Greeting:

KNOW Ye that I, the said Governor, acting with the
advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you to
be Commissioners to inquire generally into—

- (1) The apprenticeship question;
- (2) The question of articles in the professions;

- (3) The working and operation of the Industrial
Arbitration Act, 1912, the constitution of the
Court of Arbitration, and the necessity for
amending the said Act.

And I appoint you, Francis Edward Walsh, Esquire,
to be the Chairman of this Commission: And I declare
this to be a Royal Commission within the meaning of
“The Royal Commissioners’ Powers Act, 1902”; and I
require you, with as little delay as possible, to report to
me in writing the result of your inquiries by virtue of
this Commission.
