1. Citation

This order is the *Biodiversity Conservation (Species) Order 2022*.

2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows—

- (a) clauses 1 and 2—on the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order—on the day after that day.

3. Order applies to whole of State

This order applies to the whole of the State.

4. Distinct populations of organisms determined to be species

Each distinct population of organisms specified in the Table is a species for the purposes of the Act.

BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION ACT 2016

BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION (LISTING OF NATIVE SPECIES) (FLORA) ORDER 2022

Made by the Minister under sections 19(1) and 23(1) of the Act and regulation 174(1) of the *Biodiversity Conservation Regulations 2018*.

1. Citation

This order is the *Biodiversity Conservation (Listing of Native Species) (Flora) Order 2022*.

2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows—

- (a) clauses 1 and 2—on the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order—on the day after that day.

3. Threatened species

- (1) Each native species specified in Schedule 1 Division 1 is listed as a threatened species in the category of critically endangered species.
- (2) Each native species specified in Schedule 1 Division 2 is listed as a threatened species in the category of endangered species.
- (3) Each native species specified in Schedule 1 Division 3 is listed as a threatened species in the category of vulnerable species.

4. Extinct species

Each native species specified in Schedule 2 is listed as an extinct species in the category of extinct species.

5.Repeal

The *Wildlife Conservation (Rare Flora) Notice 2018* published in the *Gazette* on 11 September 2018 at pages 3226 to 3232 is repealed.

BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION ACT 2016

BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION (LISTING OF NATIVE SPECIES) (FAUNA) ORDER 2022

Made by the Minister under sections 13(1), 19(1) and 23(1) of the Act and regulation 174(1) of the *Biodiversity Conservation Regulations 2018*.

1. Citation

This order is the *Biodiversity Conservation (Listing of Native Species) (Fauna) Order 2022*.

2. Commencement

This order comes into operation as follows—

- (a) clauses 1 and 2—on the day on which this order is published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the order—on the day after that day.

3. Specially protected species

- (1) Each native species specified in Schedule 1 Division 1 is listed as a specially protected species in the category of species of special conservation interest.

- (2) Each native species specified in Schedule 1 Division 2 is listed as a specially protected species in the category of migratory species being the subject of the international agreement specified in the Schedule by reference to the following agreement code—
- the Convention on the Conservation of Migratory species of Wild Animals (Bonn);
 - the China-Australia Migratory Bird Agreement (CAMBA);
 - the Japan-Australia Migratory Bird Agreement (JAMBA); and/or
 - the Republic of Korea-Australia Migratory Bird Agreement (ROKAMBA).
- (3) Each native species specified in Schedule 1 Division 3 is listed as a specially protected species in the category of species otherwise in need of special protection.

4. Threatened species

- (1) Each native species specified in Schedule 2 Division 1 is listed as a threatened species in the category of critically endangered species.
- (2) Each native species specified in Schedule 2 Division 2 is listed as a threatened species in the category of endangered species.
- (3) Each threatened species specified in Schedule 2 Division 3 is listed as a threatened species in the category of vulnerable species.

5. Extinct species

- (1) Each native species specified in Schedule 3 is listed as an extinct species in the category of extinct species.

6. Repeal

The *Wildlife Conservation (Specially Protected Fauna) Notice 2018* published in the *Gazette* on 11 September 2018 at pages 3232 to 3242 is repealed.

FIRE BREAK NOTICE 2022/23

Notice to all owners and occupiers of land in the following local Authorities
City of Nedlands, Town of Mosman Park, Town of Claremont, Town of Cottesloe and the Shire of Peppermint Grove.

To prevent the outbreak, spread or extension of a bush fire which may occur, all owners and occupiers of land within the districts of the above local Authorities are required to undertake the following work on or before the 30th day of November 2022, or within 14 days of becoming an owner or occupier after that date—

Residential Land—Slash all grass and clear all inflammable matter on the land to a height no greater than 50mm and to maintain all grass and all inflammable matter on the land at a height no greater than 50mm up to and including the 31st day of March 2023.

All Other Land—Create a fire break that is clear of all inflammable matter on the land to a height no greater than 50mm and for width of no less than three metres from immediately inside the external boundaries of the property. Where there are trees in the fire break they must be trimmed back to provide a vertical clearance of a minimum three and a half metres to allow fire appliances to drive along the fire break.

If it is impracticable for any reason to clear firebreaks or take measures in accordance with this notice, you may apply in writing to your Council before the 15th day of November 2022 for permission to implement alternative measures to prevent the outbreak or spread of a bush fire. If permission is not granted in writing by your Council, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

Pursuant to the powers contained in the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, burning garden refuse and lighting fires in the open air is prohibited without a permit.

An owner or occupier of the land who fails or neglects to comply with this notice given pursuant to section 33 of the *Bush Fires Act 1954* within the time specified in this notice, commits an offence and is liable to pay a penalty up to \$5,000. A person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not, to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.
