WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse  
TO WIT. } McMillan, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

To the Honourable Robert Bruce Burnside, a Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia: Greeting:

WHEREAS by the twenty-second section of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is provided that no member of the Legislative Council or Legislative Assembly shall sit or vote therein until he shall have taken and subscribed the oath, or shall have made and subscribed the affirmation, therein set forth before the Governor, or some person authorised by the Governor to administer the same: Now therefore I, Sir Robert Furse McMillan, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator as aforesaid, do hereby authorise you, the Honourable Robert Bruce Burnside, a Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, to administer to members of the Legislative Assembly the prescribed oath or affirmation as aforesaid.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir Robert Furse  
TO WIT. } McMillan, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

To the Honourable Robert Bruce Burnside, a Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia: Greeting:

WHEREAS by a Proclamation published in the *Gazette* on the 4th day of July, 1924, twelve noon of the clock on Thursday, the 24th day of July, 1924, was fixed as the time for the commencement and holding of the First Session of the Twelfth Parliament of Our said State, to be holden under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," for the despatch of business, in the House of Parliament in the City of Perth: Now therefore I, Sir Robert Furse McMillan, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator as aforesaid, do hereby appoint you, the Honourable Robert Bruce Burnside, a Commissioner to do all things necessary to be done in the name and on the part of His Majesty the King, or in my name and on my part as such Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, in order to the opening and holding of the First Session of the Twelfth Parliament of Western Australia.
