ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT 1986**ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (RENEWABLE ENERGY PROPOSALS) EXEMPTION ORDER 2023**

The Minister for Environment hereby gives notice of intention to revoke the *Environmental Protection (Renewable Energy Proposals) Exemption Order 2023* (the **declaration**) declared under section 6(1) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*.

This declaration was made prior to the passing of the *Environmental Protection Amendment Act 2024*. That Act contains amendments to section 41 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* which have the effect that section 41 no longer applies to decisions to grant options to lease by the Minister for Lands under section 88(1) of the *Land Administration Act 1997*. The revocation will remove the declaration which is no longer required due to the amendments to section 41 of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*.

4. Extended trading permit varying authorisation conferred by liquor store licence: premises outside metropolitan area

1. This clause applies to a liquor store licence that relates to premises situated outside the metropolitan area unless it is a licence listed in Schedule 1.
2. An extended trading permit is issued under section 60 of the Act in respect of the licence for the purposes referred to in subsection (4)(g) of that section.
3. The extended trading permit varies the authorisation conferred by the licence so as to authorise the licensee to sell packaged liquor on and from the licensed premises from 10am to 10pm on the following days—
 - a. 26 January 2025;
 - b. 2 March 2025;
 - c. 20 April 2025;
 - d. 1 June 2025;
 - e. 28 September 2025;
 - f. 14, 21 and 28 December 2025.
4. The extended trading permit remains in force until the end of 28 December 2025.

5. Extended trading permit varying authorisation conferred by hotel licence, hotel restricted licence, tavern licence, tavern restricted licence or small bar licence: premises within and outside metropolitan area

1. This clause applies to a licence that relates to premises situated in the metropolitan area or outside the metropolitan area if the licence is either—
 - a. a hotel licence;
 - b. a hotel restricted licence;
 - c. a tavern licence;
 - d. a tavern restricted licence; or
 - e. a small bar licence.
2. An extended trading permit is issued under section 60 of the Act in respect of the licence for the purposes referred to in subsection (4)(g) of that section.
3. The extended trading permit varies the authorisation conferred by the licence so as to authorise the licensee to sell liquor for consumption ancillary to a meal on the licensed premises from 6 am to 10 am on the following days—
 - a. 11 May 2025;
 - b. 7 September 2025.
4. The extended trading permit remains in force until the end of 7 September 2025.
