THE STOCK DISEASES ACT, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this
29th day of October, 1903.

Present:

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council, to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such regulations under the said Act as may be deemed expedient—*inter alia* (1.) For the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease; (2) For providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the State, and for preventing the spread of such disease; (3) For the regulation, management, and control of quarantine grounds, and for prescribing the treatment and control of stock whilst in quarantine or in transit thereto or therefrom; (4) For prescribing the term during which stock shall be quarantined; and (5) Generally for all or any such purposes as he may deem necessary for preventing the introduction or spread of disease; AND WHEREAS it is expedient that regulations should be made to eradicate and prevent the

spread of disease among swine; NOW THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following Regulations under the said Act.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE STOCK DISEASES
ACT, 1895.

1. Every person, being the owner of or the agent of the owner of, or in possession or charge of any swine within any part of the State, shall, for the space of six weeks immediately following the twenty-ninth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and three, being the date of the publication of these Regulations in the *Government Gazette*, confine and keep confined such swine strictly within the boundaries of the premises whereon such swine shall be.

2. No person shall remove or permit, or suffer to be removed, any swine from such premises during such period of six weeks.

3. Every person being the owner of or the agent of the owner of, or in possession or charge of any infected swine, or any swine suspected of being infected, shall, within twenty-four hours after he shall have discovered or suspected, or should have discovered or suspected such swine to be infected, give notice in writing thereof to an Inspector, and shall keep such swine from coming into contact with any other swine until the Inspector shall otherwise order.

Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five hundred pounds.
