TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1954.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Traffic Act, 1919-1954, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

1. In these regulations the Traffic Regulations, 1954, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th December, 1954, and amended by the regulations amending the same published in the *Gazette* on the 9th February, 1955, the 1st April, 1955, the 11th May, 1955, the 17th June, 1955, and the 9th August, 1955, are referred to as the principal regulations.

Principal
Regs.

2. The principal regulations are amended—
(a) by inserting as regulation 190 the following regulation:—

190. (1) When a vehicle or an animal is being driven towards an intersection or a junction at the same time as any other vehicle or animal is being driven from another direction towards that intersection or junction under such circumstances that there is a reasonable possibility that, if they continued, they might arrive at the same point simultaneously, or that a dangerous situation might otherwise be created, then, subject to the provisions of regulation 191A, the driver of the vehicle or animal having the other vehicle or animal on his right side shall reduce the speed of and, if necessary, stop the vehicle or animal under his control so as to give way to that other vehicle or animal.

(2) This regulation does not apply to any intersection or junction where traffic is being controlled or directed by:

- (i) a member of the Police Force or a Traffic Inspector, or
(ii) traffic control light signals;
