DESIGNATION OF THE COMMISSIONER FOR CONSUMER PROTECTION

In my capacity as Minister for Commerce and acting pursuant to the power of designation conferred on me by the particular sections of the Acts in Schedule A, I provide as follows—

1. I **REVOKE** all previous designations made pursuant to the particular sections of the Acts in Schedule A; and

1. Citation

These rules are the *Lotteries Commission (Authorised Lotteries) (Saturday Lotto) Amendment Rules 2025*.

2. Commencement

These rules come into operation as follows —

- (a) rules 1, 2 and 3 — on the day on which these rules are published in the *Gazette*; and
- (b) rule 4 — 6:01pm on 17 May 2025.

3. Rules amended

These rules amend the *Lotteries Commission (Authorised Lotteries) Rules 2016*.

4. Schedule 6—Saturday Lotto

(1) Delete Schedule 6 Division 1 and insert—

Division 1—Calculating the total cost of entry

(a) The unit cost of entering a Saturday Lotto draw is made up of a subscription of \$0.85 cents per game and an agent's component.

The agent's component is calculated as 12% of the total subscription amount for a particular week's entry, rounded* (where necessary) to the nearest 5 cent multiple.

$$((G \times \$0.85) \times 0.12 \rightarrow \text{rounded}) \times W = T$$

where—

G No. of games entered in a draw;

W No. of weeks the entry spans;

T Total agent's component cost payable by the subscriber. *

Rounding is calculated using the method known as "bankers rounding" or "round-to-even" rounding.

(2) In Schedule 6 Division 3 delete:
