On 12 July 2021 the Commissioner for Consumer Protection (**Commissioner**) served a notice on the above named Associations pursuant to section 145(1) of the *Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (Act)* informing them that if they did not show cause on or before 60 days after the day on which the notice was given (**Allowed Period**) the incorporation of the Associations would be cancelled.

The Associations did not apply to SAT for a review within the period specified. Therefore, pursuant to section 147(1) of the Act, the Commissioner orders that the incorporation of the above named Associations be cancelled with effect on and from the date of this order.

1. CitationThis instrument is the *Prohibition on Boat Fishing (Danggu Geikie Gorge) Order 2021*.**2. Prohibition on fishing**

A person must not fish from a boat in the area of the Fitzroy River known as Danggu or Geikie Gorge and described in Schedule 1.

Schedule 1

All waters of the Fitzroy River bounded by a line commencing at the intersection with the high water mark and the parallel between a point at 18° 06.65' south latitude and 125° 42.03' east longitude and a point at 18° 06.65' south latitude and 125° 41.28' east longitude; then extending due west along the parallel towards a point at 18° 06.65' south latitude and 125° 41.28' east longitude until its intersection with the high water mark; then generally north-easterly, north-westerly and north-easterly along the high water mark until its intersection with the geodesic between a point at 18° 04.757' south latitude and 125° 42.557' east longitude and a point at 18° 04.802' south latitude and 125° 42.752' east longitude; then easterly along the geodesic towards a point at 18° 04.802' south latitude and 125° 42.752' east longitude until its intersection with the high watermark; then generally southerly and south-westerly along the high water mark to the commencement point.

Closure of Waters to Boating for Special Event

Thomson Bay, Rottnest Island

Acting pursuant to the powers conferred by regulation 38B of the Rottnest Island Authority Regulations 1988, the Rottnest Island Authority (RIA) hereby closes the following waters to all vessels and watercraft, excluding bona fide emergency services and authorised event vessels and watercraft.

Thomson Bay

Between 6:00am and 2.00pm on Saturday 4 December 2021.

All waters from the foreshore encompassed by the positions within, starting from a position on the foreshore 32°0.011S 115°32.952E extending in a northly direction seawards 111m to 32°0.061S 115°32.987E then easterly 871m to position 32°0.118S 115°33.536E then southerly 55m to a position on the foreshore 32°0.147S 115°33.536E.

This area is closed to all vessels except bona fide emergency services and authorised event vessels and watercraft to conduct the 2021 Rottnest Swim Thru.

These restrictions have been put in place to ensure safety of swimmers during the conduct of this event. Mariners are advised to navigate with caution and maintain a safe clearance when transiting this area.

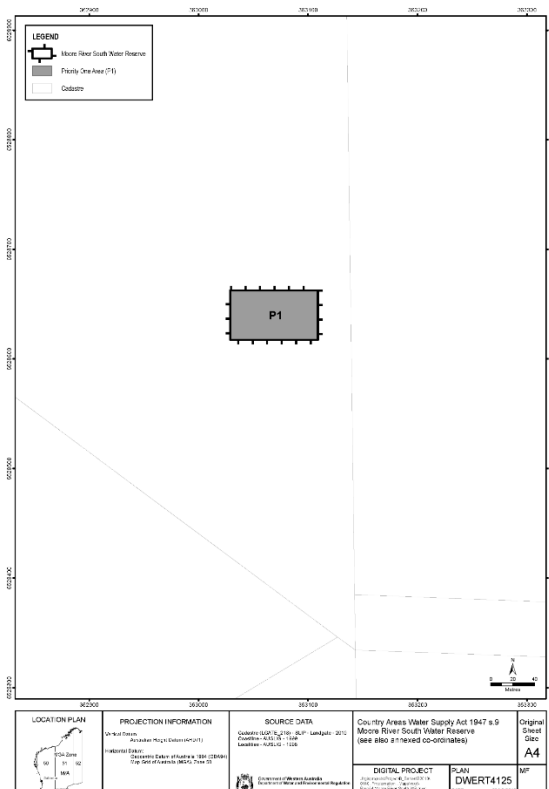
