Kalbarri Area means the Kalbarri area of the Fishery described in Schedule 2 of the *West Coast Demersal Scalefish (Interim) Management Plan 2007*;

Metropolitan Area means the Metropolitan area of the Fishery described in Schedule 2 of the *West Coast Demersal Scalefish (Interim) Management Plan 2007*;

Mid-West Area means the Mid-West area of the Fishery described in Schedule 2 of the *West Coast Demersal Scalefish (Interim) Management Plan 2007*;

permit means an interim managed fishery permit that authorises a person to fish in the Fishery;

relevant permit means the permit which confers the entitlement the subject of the offer of surrender;

3. Establishment of voluntary fisheries adjustment scheme

A voluntary fisheries adjustment scheme is established, to be called the *West Coast Demersal Scalefish Interim Managed Fishery Voluntary Fisheries Adjustment Scheme 2023*.

4. Objectives

- (b) A person who offers the surrender of part of an entitlement under the scheme may also offer the surrender of an associated fishing boat licence.

7. Manner of operation

The manner of operation of the scheme is that—

- (a) invitations for offers to surrender parts entitlements to fish in the Kalbarri Area, the Mid-West Area or the South-West Area of the Fishery and associated fishing boat licences (if applicable), must be made in accordance with section 10C(4) of the Act and not later than 30 September 2023;
- (b) offers must be submitted to the committee within the period specified in the invitation, in the form approved by the committee, stating the amount of compensation for which the person will surrender part of their entitlement to fish in the Kalbarri Area, the Mid-West Area or the South-West Area of the Fishery and associated fishing boat licence (if applicable);
- (c) the committee must forward every offer made by an eligible person to the Minister and advise the Minister whether to accept or decline any offer or to make a counter offer; and
- (d) the Minister must respond to every offer made by an eligible person in accordance with section 10C(5) of the Act, after considering any advice of the committee.

Under the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1995* and all other powers enabling it, the Council of the Town of Bassendean hereby records having resolved on the 28th of February 2023 to make the *Town of Bassendean Parking Amendment Local Law 2023*.

PART 1—PRELIMINARY

1.1 Citation

This local law may be cited as the *Town of Bassendean Parking Amendment Local Law 2023*.

1.2 Commencement

This local law comes into operation on the fourteenth day after the day on which it is published in the *Government Gazette*.

1.3 Principal Local Law

This local law amends the *Town of Bassendean Parking Local Law 2019* as published in the *Government Gazette* on 5 November 2019.

PART 2—AMENDMENTS

2.1 Clause 1.4 amended

In clause 1.4, in the appropriate alphabetical positions, insert—

'Electric Vehicle' means a vehicle that uses one or more electric motors or traction motors for propulsion and which is charged via 'plug in' connection to an external power source and includes a car, truck, scooter, moped and motorbike but does not include a bicycle;'

'head of a cul-de-sac' means the part of a carriageway closed at one end that is shaped in such a way that can be used to turn vehicles in and includes bulb or hammer-head shaped closed roads;'
