ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 12th day of March, 1914.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor.
The Honourables—The Attorney General,

WHEREAS by "The Public Works Act, 1902," power is vested in the Governor in Executive Council to authorise the Minister for Works to undertake, construct, or provide any public work. And whereas it is desirable to establish a Government School at Big Brook. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby authorise the Minister for Works to construct and provide a Government School on a piece of land at Big Brook, containing two acres, situate in the south-eastern corner of Nelson Location 972, and having a frontage of 800 links to the main road.

PUBLIC WORKS ACT, 1902.

Government School at Big Brook.

IT is hereby notified and declared by His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, that all that piece of land at Big Brook, containing two acres, situate in the south-eastern corner of Nelson Location 972, and having a frontage of 800 links to the main road, has been set apart and taken under "The Public Works Act, 1902," for the purpose of a Government School, and is hereby vested in His Majesty accordingly.

The said piece of land is marked off and more particularly described on the plan P.W.D., W.A., No. 17314, which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.
