Family Court Act 1997

Family Court Amendment Regulations 2022

SL 2022/45

Made by the Governor in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Family Court Amendment Regulations 2022*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

3. Regulations amended

These regulations amend the *Family Court Regulations 1998*.

4. Regulation 3 amended

- (1) In regulation 3(1) delete the definition of *Family Law Rules*.
- (2) In regulation 3(2)(d) delete “or the Family Law Rules”.

5. Regulation 7A inserted

After regulation 7 insert:

7A. Child welfare officer (Act s. 5(1))

For the purposes of paragraph (a) of the definition of *child welfare officer* in section 5(1) each of the following is a prescribed office —

- (a) for New South Wales — the offices of —
 - (i) Minister for Families and Communities, in relation to the *Adoption Act 2000* (New South Wales) and the *Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act 1998* (New South Wales); and
 - (ii) Attorney General, in relation to the *Guardianship Act 1987* (New South Wales);
- (b) for Tasmania — the office of Secretary of the Department of Communities Tasmania;
- (c) for Victoria — the office of Secretary of the Department of Families, Fairness and Housing;
- (d) for Queensland — the office of Director-General of the Department of Children, Youth Justice and Multicultural Affairs;
- (e) for the Australian Capital Territory — the offices of —
 - (i) Director-General of the Community Services Directorate; and
 - (ii) Chief Psychiatrist appointed under the *Mental Health Act 2015* (Australian Capital Territory) section 196(1);
- (f) for the Northern Territory — the office of Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Territory Families, Housing and Communities;
- (g) for South Australia — the office of Chief Executive of the Department for Child Protection;
- (h) for Western Australia — the office of CEO.

For the purposes of section 243(8)(aa) each of the following authorities is prescribed —

- (a) for New South Wales — the Department of Communities and Justice;

- (g) for South Australia — the Department for Child Protection;

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

25A. Preparing to collect oral fluid

All of the following steps must be taken when preparing to collect oral fluid for testing using a Securetec Drugwipe II Twin Combo —

- (a) check that the packaging of the equipment is not damaged and that any expiry date has not passed;
- (b) open the packaged equipment;
- (c) check that each item of the device is present and that none of the items shows any apparent damage.

25B. Collecting oral fluid

All of the following steps must be taken when collecting oral fluid for testing using a Securetec Drugwipe II Twin Combo —

- (a) give the saliva collector to the worker;
- (b) require the worker to wipe both sides of the saliva collector on the worker's tongue;
- (c) require the worker to place the saliva collector under the worker's tongue and to close the worker's mouth;
- (d) remove the saliva collector from the worker's mouth when the saliva collector's indicator window turns blue.

25C. Setting up for oral fluid test

All of the following steps must be taken when setting up for testing oral fluid using a Securetec Drugwipe II Twin Combo —

- (a) check the viewing windows of the testing device to ensure no control lines are present;
- (b) remove the cover from the testing device.

25D. Conducting oral fluid test

All of the following steps must be taken when testing oral fluid using a Securetec Drugwipe II Twin Combo —

- (a) dab the saliva collector on the pads of the testing device;
- (b) replace the cover on the testing device;
- (c) hold the testing device in a vertical position with the ampoule at the lower end;
- (d) press on the testing device at the appropriate place indicated on the device until the ampoule breaks;
- (e) continue to hold the testing device in a vertical position for a further 10 seconds;
- (f) place the testing device on a horizontal surface and leave it undisturbed for 3 minutes or 8 minutes (as required by the manufacturer's instructions in the testing device's packaging);
- (g) observe the results of the test.

21—Information or documents provided under section 20 of Rail Safety National Law

A document is an exempt document if it is a document that is produced, or contains information or evidence that is given, to the Regulator by a person (whether a natural person or a body corporate) in accordance with a requirement under section 20 of the Rail Safety National Law.

22—Train safety recordings

- (1) A document is an exempt document if —
 - (a) it is a train safety recording or any part of a train safety recording; or
 - (b) it contains any information obtained from a train safety recording or any part of a train safety recording,

provided to, or obtained by, the Regulator under the Rail Safety National Law.

- (2) In this clause —
train safety recording has the same meaning as in section 130 of the Rail Safety National Law.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Transport Regulations Amendment (Waiver and Refund) Regulations 2022*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) Part 1 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

109. Terms used

In this Part —

authorised fee officer means an officer designated under regulation 110 acting in accordance with the terms of the designation;

written instrument means an instrument in writing signed by the chief executive officer or by an authorised fee officer.

110. Authorised fee officers

- (1) The chief executive officer may, in writing, designate an officer to be an authorised fee officer for the purposes of this Part.
- (2) A designation under this regulation may authorise the officer to act —
 - (a) generally for the purposes of this Part; or
 - (b) as specified in the terms of the designation, only —
 - (i) in relation to particular functions under this Part; or
 - (ii) in relation to particular fees or kinds of fees; or
 - (iii) in particular circumstances.
- (3) An officer performing a function in reliance on a designation under this regulation is taken to do so in accordance with the terms of the designation unless the contrary is shown.

111. Waiver of fees

- (1) The chief executive officer or an authorised fee officer may by written instrument waive in whole or in part, during a period specified in the instrument, a fee or a class of fees either —
 - (a) generally; or
 - (b) as specified in the instrument, in relation to —
 - (i) a particular vessel or a class of vessels; or
 - (ii) a particular place or places; or
 - (iii) a particular person or a class of persons.
- (2) The chief executive officer or an authorised fee officer may by written instrument (the *amending instrument*) —
 - (a) if a waiver made under subregulation (1) has not yet come into effect — revoke the waiver; or

- (b) if a waiver made under subregulation (1) is in effect — alter the date on which the waiver is to cease to have effect, but not to a date earlier than the day after the date on which the amending instrument is signed.
- (3) A written instrument made under this regulation is not subsidiary legislation for the purposes of the *Interpretation Act 1984*.

112. Details of waivers to be accessible on website

- (1) While a waiver made under regulation 111(1) is in effect and for at least 12 months after it ceases to have effect, the chief executive officer must provide public access on a website maintained by, or on behalf of, the Department to —
 - (a) the written instrument by which the waiver is made; and
 - (b) any amending instrument, as defined in regulation 111(2), relating to the waiver.
- (2) A failure to comply with subregulation (1) does not affect the validity of the written instrument or instruments concerned.

113. Emergency waivers

The chief executive officer or an authorised fee officer may, without the need for a written instrument, waive in whole or in part a fee for the use of a pen, alongside berth or mooring by a vessel —

- (a) in need of emergency repair; or
- (b) in another situation of urgency.

114. Effect of waiver

Despite any other provision of these regulations, if a fee that would otherwise be payable is waived under regulation 111 or 113 —

- (a) there is no requirement to pay the fee; and
- (b) the rights and obligations under the Act of every person are as they would be if the fee had not been waived, and had been paid.

115. Refund of fees

- (1) The chief executive officer or an authorised fee officer may refund in whole or in part any fee that has been paid.

- (2) If a fee is refunded under subregulation (1) the rights and obligations under the Act of every person —
 - (a) are as specified by the chief executive officer or authorised fee officer on making the refund; and
 - (b) to the extent that they are not specified under paragraph (a), are as they would be if the fee, or so much of it as has been refunded, had not been paid.

- (2) The CEO or an authorised fee officer may by written instrument (the *amending instrument*) —
 - (a) if a waiver made under subregulation (1) has not yet come into effect — revoke the waiver; or
 - (b) if a waiver made under subregulation (1) is in effect — alter the date on which the waiver is to cease to have effect, but not to a date earlier than the day after the date on which the amending instrument is signed.

40. Details of waivers to be accessible on website

 - (a) the written instrument by which the waiver is made; and
 - (b) any amending instrument, as defined in regulation 39(2), relating to the waiver.
- (2) A failure to comply with subregulation (1) does not affect the validity of the written instrument or instruments concerned.

41. Emergency waivers

The CEO or an authorised fee officer may, without the need for a written instrument, waive in whole or in part a fee for the use of a mooring site by a vessel —

- (a) in need of emergency repair; or
- (b) in another situation of urgency.

42. Effect of waiver

Despite any other provision of these regulations, if a fee that would otherwise be payable is waived under regulation 39 or 41 —

- (a) there is no requirement to pay the fee; and
- (b) the rights and obligations under the Act of every person are as they would be if the fee had not been waived, and had been paid.

43. Refund of fees

- (1) Subject to subregulation (2), the CEO or an authorised fee officer may refund in whole or in part any fee that has been paid.
- (2) Subregulation (1) does not apply to —
 - (a) a fee paid under regulation 7F(4)(b) in connection with a rental mooring site authorisation that is surrendered under regulation 7G; or
 - (b) an annual mooring licence fee paid under regulation 13(1) in connection with a mooring licence that is surrendered under regulation 13A.
- (3) If a fee is refunded under subregulation (1) the rights and obligations under the Act of every person —
 - (a) are as specified by the CEO or authorised fee officer on making the refund; and
 - (b) to the extent that they are not specified under paragraph (a), are as they would be if the fee, or so much of it as has been refunded, had not been paid.
