2022/2023 FIREBREAK NOTICE**Notice to all Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the City of South Perth**

As a measure for preventing the outbreak of a bush fire, or for preventing the spread or extension of a bush fire which may occur, all owners and occupiers of land within the City's district are required before 1 December 2022 to clear firebreaks or to take measures in accordance with this Notice and maintain those firebreaks and measures in accordance with this Notice up to and including 30 April 2023.

1. All land which is 2,000m² or less in area;

Remove all inflammable matter from the whole of the land, except living trees, shrubs, plants and lawns under cultivation, by means of ploughing, cultivating or slashing to a height of no more than 50mm across the entire property. Where the area is 2,000 square metres or less, clear the land free of all inflammable matter, except for living trees, shrubs, plants and lawns under cultivation, to a height no greater than 50mm.

2. All other land within the City of South Perth

- I. Clear bare earth 3 metre wide firebreaks immediately inside all external boundaries of the land by removing all inflammable matter and vegetation within the 3 metre wide firebreak between the ground and 4 metres above the ground.
- II. Firebreaks to a minimum width of 3 metres and height of 4 metres are to be cleared immediately surrounding all buildings situated on the land; and any place where inflammable liquids and gas products are kept;
- III. In addition to the requirements in this clause Council may, by notice in writing require an owner and/or occupier to act as and when specified in the notice with respect to anything which is upon land and which in the opinion of Council is or is likely to be conducive to the outbreak of a bush fire or the spread or extension of a bush fire.

If, for any reason, an owner and/or occupier consider it impractical to clear the land or comply with other fire protection measures in accordance with the notice, the owner and/or occupier may apply in writing to the City no later than the 11th day of November for a variation. If permission is not granted in writing by the City or its authorised officer, the owner and/or occupier must comply with the requirements of this notice. Any variation granted by the City will apply only for a single Firebreak Period. A variation granted by the City shall only remain in force until the 30th day of April in the following year.

In addition to the requirements in this notice the City may, by notice in writing require an owner and/or occupier to act as and when specified in the notice with respect to anything which is upon land and which in the opinion of the City is or is likely to be conducive to the outbreak of a bush fire or the spread or extension of a bush fire.

The term Inflammable matter for the purpose of this notice includes bush (as defined in the *Bush Fires Act 1954*), timber, boxes, cartons, paper, rubbish and any other combustible or inflammable matter.

PENALTY FOR NON COMPLIANCE

A person who fails to comply with the requisitions in this notice is guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of \$5,000. In addition, where the owner or occupier of the land fails to comply with a notice given pursuant to section 33(1) of the *Bush Fires Act 1954*, the City may enter upon the land and carry out the requisitions of the notice which have not been complied with and the City may recover the amount of any costs and expenses incurred in carrying out those requisitions as a debt due from the owner or occupier of the land maintained clear of inflammable matter up to and including 30 April in the following year.

CLOSURE OF NAVIGABLE WATERS ORDER

Aerial Devices

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Pursuant to section 66 of the *Western Australian Marine Act 1982* (the Act), I cancel Notice MA402 published in the *Government Gazette* on 20 September 2016 and close the following waters to vessels/propulsors fitted with an aerial device, whether controlled by the rider, vessel operator or a combination of both—

1. Gazetted speed restricted areas less than 8 knots;
2. Closed waters areas or swimming prohibited areas;
3. Navigable channels and fairways;
4. Protected waters; and
5. Waters less than 3 metres deep;

unless these waters are included in Schedule A of this notice.

All other navigable waters are open to the operation of vessels/propulsors fitted with an aerial device.

Anyone operating or riding an aerial device must do so in accordance with the conditions set out in Schedule B of this notice.

In this notice, the following definitions apply—

‘navigable waters’ and ‘protected waters’ have the same meaning as in regulation 2 of the *Navigable Waters Regulations 1958*;

‘the Regulations’ means the *Navigable Waters Regulations 1958*;

‘aerial device’ means any device connected to a vessel/propulsor so as to provide pressurised water from the vessel/propulsor to the device to aid propulsion at the surface of the water, in the air and/ or underwater;

‘aerial device rider’ means the person attached to the aerial device;

‘PWC’ has the same meaning as the definition of ‘personal watercraft’ in regulation 46(2) of the Regulations.

SCHEDULE A—WATERS

1. Waters nominated for aquatic events which have been approved under Regulation 51C of the Regulations, during the times specified.

2. Areas for use by commercial operators—

MINDARIE MARINA: All those waters within the Mindarie Marina bounded by a line commencing at 31°41.454'S, 115°41.948'E (between the end of A Jetty and the breakwater); thence to 31°41.485'S, 115°41.983'E (80 metres south-easterly); thence to 31°41.496'S, 115°41.969'E (30 metres south-westerly); thence to 31°41.483'S, 115°41.949'E (41 metres north-westerly); thence to 31°41.465'S, 115°41.934'E (41 metres north-westerly); thence 30 metres north-easterly to the starting point.

MANDURAH ESTUARY: All those waters of the Mandurah Estuary bounded by lines commencing at 32°31.906'S, 115°43.041'E (approximately 370 metres north of the Old Mandurah Traffic Bridge); thence to 32°31.903'S, 115°43.060'E (approximately 30 metres east-north-easterly); thence to 32°31.949'S, 115°43.079'E (approximately 90 metres south-south-easterly); thence to 32°31.952'S, 115°43.059'E (approximately 30 metres west-south-westerly); thence to the point of commencement (approximately 90 metres north-north-westerly).

CHAMPION LAKES: All those waters of Champion Lakes, Armadale, bounded by lines commencing at 32°06.128'S, 116°00.247'E (approximately 35 metres south-east of the boat ramp); thence to 32°06.157'S, 116°00.273'E (approximately 65 metres south-east); thence to 32°06.288'S, 116°00.152'E (approximately 110 metres south-west); thence to 32°06.255'S, 116°00.105'E (approximately 95 metres north-west); thence to the point of commencement (approximately 320 metres north-east).

All coordinates are based on GDA 94.

SCHEDULE B—OPERATING CONDITIONS

1. The aerial device must only carry the number of persons it is designed to carry.
2. The aerial device rider must—
 - be at least 14 years of age;
 - wear a helmet suitable for water sports;
 - wear an appropriate lifejacket as described in regulation 50B of the Regulations;
 - not conduct airborne activities within 15 metres of any other person or vessel; and
 - not deliberately 'porpoise' in water less than 4 metres deep.
3. When the aerial device is solely controlled by the rider, the rider must hold a Recreational Skippers Ticket as per regulation 47A of the Regulations.
4. Whilst connected to an aerial device, PWC operators must have the PWC kill switch safety lanyard attached to them.
5. The aerial device must only be operated between sunrise and sunset, unless participating in an event approved under Regulation 51C of the Regulations.
6. General safety obligations, collision regulations and any other legislative requirements which apply under the Regulations or the Act must be complied with at all times.
7. Vessels/ propulsors used for recreational purposes must be registered in accordance with regulation 45B of the Regulations; vessels/ propulsors used for commercial purposes must have a unique identifier in accordance with the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law Act 2012*.
8. Commercial aerial devices must be operated in accordance with any Certificate of Survey or Certificate of Operation, or any exemption for such, issued for the vessel or operation under the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law Act 2012*.
9. During the hours of operation, the limits of a commercial aerial device operating area must be clearly marked with buoys by the operator.
