PROCLAMATION

GERARD SMITH.

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir
GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander
of the Most Distinguished Order of
Saint Michael and Saint George,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief
in and over the Colony of Western
Australia and its Dependencies, &c.,
&c., &c.

WHEREAS under "The Destructive Birds and
Animals Act, 1893," it is enacted that for
the purpose of the said Act the words, "Destructive
Bird," shall mean any bird to which the Governor
in Council, from time to time by like Proclamation,
extends the provisions of the said Act: AND
WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to extend the pro-
visions of the said Act to Starlings, Blackbirds, and
Thrushes: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir
GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said
Colony, do hereby extend the provisions of "The
Destructive Birds and Animals Act, 1893," to
Starlings, Blackbirds, and Thrushes.

The Lands Resumption Act, 1894.

W Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber at Perth, this 29th
day of January, 1896.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor.
The Honourables—
The Colonial Treasurer.
The Attorney General.
The Commissioner of Railways.
The Commissioner of Crown Lands.
The Minister of Mines.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Lands
Resumption Act, 1894," it is made lawful for
the Governor in Council to take any lands that may be
required for botanical gardens, parks, pleasure
grounds, and places for public recreation: AND
WHEREAS it is deemed necessary to take the lands in
the Schedule attached for the purpose of a place for
public recreation: NOW THEREFORE His Excellency,
by and with the advice and consent of the Executive
Council, doth hereby declare his intention to take
the said lands for the purposes hereinbefore men-
tioned.

SCHEDULE.

Portion of Cockburn Sound Location 6 and the whole of
Cockburn Sound Location 135, as the same is the subject of
a Certificate of Title, registered in the Books of the Office
of Titles in Book VIII., 1063, in the name of Annette
Lefroy. Bounded by lines starting from a point on the
North boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 6, situate 25
chains 34 links East from its North-West corner, and
extending East 36 chains 94 links to the North-East
corner of Cockburn Sound Location 135, thence South
14 chains 14 links to its South-East corner, thence West
28 chains 28 links to its South-West corner, thence North 2
chains 59 links to the South-East corner of said Cockburn
Sound Location 6, thence West 8 chains 66 links, and
North 11 chains 55 links to the starting point.
