - (ii) In clause 4.2.4(b)(i), inserting ‘, adequate waste collection’ following the word ‘drainage’;
 - (iii) Adding clause 4.2.4(c) as follows—
 - (c) Where land is identified on the Scheme Map as R15/60 or R25/60
 - (i) up to R60 where—
 - (a) the provisions of Clause 4.2.4(b)(i) and (ii) are satisfied and street trees retained;
 - (b) the lot/development site has a minimum area of 1,400m² and a minimum frontage of 25 metres;
 - (c) where the development is for Grouped Dwellings, a minimum of 75% of dwellings comprise at least two storeys with at least one habitable room on the second floor; and
 - (d) existing trees with a trunk circumference of 0.6m or greater at a height of 1m from the natural level of the ground are retained, where possible.
 - (ii) up to R80 for multiple dwellings only where—
 - (a) the provisions of Clause 4.2.4(b)(i) and (ii) are satisfied and street trees retained;
 - (b) the lot/development site has a minimum area of 2,000m² and a minimum frontage of 25 metres; and
 - (c) existing trees with a trunk circumference of 0.6m or greater at a height of 1m from the natural level of the ground are retained, where possible.
- Where the development under Clause 4.2.4(c)(i) and (ii) is for Multiple Dwellings, for each Multiple Dwelling positioned above another, a minimum of 50% of the plot ratio area must be vertically above the lower dwelling.’
- (iv) In clause 4.2.5(a), replacing ‘or R17.5/25’ with ‘, R17.5/25 or R80’; and
 - (v) In clause 4.2.5(b), replacing ‘, R25/40 and R15/60 subject to the application of Clause 4.2.4(b).’ with ‘or R25/40 subject to the application of Clause 4.2.4(b), or for land identified on the Scheme Map as R15/60 or R25/60 subject to Clause 4.2.4(c)(i).’

Withdrawal of Notice—Closed Waters to Boating from 27 March 2020

Thomson Bay, Rottnest Island

Closure of Waters—Fuel Jetty Reconstruction

Thomson Bay, Rottnest Island

Friday 5th June 2020 to Monday 30th November 2020

Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by Regulation 38B of the *Rottnest Island Authority Regulations 1988*, the Rottnest Island Authority (RIA) hereby closes the following waters to all vessels, excluding bona fide emergency vessels and any vessel associated with the construction of the jetty, between Friday 5 June 2020 and Monday 30 November 2020.

Thomson Bay

All the waters enclosed within 10 metres of the existing Rottnest Island Fuel Jetty which are bound by a point on the foreshore 31°59.776'S 115°32.518'E eastwards to a point 31°59.782'S 115°32.592'E then south to a point 31°59.807'S 115°32.589'E then west to a point on the foreshore 31°59.811'S 115°32.522'E.

Mariners are advised that works to rebuild the Rottnest Island Fuel Jetty will be undertaken during this period and the Fuel Jetty is closed to all vessels.

Works include crane operation and pile driving activities from a construction barge and support vessels as required.

The construction barge will typically deploy 4 anchors which extend beyond the construction barge 7 metres for every 1 metre of water depth. Each anchor will have a buoy indicating its approximate position.

This closure has been introduced for public safety purposes during the construction of the jetty.

Mariners are advised to navigate with caution and maintain a safe clearance when transiting this area.
