AREAS CLOSED TO FISHING FOR PRAWNS IN THE SHARK BAY PRAWN MANAGED FISHERY Notice No. 2 of 2023

- I, Rick Fletcher, Executive Director Fisheries and Agriculture Resource Management of the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, Western Australia, in accordance with clause 10 of the Shark Bay Prawn Managed Fishery Management Plan 1993, consider it in the better interest of the Shark Bay Prawn Managed Fishery (Fishery) to hereby—
 - 1. Cancel Notice of Areas Closed to Fishing for Prawns in the Shark Bay Prawn Managed Fishery: Notice No. 1 of 2023 dated 22 February 2023.
 - 2. Permit the trialling of gear between 0800 and 1600 hours each day from 25 March 2023 to 16 April 2023 provided no fish are held on board, or landed from, the authorised boat and from 16 April 2023 to 22 October 2023 provided the cod-end is open, in the area described as the *Gear Trial Area* in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - 3. Except as provided for under Clause 2 of this Notice, prohibit fishing for prawns in those parts of the Fishery, between the times and dates provided for in items (a) to (j) below—
 - (a) fishing for prawns is prohibited from the date of the gazettal of *Notice No. 2 of 2023* to 0800 hours on 22 October 2023 in the following areas defined in the Schedule to this Notice
 - i. Withnell Point Closure
 - ii. Red Cliff Point Closure
 - iii. South Carnarvon Peron Line Closure
 - iv. North Carnarvon Peron Line Closure
 - (b) fishing for prawns is prohibited from the date of the gazettal of *Notice No. 2 of 2023* to 1700 hours on 11 May 2023 in the area defined as the *West Carnarvon Peron Line Closure* in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - (c) fishing for prawns is prohibited from the date of the gazettal of *Notice No. 2 of 2023* to 1700 hours on 9 June 2023 in the area defined as the **West of North Carnarvon Peron** *Line Closure* in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - (d) fishing for prawns is prohibited from the date of the gazettal of Notice No. 2 of 2023 to 1700 hours on 15 June 2023 in the area defined as the Central Carnarvon Peron Line Closure in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - (e) fishing for prawns is prohibited from the date of the gazettal of *Notice No. 2 of 2023* to 1700 hours on 7 August 2023 in the area defined as the *South Carnarvon Peron Line Closure Extension* in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - (f) fishing for prawns is prohibited from 0800 hours on $1\,\mathrm{June}~2023$ to 1700 hours on $12\,\mathrm{August}~2023$ in the area defined as the Denham~Sound~Closure in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - (g) fishing for prawns is prohibited from the date of the gazettal of *Notice No. 2 of 2023* to 0800 hours on 1 June 2023; from 1700 hours on 7 August 2023 to 1700 hours on 14 August; from 0800 hours on 19 August 2023 to 1700 hours on 13 September 2023 and; from 0800 hours on 18 September 2023 to 1700 hours on 22 October 2023 in the area defined as the *Snapper/Trawl Closure* in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - (h) fishing for prawns is prohibited from 1700 hours on 14 August 2023 to 0800 hours on 19 August and from 1700 hours on 13 September to 0800 hours on 18 September 2023 in the area defined as the *Extended Snapper/Trawl Closure* in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - (i) in parts of the Fishery within the area defined as *North of Koks Island* in the Schedule to this Notice where fishing for prawns is not otherwise prohibited, fishing for prawns is prohibited between 1000 hours and 1700 hours each day between the date of the gazettal of *Notice No. 2 of 2023* and 22 October 2023.

- (j) in parts of the Fishery within the area defined as *South of Koks Island* in the Schedule to this Notice where fishing for prawns is not otherwise prohibited, fishing for prawns is prohibited between 0800 hours and 1700 hours each day between the date of the gazettal of *Notice No. 2 of 2023* and 22 October 2023.

Anatomy Act (Section 4) Notice 2023

REGULATION 272(1)(D)(II)

Approved Reflective Apparel

Pursuant to regulation 272(1)(d)(ii) of the *Road Traffic Code 2000*, I approve the reflective apparel of the type, colour and description hereunder, as that to be worn by an *authorised person* when performing duties pursuant to regulation 272(1)(d)(i).

The apparel shall comply with the Australian / New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 4602:1999 High Visibility Safety Garments, Class D/N. In accordance with the standard the apparel is a day/night garment comprising retroreflective elements on a fluorescent background material. The apparel may be either—

- (a) A vest, or
- (b) A coat

The colour of the apparel shall be yellow and retroreflective bands shall be white.

The word PILOT shall appear on the front and rear of the apparel in 150mm red non-fluorescent lettering

There shall be two white retroreflective bands, no less than 50mm in height, across the full width of the apparel on both front and rear, one band shall be above the word PILOT and the other near the bottom of the apparel.

The apparel shall have shoulder and sleeve retroreflective markings in accordance with the standard.

The approval of the Commissioner of Police relating to the reflective apparel to be worn by accredited pilot vehicle drivers published in *Gazette* No. 168 dated 21 September 2004 at page 4138 is rescinded. Dated 28 March 2023.

Exemption for the East Village Knutsford strata company 'Owners of East Village at Knutsford SP 79519' for a non-potable water service at East Village Knutsford, Fremantle

In accordance with section 7 of the *Water Services Act 2012*, the Minister for Water, Hon Simone McGurk MLA, has granted an exemption from the application of section 5(1) of the Act to 'Owners of East Village at Knutsford SP 79519' East Village Knutsford strata company for the provision of a non-potable water service at East Village Knutsford, Fremantle.

The water service is a non-potable water supply service provided as a community bore scheme for the residents of an infill urban development. Water is sourced from a community bore on Lot 3 of the site and used to water public open space and residential gardens at adjacent Lot 1 and Lot 2.

The exemption will come into effect on the day it is published in the *Government Gazette* and is valid for an indefinite period.

Summary of the reasons for the decision

Granting this exemption is not contrary to the public interest. It is considered that—

- the regulatory burden imposed by licensing would be disproportionately high given the small scale of the service;
- the risks of the abuse of monopoly power are low. The service is operated on a not-for-profit basis; and
- the public health aspects of the service are regulated under the *Health (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1911.*
