1.--- A Wooden Bridge across Susannah Brook, to replace one destroyed last summer by fire. This Work to include clearing the Brook of timber and drift rubbish to the extent of 15 yards above and 15 yards below the Bridge, together with the Trenches requisite for security against fire.

2.—Two Wooden Bridges on the York Road, including Trenches and clearing the Water-Courses 15 yards above and below.

3.-A Wooden Bridge across a Stream in rear

of Mr. Dodd's 40 acre Grant, at Guildford, to supersede the use of two at present in use, which lead through town locations in Guildford, and are not in the direct line of road. This Work to include necessary Trenches for security against fire and the clearing of the Stream bed above and below of timber.

4.-A Bridge near to the Cleikum Inn, Guildford, to be repaired with rammed earth.

5.—The Road from the Guildford Ferry to the Bridge No. 4, and from the latter Bridge to Bennett's Creek, to be cleared of trees; several swampy Hollows in the latter space to be drained and filled in with a small barrel drain and causeway, ditched on both sides, and made firm in a width of 15 yards.

6.—Approaches to Bridge over Bennett's Creek to be extended 20 feet by a raised causeway, covered with 10 cart loads of rubble stone at each end.

7.—Approach to Helena Bridge on the Guildford side to be cleared and made, by deepening the ditches, raising the middle of the road, and reducing the hill.

8.—Guildford Ferry Boat to be furnished with Foot Battens on that side which carries the hawser, to be fitted with two new hushed Sheaves; three Scupper Holes lined with lead; one Ring Bolt on deck, where carried away; small Chains to the four Pump Scuttles, and outer edges of the Sheave Holes to be eased off, to prevent chafing of the hawser.

9.—Part of the Road opposite to Mr. Drake's House, St. George's Terrace, Perth, to be raised, re made, and supported by a parapet wall of brick or stone, in continuation of the present Bridge
